Nature Notes.

Feb. 23rd. A few weeks ago I was surprised to hear that a goldfinch had visited a nut feeder in Sibford Ferris as I had never seen one eating nuts, but today one, perhaps the same bird, has come to ours, with a brambling taking sunflower seed last month and a goldfinch now feeding on peanuts it seems that old birds can learn new tricks.

Feb. 26th. While helping with a bird count on a kilometre square near the Rollright Stones this morning a woodcock got up from a sheltered ditch, but I was even more pleased to find a recently used hare scrape, or 'hod' as we used to call them, in the stubble of a set-aside field. Years ago when hares were plentiful hods were frequently seen on arable land. When I was young I was told that if I spotted a hare in its hod, (which was a rare occurrence as it was so well camouflaged that the eye was the only point to draw your attention) I should take off my coat, set it on the ground and walk back the way I had come before circling round to come up behind the hare which would still have its eyes fixed on the coat. I could then grab it before it realised that I was there. I have often wondered whether there was any truth in this or whether it was just a leg pull and have never had the opportunity to try it out.

Mar. 9th. I hear that netting and ringing of birds has been carried out at Knownhill. Those caught included finches, a lot of yellowhammers, a few tree sparrows and some corn buntings which were the species that the exercise was aimed at. Although sizable flocks of corn buntings are recorded during the winter months very few of them are nesting in the area and it is hoped that the ringed birds can be traced to their summer quarters.

Mar. 12th. The first siskins that we have seen this year visited our bird table early this morning. There were four males and one female in the group which is probably working its way north for the summer.

It is thought that climatic change could account for the appearance of a greater proportion of albino frogs in southern counties. They are mostly orange in colour s should be easily distinguished from the usual green/brown variations.

Mar. 14th. This meaning I had a perfect view, through a gap in a fence that I was mending, of a very smart pair of goldcrests hopping about in a bush only a few feet from me.

Mar 17th. This early warm spell of weather has brought the butterflies out of hibernation a good deal earlier than usual. The earliest sighting of a yellow brimstone that I heard of was on Feb. 25th. Since then we have also seen peacocks, small tortoiseshells and a comma but the colder weather now forecast may make them hide away again.

We all enjoyed our Village Hall meeting on 4 March, when Simon Townsend from Banbury Museum gave a talk & showed slides on the work they do and their plans for a larger museum when the re-development of the Bridge St area is carried out.

On THURSDAY 3 April in the Village Hall we shall be having an 'Easter Tea' at 5pm, which is for members only. However, from 7-9pm there will be entertainment by 'Music Unlimited' and this is free to anyone who would like to attend. A raffle will be held during the evening, all proceeds to go to the Blue Cross Animal Rescue Centre at Burford.

On TUESDAY 15 April we hope to arrange a trip to Toddington and a ride on the local railway. This is still to be confirmed.

OnTUESDAY 6 May our Annual General Meeting will be held at 2pm in the Village Hall.





ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEERS & DRIVERS REQUIRED to help at the FIELDING DAY CENTRE

Every Wednesday for over 5 years, the Fielding Day Centre has been operating in a room kindly provided by Sibford (Friends) School, and provides, between 12.30 and 4.30pm, a cooked lunch, social activities and tea for up to 14 visitors. They attend the Day Centre by referral from the Social Services and many of them are otherwise housebound, with little if any social activity. Currently, our visitors come from Sibford, Bloxham, Epwell, Hook Norton, Hornton, Wigginton & Wroxton.

The Day Centre is run by a paid coordinator and by volunteers, a third of whom are men, who attend about once or twice a month on a rota basis. The visitors and volunteers pay £1.20 for their lunches.

Unfortunately, several of our volunteers are now unable to help as often as they would like, which means that the others have to attend more often. It would greatly alleviate our present rota problems if we could obtain the services of a few more volunteers — either to attend for the 4-hour session or JUST TO PROVIDE TRANSPORT to and/or from the Day Centre, for which drivers are paid expenses of 30p per mile.

Many people have enjoyed seeing Hale-Bopp, one of the brightest comets of this century. If we have some more clear nights, it will still be visible in the Northern Sky throughout April, as it continues its dramatic trip towards & around the Sun and then starts its return journey past Earth and onwards to the farthest reaches of our Solar System - way beyond the planet Pluto, which is some 4 billion miles from Earth. It was last seen from Earth at the time of the ancient Egyptians and is not expected to return for another 3,000 years!

Unlike the planets, whose orbits round the Sun are well-known, like Venus the 'evening star', or the fleeting meteors (the so-called 'shooting stars'), comets are exotic wanderers of the night and only a few specially bright ones are easily seen in anyone's lifetime, as they make such long elliptical voyages around the Sun.

Children Welcomed

Fostering and Adoption

Sophie (6), Jack (3) and David (10) are three children waiting for new families with whom they can live until they grow up. They can't wait too long. They need the love and security that long-term foster carers or adoptive parents could give them right now.

Oxfordshire County Council Social Services Department are looking for long-term foster carers and adopters for a number of children like Sophie, Jack and David. Most of these children are between 3 and 13 years old. Some of them have special needs. All of them need someone to come forward to offer them a permanent home. We try in most cases to keep brothers and sisters together so we often need families who can take more than one child.

All sorts of people can become foster carers or adopters. You can be married or single, age is no barrier and educational qualifications are not required.
