Nature Notes


22nd. We were surprised to hear the thud of a bird flying into our window at 8 o'clock tonight. I took a torch to see what sort of bird had come to grief at that time of night and saw a cat rushing away leaving a handful of blackbird feathers. I wondered whether the cat could have flushed it from its roost following it until it hit the window and then collecting its reward.

Nov 1st. Two buzzards were seen over Acre Ditch this morning which is not such a rare sight as it used to be as they continue to spread from the west. I have often wondered whether queen wasps can sting. Today I put my finger on one that had hidden itself away amongst my flower pots and found out that they can.

Nov 7th. A nuthatch flew against the window this afternoon. At first it looked to be dying and I kept an eye on it and made sure that there were no cats near and after a few minutes it came to and started to look around and within 20 minutes felt well enough to fly away into the trees. A few days ago my sister had two blackbirds hit her window at the same time and both of them died. They were probably chasing.

Nov 9th. There were two nuthatches on the bird table today so I think it must have made a full recovery.

Nov 15th. A heron was patrolling Sibford Ferris gardens, at 7.15 this morning, looking for a pond to rob. My sister-in-law tells me that many years ago she found a good sized goldfish, that could only have come down the chimney, on the sitting room hearth at Holly House. Could a heron have dropped it? I find it hard to visualise a heron settling on top of that chimney although I suppose they are a shade smaller than the white storks that sometimes nest on chimney tops on the continent.

THE WORLD'S BEST CHRISHMASH CAKE

1 cup dried fruit 1 cup butter

2 large eggs

2 bottles high quality rum pepper or salt Sample a small measure of rum, for quality.

brown sugar lemon juice baking soda



Select a large mixing bowl, measuring cup and spoons. Sample another measure of rum to confirm it is of highest quality. To be absolutely sure, pour yourself a level cup of rum and drink as fast as possible. Repeat if not 100 pershent sore.

With a hand mixer, beat 1 cup of butter in the large fluffy bowl. Add 1 tsp thugar and beat again vigourishly. Sit down and retest another cup of rum (in case it has gone off in the heat - isn't it getting warm in here?).

After a little well-deserved rest, open your eyes and continue with recipe by addling 2 arge leggs & 1 flup of cried druit and beat till high. If druit gets stuck in beaters, pry out with a drewscriver (either standard or Phillips will do>.

Open second bottle of rum (you don't remember finishing the first one?) and test for tonsiscency. Next sift 3 cups of pepper or salt (it really doesn't matter), & ½ pint of jemon luice into the large bowly fluff and add 2 spabletoons of washing soda. Fold in the chopped butter and add your strained nuts. Retest rum for contistic constituency.

(We're nearly there, my duck, so brace yourself against the sink, take 2 deep breaths and mop your brow with the dishcloth.) Add a bag (as in many things, actual size doesn't matter) of brown thugar (nor does the colour, really). Wix mell with a spooden woon. Grease a 7½" oven (What with? Oh, I don't know. See what's lurking in the bottom of your chip pan). Turn your cake tin up to 350 gredees. Pour contents of the buffy flowl into the coven and leave to brake till dun (probably a week next Tancake Puesday, but who cares?).

Finally, sift the rest of the rum into the empty flowly buff, drink it, give your brow a final mop with the clishdoth and bo to ged. (Merry Chrishmash.) - Smelia Dith.



Winter is approaching and this year's flu injections are now available for patients of Sibford Surgery.



WINTER WARMTH IS ESSENTIAL

If you are fit and healthy and live in a comfortable well heated home there is a good chance you will not be at risk from cold this winter. However, there are groups who for a variety of reasons, fall short of this criterion and who need to take extra care during the winter months. These groups include the elderly, the very young, the sick and the disabled.

Hypothermia is the big worry for vulnerable groups, during the winter months, and this occurs when the internal body temperature drops below 35°C.

Signs to look for include:-

- Lack of awareness of cold conditions
- Drowsiness and slurred speech
- Slow pulse and slow breathing
- Pale cold skin
- Blue coloured lips
- Unsteadiness and slow responses
- Mental confusion

The three main points for avoiding hypothermia centre around diet, clothing, accommodation,

Diet

Have a good hearty breakfast, preferably hot, such as porridge or boiled eggs and toast. Drink plenty of hot drinks regularly during the day. Have a well balanced main meal sometime during the day and keep a flask of hot drink by your bedside for use during the night.

Clothing

Wrap up well indoors if your house is cold.

Remember several thin layers of clothes keep you warmer than one thick layer. Thermal underwear is effective in keeping out the chill.

It is a fact that 20 per cent of your body heat goes out through your head, so a warm woolly hat or nightcap can be a great help.

If you have to pop outside, even if its only briefly, be sure to wrap up well with warm coat, scarf and gloves.

Accommodation

Try to keep your home warm, but if its draughty or poorly insulated this may prove to be expensive!! Sealing cracks, covering letterboxes and drawing across thick curtains will all help to keep the heat in.

Sleeping temperatures should not be below 13°C, so if your bedroom is cold, consider having your bed down in the living room during cold spells. Electric blankets, that are fairly cheap to run, can make going to bed the luxury of the day!

Finally if you are worried about your heating bills do not turn the temperature down, ask for help without delay.

we are nearing the completion of the individual contributions. We have had a wonderful response, over sixty people have taken part producing some excellent work.


The next stage will be arranging the work, a real challenge. We will be starting in January 1999 and have to complete the project by April, ready for our exhibition at The Mill in Banbury.




