### Nature Notes.


Dec. 14th. I read that radioactivity found in lobsters in the Irish Sea near Sellafield has increased 40 fold since 1993. While we are assured that these lobsters are still safe to eat one wonders for how much longer that will be the case.

Dec. 17th. It was nice to hear a mistle thrush singing this morning. We seem to have lost the pair that usually defend the berries on our holly tree and in consequence the redwings have had a free hand and have almost stripped the tree.

Dec. 18th. While the governments of Europe argue their cases for bigger shares of the fish quota the fishing of sand eels goes on unabated. The sand eel population has been reduced to the level at which seabirds like the puffin are not finding enough to feed to their chicks. As they are also the main food of cod and hadock they must also be affected. It may be that a ban on the fishing of sand eels, which are used to make animal feed and fertilizer, would do more to maintain fish stocks than fishing quotas do. Dec. 24th. While searching for some lost sheep I walked to within 10 yards of a charcole coloured fox curled up asleep on the frozen ground. After a few seconds it raised its head, saw me, and dived down its hole. I expect it got my scent as I was walking with the freezing wind at my back. I don't know why they sometimes choose to sleep above ground in such weather.

Dec. 28th. There were 7 bullfinches feeding on the nettle seed in our piece of woodland this morning; also a jay, a great spotted woodpecker as well as the fieldfares, redwings and blackbirds that were eating the apples that we put out.

Jan. 1st. I only measured 18.24 inches of rain in 1996 which is almost four inches less than in 1995. Again the summer months were very dry



with the seven months from March to September producing only 7.9 inches, but autumn 96 was also well below average so it is not surprising that streams are running low.

Jan 3rd. Very cold morning. The temperature at Temple Mill dropped to -12°C (10°F). I have seen an enormous number of fox tracks in the snow but only oneset of hare tracks. Why the poulation of hares has fallen to this level I don't know. With all the winter corn and oil seed rape now grown they must have plenty of winter feed.

Jan 8th. Put up a woodcock at Lambs Pool. It must be difficult for them to find anywhere soft enough to probe for food in this freezing weather. Jan 10th. The first brambling that we have seen for a few years came to our birdtable today.

Jan 11th. Milder weather at last. If the muntjac that we saw in the garden today is the same one that we frequently saw last spring then its leg has completely healed. There are fewer coal tits visiting our birdtable now. They may have dispersed to other feeding sites or the cold weather may have taken its toll in which case I expect wrens will also have suffered. Jan 17th. The brambling looks much like a chaffinch but it has now learned to feed at the nut container which no chaffinch has yet done. Jan 18th. A female blackcap was feeding on the apples today. We saw a wren today and a goldcrest along Burdrop Lane yesterday, so small birds may not have been too badly affected by the cold weather.


