# Nature Notes

Feb 18th. Blackcaps have a way of quietly appearing from nowhere to feed on the apples below the birdtable as a male and female did at midday. They were not seen in the winter years ago but are now commonplace.

Mar 1st. I was surprised to see a bumble bee busily working on the flowers of pulmonaria before 8 o'clock this morning especially as there was ice on the water butt and the temperature was on freezing point. I understand that the queen bumble bees which are now on the wing, are able to dislocate their wings and then vibrate their bodies to generate warmth to get themselves going on cold mornings.

Mar 3rd. There was a dead yellow frog in our garden pond thus morning. I read somewhere that scientists are interested in why frogs go yellow but I can't find out where I should send it. If we get any more I must make a greater effort to find a researcher.

Mar 13th. My old bird book shows the nearest breeding area of the cetti's warbler at the south of France but over the last few years it has extended northwards and the R.S.P.B. now tell us that it is breeding in Oxfordshire. Perhaps this along with the over wintering blackcaps are further indications of climate change.

Mar 14th. Last winter a goldfinch visited our birdtable for the first time. The one that came to the nuts today could well be the same bird as it is unusual for them to come to tables. Siskins have also been regular visitors over the last fortnight and the male blackcap is still around.

Mar 17th. I have thrown away the apples that I kept to feed to the fieldfares, redwings and blackbirds that failed to turn up to eat them. Over the last few years we have had about twenty blackbirds coming each day during winter, The fact that they have not come this year suggests that they were not local birds attracted by the apples but like the fieldfares and redwings were migrants from the north. On the last two mornings I have seen high flying fieldfares moving north so they are thinking that winter is over.






#### 1st the Sibford Scout Group


## Sibford Playgroup News Mon./ Wed./ Fri. 9.00 - 12.00 Sibford Village Hall





#### HOLY TRINITY CHURCH NEWS

The idea this year was to cook extra pancakes in the centre of the village hall but, unfortunately, switching on the nobile cooker removed the fuses and the hall lighting so it was the heated up variety, which were delicious, and extra cooking back in the kitchen. More than 40 people from the villages, and clergy from farther afield, enjoyed a surprising quantity of pancakes enlivened by a hot punch and were in suitably quiescent mood when the Annual Parochial Meeting commenced. In fact, this was probably due to the previous circulation of a Parish Report, written by all those with duties and responsibilities in the Parish, so there was little to question anyway. Attendance was slightly up on last year so perhaps the idea is catching on.

The following day, Ash Wednesday, was marked by a large congregation in Sibford church for the evening Benefice service.
