NATURE NOTES

Long-tailed Tits and Great Spotted Woodpeckers have become frequent visitors to the fat balls we put out in the garden. One of the tits also frequently flies at the window panes at the back of the house. I assume it can see its reflection in the glass.

By late February a song thrush was seen collecting nesting material around the garden and by late March was frequently seen collecting worms so is hopefully feeding young.

It wasn't until 28th March that we finally saw our first butterflies in Sibford although I am sure there must have been earlier sightings. These were 2 Brimstones and a Comma visiting the early flowering heather in the garden.

Commas, named from the comma-shaped silvery mark on the underside of their hindwing, are similar in size to the familiar Small Tortoiseshell and also have a similar reddish-orange appearance in flight. When perched to bask or drink nectar, however, the distinctive deeply-scalloped wings of the Comma distinguish it from any other UK butterfly.

The Commas seen now have spent the winter as dormant adult butterflies, and are emerging to breed. Unusually for butterflies, these overwintered adults are a mixture of the offspring and grand-offspring of the Commas that flew last spring. This arises because Comma caterpillars developing in the late spring and early summer can take one of two developmental pathways. Either they develop into a hibernating adult butterfly, which will simply feed up in summer and then enter its dormant overwintering state, or into reproductive adults that will breed and die during the summer (and whose offspring will develop rapidly during late summer and autumn and then hibernate as adult butterflies).


On 8th April in the glorious spring sunshine we walked from Chipping Norton to the Rollright Stones and observed 6 species of butterfly (Brimstone, Orange Tip, Speckled Wood, Holly Blue, Small Tortoiseshell and Peacock).

On 3rd April as it was just getting light I watched an interesting altercation between a couple of Tawny Owls and a Carrion Crow. One owl was calling from a pine tree and the crow took exception to this. After much wing flapping the second owl flew in to join the fray. A few minutes later all 3 birds flew off in different directions.

I have heard there may be otters around Lamb's Pool and Temple Mill so it is worth keeping a look out for them or at least signs - footprints and spraints (otter poo).



DID YOU KNOW?

More about the Manor, Sibford Ferris - 1657-1842

During the reign of Charles II Squire Thomas Walford purchased the Manor in 1657. Expert analysis showed that the north side, facing the Gower, was probably 16th century, but that the new owner carried out major rebuilding work around 1666. (This face of the building is no longer visible due to major alterations when the Manor was sold in 2001 for residential development.)

The house remained in the Walford family until 1800. During the 18th century they had become wealthy farmers and landowners and had the building restyled in the Queen Ann fashion, which was very much in vogue with the aristocracy. The front and sides were clad in local cut stone much as we see it today. The last Walford to live in the house was William who left Sibford in 1800. Ownership then passed through several hands until Thomas Harris sold it in 1842 for £1200. It was bought by the Society of Friends for 'the purposes of having a school'. Then it had barns and a farmyard to the rear of the house.

GREAT TASTE

Chargrilled Asparagus with Crispy Egg and Herb Dressing

A delicious dinner party starter or light lunch dish, this shows off asparagus at its best with a combination of classic flavours. Make sure you use organic, free range eggs if possible.

Serves 2

1 bunch asparagus spears 6-8 spring onions

75ml olive oil A handful of each of basil and mint leaves

A squeeze of lemon juice Salt and pepper

3 organic eggs 100g breadcrumbs

50g plain flour Oil for frying

Pea shoots to serve

Bring a small pan of water to the boil, turn down to a simmer and add 2 of the eggs. Simmer for 6 minutes before draining and refreshing under cold water until completely cool. Then peel the eggs, discarding the shells, Beat the remaining egg in a small bowl. Tip the flour into a second bowl and the breadcrumbs into a third. Dust the eggs completely in flour, then dip into the beaten egg, turning to coat. Lastly place the egg in the bowl of breadcrumbs, turning over and over to evenly coat in crumbs. Repeat this with the second boiled egg and keep both to one side. Snap the woody ends from the asparagus and trim the spring onions, discarding the very dark green ends. Drizzle in a little olive oil, salt and pepper and then place on a preheated chargrill pan. Turn regularly to colour evenly on all sides. Remove from the chargrill and slice diagonally into long slices and keep to one side. To make the dressing simply place the herbs and olive oil in a small jug, with the lemon juice and some salt and pepper. Use a hand-held stick blender to blend to a smooth, bright green dressing. To fry the eggs, pour enough oil into a small saucepan so that it will be deep enough to cover the egg. Heat over a moderate to high heat and once hot enough to sizzle when a little piece of bread is added as a test, carefully add the breaded eggs. Fry for 2-3 minutes until the breadcrumbs are golden, turning over occasionally to help them brown evenly. Remove with a slotted spoon and drain on kitchen paper.

To assemble, simply arrange the asparagus and spring onions on two serving plates. Drizzle over the herb dressing and slice each egg in half before placing on top of the vegetables. Decorate with pea shoots or more fresh herbs.

In Your Garden - May

- 1. Earth up your potatoes, so that you don't get any green tubers.
- 2. Keep pulling up rhubarb for delicious puddings. Don't cut it.
- 3. Get very busy in your veg patch, on carefully raked and water soil. Sow carrots, radishes, beetroot, and lettuces. Leave runner beans until the end of the month
- 4. Time to pot up your dahlias and start them into growth. Keep them in the greenhouse until the weather is frost free.
- 5 It is best to use tap water for seedlings, as run-off water in barrels can be full of little flies and pests.
- 6.. For sythia and philadelphus should be pruned as soon as they have finished flowering.
- 7 Lawns will need cutting every week, and the edges cut.
- 8. My lilies are shooting up they need to be checked every day for red lily beetle.

In Your Garden - May (cont'd)

- 9. I am now potting up baby rosettes of echeveria and black aeoniums, in readiness for container planting at the end of the month, with annuals, geraniums, bacupa etc.
- 10 Any new trees or shrubs you have planted this spring are going to need constant watering to help them get a good root system going.
