Nature Notes.

Aug. 21st. At Lambs Pool this evening we sat and watched a kingfisher as it fished from its perch on a branch a few feet above the water.

Aug. 25th. Found a few clusters of the fungus known as dead mans fingers growing in a heather bed.

Aug. 26th. Saw a beautiful clouded yellow butterfly in our garden. I have never been lucky enough to see one before although I believe that they often migrate as far north as this.

Aug. 29th. We had a marvellous view of a humming-bird hawk-moth as it fed on a mauve wallflower in the garden of Kiftsgate Court this afternoon. It has the amazing flight control of a humming-bird moving smartly to hover precisely in front of each flower while it reaches into it, with a feeding tube which must be at least as long as its body, to take the nectar. When it had finished feeding it vanished at high speed up into the air.

Sept. 5th. Today I was shown a polecat which had been found dead on the road at Pitch Hill. A few years ago I caught a glimpse of an animal in the cars headlights on Sibford Heath which at the time I put down as a polecat-ferret that could have been lost while ferreting. I have since read an article in an 8 year old copy of 'The Countryman' which said that polecats were persecuted to near extinction by 1914 but since 1950 they have been spreading steadily eastward from Wales and have recently been seen as far west as Broadway, Pershore and Tewkesbury, so the one on Sibford Heath may have been a wild one. I made some enquiries and was told that they are now thought to have recolonised the whole of Oxfordshire and records of sightings are only required from counties to the east of ours.

Sept. 21st. I was surprised to see 3 foxes running around on our rockery this morning. They could have been young ones although they were pretty well full grown.

Sept. 31st. In the last four months I have only measured $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches of rain.

Oct. 17th. I have not seen many comma butterflies this year but this afternoon we saw a perfect specimen enjoying the sunshine near the play area in Cotswold Close.

SIBFORD FERRIS PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on 16th September 1996 with only one member of the public present. The County Council have agreed to adopt the street lighting now and they will be taking it over from 1st October 1996. There have been many complaints about street lights, particularly over the last year and we hope that we shall receive a better service from the County Council. There will be a number which Parishioners can ring direct when street lights are out of action. There are stickers with the relevant number on them and I will stick them on to the lamp posts in due course.

We have received a letter from the Footpaths Officer that it is his responsibility to assist in keeping footpaths well maintained. If stiles, gates etc need repair, he can provide labour free of charge if the land owners provide the necessary materials. If anyone wants to avail themselves of this offer, they can contact the Footpaths Officer, Care of the Department of Leisure and Arts at the County Council.

The Parish Council did write to the M.E.B. last month concerning the constant interruptions to our supply in the village. We received an apology and an explanation but did not feel it was entirely satisfactory so the Clerk is writing again to carry the matter further.

We have had an offer from the W.I. to plant bulbs around the signs to the entrance of the village. This is a very pleasing offer and we look forward to seeing them bloom in the Spring.

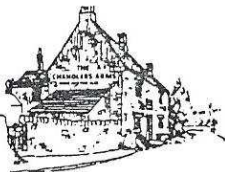

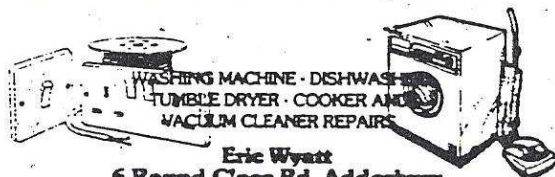

FASHION SHOW MARK II



HOLY TRINITY CHURCH

The new united benefice of Wykeham will formally come into effect on 1st November 1996 assuming that Her Majesty has given her confirmation in Council in October. In practical terms, the benefice has been in operation throughout the year and consists of the parishes of Broughton with North Newington, Epwell, Sibford, Shutford, Swalcliffe and Tadmarton. This large clutch of parishes has been shepherded into being by our own Canon Timothy Wimbush presiding over a Benefice Council comprising representatives from all the parishes and with help from Rev Keith Walklate, newly ordained as Priest (see below), Rev Michael Belham and Rev Donald Bishop, both retired clergy prepared to help out with services. Following a trial period with all the parishes trying hard to accommodate the varying wishes of their parishioners, compromises have been achieved. Those affecting Sibford churchgoers mean that starting with the second Sunday in December, all future morning services held here will be at 9.30 am instead of as previously 10.00 am. Just to confuse everyone, the Benefice service will be held on the first Sunday of each month at **10.00 am** in the different churches in rotation; the next will be in Sibford on 3rd November.

A Special service was held in St Mary's Banbury on Sunday 29th September at which a number of clergy including Keith Walklate were ordained as Priest by the Bishop of Dorchester. Timothy Wimbush preached a particularly memorable sermon. A "bring and share" lunch was afterwards held at Broughton Castle attended by a huge gathering from the benefice and Keith later officiated at a communion service for the first time in Tadmarton church.

Sibford church was beautifully decorated for the Harvest Thanksgiving service on Saturday 5th October which was conducted by Erica Wimbush with the Rector playing the organ and preaching. Afterwards nearly 60 people sat down for a highly enjoyable "bring and share" Harvest Supper in the Village Hall followed by games for old and young enterprisingly arranged and conducted by Martin and Sally Layer and their family.
