
#### HARMONY IN THE COUNTRYSIDE


The improving weather will be bringing changes to the local scenery, with the winter rape starting to flower and many grass fields now being grazed with young lambs and newly 'turned out' cattle.

As many people have found out, cattle which have been shut up for the winter months tend to be lively and excitable, so special care is needed when walking through their fields, especially if you walk with a dog. As always dogs must be kept under control and on leads whenever livestock are nearby.

Arable crops are growing fast at this time of year and many crops will have been chemically treated. While agrochemicals are totally harmless to animals once they have dried on the leaf, it is always prudent to avoid walking dogs through fields which are still wet after spraying, to prevent their coats becoming contaminated. (it only takes about half an hour for a crop to become completely dry after spraying).


Only with consideration from farmers and the public using rights of way over agricultural land, can modern farming practises and leisure activities carry on without friction. Please ensure that neither side of this arrangement has cause for complaint in the coming months by using common sense and following the 'country code' whenever you are in the countryside.





# Nature Notes.





The Tufted Duck

Mar 31st. Today we paid a visit to Pitsford Reservoir near Northampton which was, when it was constructed in 1955, the biggest man-made lake in the country. The area to the north of the causeway, which carries a road across the middle, is managed as a nature reserve providing a safe haven for a great variety of wildfowl and waders. This winter cormorants have come to Pitsford in greatly increased numbers. We counted 44 of them on the water and in the trees where some perched with their wings stretched out to dry. The woods near the waters edge show stripes of whitewashed branches below their regular perching places. These will get worse if they decide to nest and rear young there. As I watched the cormorants through my binoculars I was surprised to see a group of 5 swallows, or could they have been sand martins, cross my field of view. I followed one for some time but, it being a good way away and against the sky, I could not be sure of the colour; but whichever they were it is the first time I have ever seen them in March. My earliest previous sighting of a swallow was on april 5th in Acreditch. Among the many wildfowl we saw were a lot of wigeon and tufted duck and a few white headed duck.

April 2nd. It is certainly true that "the climate of England is variable". This beautiful spring, almost summer, weather, has brought out the bees and hibernating butterflies while earlier in the week we had some snow and night frosts.

April 15th. Warblers are now arriving to add to our wealth of bird song. This morning I heard a willow warbler in Epwell Woods and yesterday my first blackcap in the valley where I am told that a chiff-chaff has also been singing.

April 18th. A swallow has now been seen in Sibford although I have not seen anything in that line since our visit to Pitsford.

# At Last - THE 1995 BROWN ENVELOPES APPEAL on behalf of the Sibford Scene Funds

As many of you may know, it costs about £950 per year to produce the Sibford Scene, which is distributed, ten times a year, to every house in the Sibfords parishes.

Our annual income to cover these costs comes mainly from three sources. About £350 comes from the commercial adverts that appear in the Scene. About £250 is usually received as donations from some of those local organizations that use the Scene to publicize their activities; this amount includes a donation from the Town Estate Charity, which also gave us a greatly appreciated £1000 towards the cost of our new photocopier last November.

This leaves a potential deficit of about £350, which we hope to obtain (plus a bit more to start rebuilding our contingency fund to cover any future unexpected expenses) by this appeal for voluntary contributions from our readers.

We have already received about £80 from readers since December. If you would also like to help in keeping the Scene alive, all you have to do is put your contribution (cash or a cheque payable to Sibford Scene) in the enclosed BROWN ENVELOPE and drop it in the collecting box at the Village Shop or into the letter-box at one of the addresses listed opposite.

The suggested contribution is  $\pounds 2$  per household (single occupancy homes  $\pounds 1$ ) - larger contributions would, of course, be greatly appreciated!

It is noted that, earlier this year, about half the Sibford households indicated a desire to continue receiving the *Scene*; this is considerably more than the number of responses to last year's 'Brown Envelopes Appeal' and it is hoped that it betokens a corresponding increase in the number of readers who contribute this year. Monday 8th of May is the 50th anniversary of V. E. Day. Across the country celebrations will be held to mark this event. Many of these celebrations will include the flying of flags.

Did you know that flags have been used for over 5,000 years? The earliest flag-like emblems were solid objects held up on poles. The eagle standards carried by the Roman legions are examples of these early flags. It was the Romans who first introduced cloth banners to the West.


In the Middle Ages flags represented kings, families or cities. Flags, such as the Union Jack, representing countries did not emerge until the 17th century.

The Union Flag or Union Jack is a combination of the flags of England, Scotland and Ireland. It first appeared in 1603 after the accession of James VI of Scotland to the throne of England.

The separate flags of England and Scotland looked like this:

#### **England**

The cross of St. George was first used by the Crusaders.




#### Scotland

The very old cross of St. Andrew is based on the x-shaped cross on which he was crucified. His bones were reputedly washed ashore at St. Andrews in Fife, from the Holy Land.



In 1801 Ireland was brought into the Union and the flag was changed. Wales had been ruled with England since the 13th century and consequently its flag did not feature in the Union Jack. However, in 1959, the red dragon was recognised as the official flag of Wales.


Here is the Union Jack for you to colour in:



Flags have been used for signalling. Semaphore is a system of signalling carried out by holding a flag in each hand and moving the arms. There is a set position of the arms for each letter of the alphabet.

There are flags to represent all the letters of the alphabet and numbers 0-9. Modern means of communication have replaced the use of flags. However sailors still learn how to hoist and read signals correctly.

These days flags are rectangular in shape, but many different shapes were common in medieval times. Pennants were tied to knights' lances, and streamers fixed to ships' mast-heads. Here are some typical shapes:



Why not have a go at designing your own flag? A flag to represent yourself, your family, your village or maybe the 50th anniversary of V. E. Day.






