THE GARDEN IN JULY - AUGUST

The late summer months should be the time to enjoy the first fruits and flowers that we have laboured to produce but I suspect that this year some of us will be fighting rearguard action against the weeds that nearly overwhelmed us in early June. But crops grew equally fast: Arran Pilot pótatoes are cropping splendidly. early summer lettuce Fortune are the best for years and runner beans, Sunset - a new variety are running up well.

Late sowings of carrot Ideal, beet Globe or Golden, spinach beet, lettuce Windermere. Avondefiance and Winter Density will help toprolong the vegetable season.

Roses are doing well. When you dead-head them cut the growth back 9" or 10" where possible to encourage new growth for Autumn flowering,

If you have cold frames or cool greenhouse sowings of primula Kewensis or Malacoides will reward you with delightful pots of colour in the house next winter. Buy daffodil and hyacinth bulbs at the end of August.
