Nature Notes

Sept. 2nd & 3rd. Spending a couple of days at Brockweir by the river Wye. House martins are numerous here having plenty of suitable houses on which to build their nests and an unlimited supply of mud with which to build them as the river is tidal down here. There is a small stream that runs through gardens and under houses to get to the river which is a favourite nesting place for grey wagtails and dippers. There was a male grey wagtail on it this afternoon. We walked along the disused railway track that ran down the valley but the trees stopped us seeing much of the river, however we did find some good specimens of the giant bellflower which we also find locally in Whichford Wood.

Sept. 4th. We have had trouble with birds fling into our windows but nothing to compare with the hundreds of thousands of migrating birds that are estimated to be killed each year by flying into American skyscrapers. One reporter thought that the gulls, that have taken to eating the carcases, actually drive the birds towards the skyscrapers but I think it is more likely that they mob the passing strangers who fly into the glass seeing it as a way to escape the harassment.

Sept. 7th. While walking near Kiftsgate Court we came across an oak tree which had, near the base of its trunk, an area more than two feet across covered with layer upon layer of the fungus known as chicken of the woods. An animal, probably a cow, had chewed the middle of it but it was still beautiful, being yellow or cream coloured with tints of orange. I was sorry that I did not have a camera with me.

Sept. 16th. The squirrels are having to perform acrobatic tricks like hanging by their back legs to get the last of the nuts from the tips of the branches of the beech tree that we see from our window so none will be allowed to ripen. This morning we saw a flock of over 50 goldfinches feeding on dandelion seed on the old cricket field at Hook Norton. They looked very smart with their wings flashing gold in the sunshine.

Sept. 18th. It was very nice to see 10 or 15 long- tailed tits working their way through the trees in our garden this evening. Having relatives from Canada staying with us who are interested in birds we put outsome sunflower seed which has attracted a constant stream of tits. They cannot be short of food yet but like humans prefer convenience foods.

'The Gate Hangs High & Hinders None, Refresh & Pay and Travel On.' LETTER FROM HON SECRETARY OF VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE TO ALL RESIDENTS:

To date (16th September) only 2 completed questionnaires (which were included in last month's "Sibford Scene") have been received. Does this mean no-one is interested in Village Hall activities, other than those already involved in various organisations? OR does it mean no-one reads the Sibford Scene!?

One of those received wants more "organised events for the youth" but to do this it cannot be left to one person. Our Chairman, David Baker, has restarted the Youth Club and a couple of fathers said they would help but rarely do. David has gone to some trouble to get five-a-side teams into the local League, obtaining sponsorship from one of our local pubs to buy strips and help with transport, organised hired transport to get to games, etc but it cannot be done by just one person.

Also girls have attended the Club, and two, from what I watched, playing football successfully against the lads but other girls would like netball started, and again David has organised the necessary nets (sadly one had the bottom cut out almost immediately after we got it!) - is there any mother or young lady who enjoyed netball and could give the Club two hours of their time on a Monday evening? Parhaps this is important enough to pay for someone's services to assist, out of the Village Hall funds - what do you think?

Both of the completed questionnaires were interested in Amateur Dramatics but the last village Amateur Dramatic Society folded up because of lack of support. If we start another one are there enough of you cut there who would join?

The question "Would you be interested in Touring Theatre Productions" again brought a positive response - so hopefully I am arranging for a play to be put on in the Village Hall in February. If this is well supported, more will follow. The performance will have a light supper included, and hopefully a licensed bar, and the first one will be suitable for adults and young people. More details will follow shortly. Tickets will be £3.50/£1.75 and I sincerely hope this will prove popular. We have such a great stage and lighting - it really should be used. This has not yet been confirmed by the Cherwell Leisure Services Department, who have to come and view the Hall and agree on a date.

This Department also offer, amongst many others, a Music Technology Project for 13 years and over, a Winnie the Poch Mask Making Fun Day for ages 8-11 and a Computer Animation and Video Effects four day project in February for ages 13 and over. Sadly we have to apply for these projects the first week of September but if anyone was interested, I could always see if it was possible to make a late application and I would like to know if it would be worth applying for the following year.

Your comments would be greatly appreciated, as would your completed questionnaires. You can always put a note in the Sibford Scene because I do read it from cover to cover! Or ring me on 01295 780025, although I'm not easy to find in!

I would like to mention that I was very impressed with the Playgroup when I visited the Hall during one of their sessions. I have never seen so much wonderful equipment to interest and fire their little imaginations. Helpers seem to go to endless trouble.



Sibford Ferris Parish Council

At the meeting held on 15 September the Council discussed the refusal of the Cherwell District Council to allow Nigel Matthews to move his operation from Stewart's Yard to his other site behind The Gate Hangs High. The Parish Council had supported this move. The traffic commissioners have paced a number of restrictions on operations at Stewart's Yard namely:

"a All vehicles must enter and leave the site in forward gear.

- b No maintenance or steam cleaning operations shall be carried out on the site.
- c Vehicles shall not operate on the site other than between the hours of 7:00 am and 7:00 pm (Monday to Friday) and between 7:00 am and 2:00 pm on Saturday. On Sundays, vehicle movements shall be limited to one departure and one arrival per vehicle and records of such movements shall be made and retained for inspection if required by my office.
- d Lorries in excess of fifteen tonnes shall leave the site by turning to the right (i.e., to the south), so as to avoid passing through the village of Sibford Ferris
- e Lorry engines shall not be left running when vehicles are stationary."

There have been no more developments in the Wheathill's Planning Application, the next planning meeting is scheduled for 2 October. The Parish Council has written to all the members of The Planning Committee offering to show them the site if they like to visit.

The PC has noticed that two householders have felled trees in their properties without permission. Can we remind all parishioners that pruning or felling of trees in the conservation area requires prior permission from the Chief Planning Officer. Forms can be obtained from The Cherwell District Council.

Our next meeting will be at 8 p.m. on Monday 3 November in Sibford School Library. Watch the noticeboard or Green's Shop window for further details.





A Ferris resident's letter to the District Council, suggesting the institution of a domestic rubbish collection 'rota', has elicited the following, very clear, reply from Mr G J Handley, the Chief Executive of Cherwell D.C.:

Bank Holiday Refuse Collection

Thank you for your letter dated 22nd August 1997 concerning the difficulties caused by the interruptions to the regular refuse collection over holiday times. Your comments are appreciated and noted.

It is viewed sympathetically that residents whose refuse collection day is on a Monday do receive a much greater disruption to service than other residents. The refuse collection rounds will indeed be rotated as you suggested so as to share the disadvantage across the district equally. The next rotation is due to occur when the refuse collection contract is next renewed. Contract renewal will occur between April 1998 and April 1999.
