Nature Notes.

Aug 20th. I was pleased to see a sizable flock of house martins and some swallows feeding over the Friends School hard tennis courts. They were taking the flies that were attracted to the warm surface of the tarmac and the chain link netting makes a good place to perch between their court skimming sorties. I think they were mostly young birds which means that they must have had a pretty good breeding year. Aug 22nd. The very strong underground wasp nest in our garden was dug out by a badger last night, only part of the shell of the nest remains but we can appreciate the enormous amount of work that the wasps put in to make this nest which was almost as big as a football. Not only do they collect rotten wood to turn into papier-mache with which to build the nest but they must also excavate and carry away the soil grain by grain to make space as the nest grows. It seems to me that years ago nearly all the nests were underground but now, with new strains of wasp, most of them are building in bushes, roof spaces, ventilators etc. I think that the badgers now find and destroy most of the underground nests so that will speed the change and they may become rare in the future.

While we were sitting by Lambs Pool this evening there were three herons flying round but they dare not come in to fish while we were there.

Aug 26th. I hear that a muntjac with a fawn was seen in the valley between the villages recently.

Aug 30th. I believe that some goldfish were put into Sibford Gower pond but two people have seen herons there no doubt attracted by the fish.

Sept 12th. As we cycled through Weston Park we found this little used road was almost covered by prematurely dropped acorns, (all of which were distorted by the oak nopper gall) wherever it was overhung by oak branches.

Sept 14th. It has been another poor year for butterflies and I am wondering how much our trimming of gardens and roadsides to bring suburban tidiness to the village is reducing their numbers. The caterpillars of most of the butterflies that we see in our gardens feed either on stinging nettles or coarse grasses, e.g.

Stinging nettles
Small tortoishell

Peacock

Comma Red admiral On coarse grasses

Ringlet

Speckled wood

Gatekeeper

Small skipper

Marbled White

Hopefully the reduction in roadside mowing will allow their numbers to recover gradually.

Sept 15th. My brother rang to say that he had seen a rabbit jump into the canal near Fenny Compton and after swimming round in a circle set off to swim confidently right across to the other side. Sadly that bank was shuttered with steel and there was nowhere that it could get out and after swimming along by the bank for a while disappeared under the water. I have never seen a rabbit swim. He thought this one might have been suffering from myxamotosis and not being able to see properly, jumped in by accident.






Beth Chatto is famous for her garden in East Anglia, her books & her T. V. appearances.



VANDALISM at SIBFORD GOWER ENDOWED PRIMARY SCHOOL

As a parent and P.T.A. member, I was disappointed to read the following in the school newsletter recently.

SUMMER HOLIDAY WORK

Over the summer break, external redecoration was carried out and the children's cloakrooms painted. Sadly, in addition to this, the school suffered quite expensive damage on a regular basis: three external doors were broken and have had to be replaced; a gate was broken beyond repair; two windows were cracked by items thrown at them; aluminium guttering was snapped as a result of someone climbing onto the flat roof; coping stones around the playground have been broken and displaced, presumably by skaters, who have covered them and the playground benches in wax; and the seats on the playbus have been smashed. I estimate that the whole of our annual budget for repairs will have been used up repairing this damage. It is particularly disturbing to think that it was probably done by former pupils. The evidence left regularly around the building also suggests that they are heavy lager drinkers too!

The P.T.A. spend many hours organising fund-raising events to provide 'extras' for the children. It would be a great shame if this money was needed to meet the cost of repairs in the future. This may well be the case if any further damage is inflicted during the forthcoming school year.

May I please ask villagers to keep an eye open when passing the school and perhaps to ask any suspicious looking characters to move on their way. Thank You

Our two separate visits to Hook Norton Brewery were thoroughly enjoyed by everyone and our guide gave an informative and fascinating account of it's history, which was begun by John Harris in 1849 in a small brewhouse on the present site. Gradually, as sales increased, the building

was enlarged until in 1900 a new brewery was constructed with the brewing plant supplied and installed by Buxton & Thornley of Burton-on-Trent. Much of the original machinery is still in use today and nearly everything is powered by a 25 h p steam engine, quite unique in this day and age. We were very interested in the process of brewing beer in the traditional way, which made our drink of Hooky at the end of the tour even more enjoyable.
