Nature Notes.

Aug 21st. When the nuthatch that frequented our garden disappeared in the spring of this year I feared that we might go several years without seeing another but my fears were groundless. We are regularly seeing one and I think that I may have heard a second one on two occasions. I expect that we shall find out how many there are when we start putting food out for them.

Aug 23rd. An easily gathered harvest is now nearly completed. Yields of cereals are better than I expected after the very dry weather in June and July. They must have drawn on deeper reserves of moisture, a legacy of last winters rain. Field beans looked to be suffering more during the dry spell and thus have ripened exceptionally early and I understand that they are so dry that the pods are shattering when touched by the reel of the combine harvester.

Aug 24th. Last year we saw a humming-bird hawk-moth resting on the edge of our bird table but today we watched one feeding on our neighbours summer jasmine. Never having seen one feeding before I was struck by its similarity to a humming-bird as it hovered with rapidly beating wings in front of each flower while it extended its tongue to collect the nectar.

Sept. 3rd. Our buddleias have flowered too early this year to coincide with the main hatch of butterflies. I must try to prune some of them later in the spring or summer prune some of the young growth to make them sprout again and hopefully spread the flowering season.



Sept. 15th. I have measured almost two inches of rain over the last two days. Thursday's 1.32" was the biggest day's rainfall this year.



Finding out.


Richard of York gave battle in vain. Have you heard this saying and if so, what does it help us to remember?





A LOAD OF COMPOST FROM CHERVELL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cherwell District Council is keen to enlist the help of 100 volunteers to test a composting device called a 'Green Cone', an enclosed system that uses heat from the Sun to speed up the decomposition of kitchen organic waste (food scraps, vegetable peelings, etc) to form mainly liquid compost plus a small amount of solid.


The Green Cone has a maximum diameter of about 2ft at ground level and is 3kft high, of which the bottom 1kft is buried into the garden soil. About 40lb of scraps can be broken down per month, the resulting liquid seeping into the garden to feed valuable nutrients to plants or vegetables.

In addition to returning nutrients to the soil, such devices are environmentally advantageous, since at present up to 30% of landfill household rubbish is kitchen waste.

The Green Cone is particularly useful for those who do not have the space for a normal compost heap.
