

Nature Notes.

Oct 31st. It has taken the recent heavier falls of rain to bring the months total up to $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches, which is about average for October, but my cousin phoned from Dartmouth to say she has just measured 3 inches in 24 hours.

Nov 4th. My son tells me that either a fox or a badger has dug its way into his compost heap and is presumably living in there. I suppose it could make a

good winter home with central heating.

Nov 7th. The goldfinches that have started feeding on the lavender seeds certainly add a touch of colour to our garden during the winter. It is a mistake to trim them before the winter is over as the seeds seem to be the favourite food of the goldfinch and must help them through the hungry months.

Nov 14th. A place in North Wales has had 4 inches of rain in 24 hours. The most I have ever measured in a

day is 2½ inches.

Nov 18th. The leaves have not finished falling from our weeping prunus but a pair of bullfinches are already pecking the buds. When it is buds they are eating rather than seeds I am not so keen even though they are such colourful birds.

Ten times a year, members of our volunteer team of printers spend a full day printing about 5000 sides of paper; then our volunteer assemblers collate and staple these to make up over 400 copies of the *Scene*; these are then taken to the 19 volunteer distributors, who deliver a copy to every household in our villages. 



Something for you to make.

Here is a recipe for a Yule Log which needs no cooking.

You will need: a packet of round ginger biscuits, fruit juice, thick cream, cocoa, glace cherries and angelica.

Soak the biscuits in the fruit juice. Before they become too soggy to handle, stack them in a row so that they form a log.

Pour extra juice over the biscuits. Cover the top of the log with thick cream, and sprinkle with cocoa. Put in the fridge to chill.

Make "holly" from the cherries and angelica, and use to decorate the log. You could add a robin cake decoration, if you have one.

Variations: Chocolate chip cookies can be used instead of ginger biscuits.

Christmas is a good time to get all your family to join in games. The CHOCOLATE RACE is a game in which adults can become as greedy as children. Don't play it straight after dinner, or enthusiasm may be lacking.

You need a bar of chocolate, a dice, knife and fork and some clothes - a silly hat, scarf and huge gloves. Players sit round in a circle, and throw the dice in turn. When someone throws a six, they are allowed to eat some chocolate. The catch is that they must first put on the hat, scarf and gloves, and then eat using the knife and fork. Meanwhile the other players keep throwing the dice and can interrupt the first player if they throw a six.


