Nature Notes.

Apr. 21st. The temperature dropped to -6°C at Benson last night. It was not quite as low here but still low enough to do a good deal of damage in the garden.

Apr. 22nd. Badgers have been very busy digging for pignuts in the rough meadow opposite the telephone

exchange.

Apr. 25th. It sounds as though the birds are rejoicing even more than the farmers and gardeners over todays rain which produced the first measurable amount since March 26th.

Apr. 26th. I heard a cuckoo in the valley between the villages this morning.

Apr. 27th. My brother who lives at Sezincote near Morton-in-Marsh tells me that 2 families of blue tits flew from his nest boxes a week ago, which seems remarkably early.

May 3rd. On holiday to a very nice cottage in Monsal Dale with the river Wye at the bottom of the garden. Walked by Cressbrook Mill which closed in the 50s. It used to be manned largely by orphan children from London who were taken on as apprentices. Found a white wall toadflax on a wall by the mill.

May 5th. Walked up through Cressbrook nature reserve. In the woods ramsons, lily of the valley, bluebells, stitchwort and water avens were blooming and as we rose up out of the trees into bushes with open areas there were wood anemones, some of them tinted pink and a few patches that were completely pink. In the open areas there were cowslips, meadow saxifrage, and more early purple orchids than I have ever seen. The thyme and rockroses are not quite out yet. If we could only make our gardens as beautiful as this.

May. 6th. Fine all day except for a few flakes of snow here but we hear on the radio that several roads are closed in Scotland. Walked round Stanton Moor and then up Gratton Dale where we saw a great array of flowers including a few yellow mountain pansies and under a bush a patch of moschatel, also known as town hall clock, as its flowers face in four directions plus one on top. There was also an old plant of perennial candytuft at the top of an exposed rock. We also saw a pair of grey partridge and a hare. We went on to walk up the river Bradford from the village of

Bradford. It is only a good sized stream but there are many dams making a series of ponds. There were coot, moorhens and wild duck all with young, grey wagtails collecting food for young and a dabchick sitting on its nest. One pair of dippers had a nest in a concrete sluice but the other pair had their nest behind a small waterfall and had to walk through the curtain of water to feed their young ones.

May. 7th. Snow settled on the tops overnight but was soon gone. On a steep hill side in Coombs Dale we found spring pea, spring sandwort, or leadwort, as it is sometimes called because it grows near old lead mines, a big area of the limestone polypody fern and a tiny fern called moonwort.

May. 8th. Found wild jacobs ladder growing near Hobs House and saw a pair of goosanders swimming on the river below.

May. 9th. In the Monks Dale reserve we found some white early purple orchids and saw two pairs of redstarts. I have a photograph taken about 50 years ago of some stepping stones where the valley path took to the river to get round a rock. Today we found them in Cheedale but the river was running so high that some of them were under 6 or 8 inches of water. It was lucky that we had wellies on. This afternoon on an SSSI above Litton Mill we saw most of the flowers that we have seen elsewhere plus blue mountain pansies, lousewort, milkwort, yellow rattle (not yet out), some more moonwort and some more pink wood anemones. We are told that house martins which are more numerous up here nest on the rocks but I have not managed to spot any nests.



SIBFORD GOWER ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The Chairman welcomed 11 local electors, County Councillor David Turner and District Councillor David Greeen to the Annual Parish meeting which was held on 25th April in the Primary School.

The Chairman reported that the Council had co-opted Mr Roger Powell onto the Parish Council following the vacancy that arose due to the resignation of Mr Parmiter. The Chairman thanked Mr Parmiter for his support over the years as Councillor.

The Chairman also reported that Councillor David Turner was retiring after 15 years as County Councillor. The Chairman thanked him for his support and for attending so many Parish Council and annual meetings.

The Council had met 6 times during the year dealing with various issues affecting the village including planning applications, severe flooding in the Colony, public footpaths and the village pond.

The Chairman reported on the works carried out by Thames water which had improved the quality and pressure of the water. However the verges were still in a bad state, especially in Hawks Lane and the Council had requested Thames Water to reinstate the kerbs and verges as soon as possible.

The Chairman expressed thanks to the Town Estate Charity for their continued support in providing the free bus service to Banbury and Chipping Norton.

The Clerk reported on the Council's finances. Expenditure for the year ending March '97 stood at £1,336.47 which included £220 on 2 gritbins. Other expenditure had been of a routine nature. The expenditure for the coming year was anticipated to be in the order of £1,300. The total balance at the end of the financial year was £1,209 and the precept had been set at £1,000 in order to keep a reasonable amount in hand to meet any unexpected expenditure.

Mr Baadsgaard reported on behalf of the Town Estate Charity. The accounts had been submitted to and accepted by the Parish Council. Detailed accounts were available for inspection.

The Chairman then asked the meeting to raise further matters and these included the gullies in the Colony, grasscutting and the grassed area outside The Old Rectory. It was also suggested to erect a 'no footway' sign in the Colony to make car users aware that pedestrians walk on the highway as there is no footpath. All these matters will be discussed at the Annual Parish Council meeting on May 21st.

After the meeting had finished WPC Dilsaver gave a breakdown on the crime in Sibford Gower. Theft from Motor Vehicle 3; Burglary and Theft from dwelling 2; Burglary and Theft non dwelling 1; Burglary and Theft attempt 1; Criminal Damage 1.

During the summer months the village would again have the skip twice a month.

Since the Annual Parish meeting members from the Parish Council have already met engineers from the Highways Department to discuss the severe flooding problem in the Colony. Some work would be carried out in the near future. The Council would also like to thank everyone who helped with the litterblitz.







Your Chance to Speak Up about Your Community

The Cherwell Community Plan is under review, and your opinion is wanted by Cherwell District Council.

The Community Plan was adopted by Cherwell District Council last year after extensive consultation with individuals, groups, and businesses throughout Cherwell District.

The consultation revealed that the wider population of Cherwell District felt there were four groups of people who should receive particular consideration in terms of the services already delivered by the Council, and as regards any special projects the Council was able to carry out.

These four groups are elderly people, young people, people with a physical disability or sensory impairment, and people who find themselves vulnerable through poverty, isolation, or fear of crime.

A number of different initiatives have already been introduced to address the needs of these groups: District-wide Dial-A-Ride, for example, the Cherwell Link card, shopmobility in Bicester, CCTV in town centres, and extra grants for voluntary organisations to name but a few. Plans for the future, when funds become available, include: informal recreation areas and facilities for young people developed through consultation with the local community; extending CCTV to leisure centres, schools and other buildings which the community use on a day to day basis; and looking at all our buildings to see what can be done to make access to them easier for all.

But what do you think. Is the Cherwell Community Plan shaping up to your liking? Cherwell District Council is always glad to hear from District residents, but during June your views on the Plan and its development will be particularly welcome. 


Although Leah and family had only lived in the Ferris for two years she had made many friends at the Toddlers Group, School and Horticultural Society.
