

Nature Notes

Dec 10th. I hear from Scotland that there, as here, the haws that survived the hedge trimmers have all been taken from the hedgerows. The flocks of fieldfares that were feeding on them a few weeks ago also seem to have gone. They no doubt realise that an area without haws is not the right place to be if snow or frost come along.

Dec 20th. Two bramblings came to our birdtable today. They are winter visitors to this country and are easily taken to be chaffinches until they fly and show their white rumps. They are spending much of the time on the ground clearing up the bits that fall from the table just as the chaffinches do.

Jan 1st. 1997 was globally the warmest year ever recorded. In spite of the extremely cold start to the year Britain still had a warm year overall, with only 2 of the last 20 being warmer. Although wetter than the last few years the rainfall was about average. I recorded a total of 25.52 inches with only 4.21 inches of that falling in the first 4 months. My monthly totals were;



Jan 6th. I believe that jackdaws stay in pairs the year round. It was particularly noticeable this morning when they were sitting in pairs in some larch trees and as the flock took off and swung round on the wind they were all flying in pairs.

Jan 17th.' A mild winter so far. On Christmas day we counted 20

different plants blooming in the garden. Our winter flowering iris has been blooming for some weeks now and in some more sheltered gardens snowdrops are out and winter aconites showing yellow. The recent warm days have also encouraged the birds to sing most noticeable robins, great tits and a song thrush. The mistle thrushes have been the boldest of them but will sing whatever the weather. I remember listening to one singing at Hill Bottom in a snowstorm with a strong wind blowing.

THE CARERS CENTRE (NORTH & WEST OXON.) provides information and help to people looking after someone at home. As todays statistics show.


An attractive display of articles appropriate to the subject was much admired, as too was the collection of nursery rhyme books entered in the competition, won by Mrs Winter.


WELCOME TO SIBFORD





We bought Kate's house (Cross Cottage) in 1973 shortly after she died and moved into it in November 1975. We lived there until 1979 when we moved to Tadmarton. We had some happy times there and we were sorry to leave.

Now comes the curious thing. I was adopted as a baby through the Children's Society, and, as my parents had died some years previously, I decided to see if I could trace my natural mother. It took some time, but, eventually I found her and wrote to her.

I discovered that my grandmother (now in her late eighties) had married Oliver Lines and had lived with her in-laws at 'Cara-Mia' in the 1930's. They had also lived in Tadmarton for a short time afterwards.

Perhaps this curious fact explains my affection for Sibford. If anyone remembers the family or, indeed, if anyone is related, I would be more than delighted to hear from you.


