#### Nature Notes

July 27th. This dry weather is making it very difficult for blackbirds and thrushes to find enough food for themselves and their young ones. One blackbird has started picking the tomatoes in the green house as soon as they start to redden. The best day for butterflies in our garden. I counted 24 peacocks, nearly as many large whites, one comma and a few gatekeepers and meadow browns.

July 31st. The knapweed broomrape, that I mentioned in last months notes, grew to 2½ feet tall before it was chopped off by the roadside mower. I looked at the chopped off head which held a lot of seed but it was still in the white and fluffy stage with no hope of developing to viability. It is even more regrettable because it was on a straight stretch of road without a strong growth of grass where there was no point in mowing anyway. It would be a great advantage if the tractor driver had a knowledge of wild flowers and was allowed to miss a bit where rarities like this occurred. There is still hope of some seed for future years.

Aug. 2nd. I have heard of two more probable sightings of red kite over Sibford. If anyone else should see one overhead the best distinguishing feature is its forked tail which the buzzard doesn't have. A visitor who lives near Brecon tells me that she put a nice meaty bone out in the garden for her dog and a red kite came down and carried it away. She was amazed at the size of a kite when seen close to. If the new disease, that is affecting rabbits in some areas, is as deadly as it is said to be, it could well affect the numbers of buzzards and red kite as rabbits form a big proportion of their diet.

Aug. 4th. When my granddaughter and her friend went to bed they found a long eared bat hanging on the wallpaper of their room. Her friend who came from Zimbabwe took it all in her stride.

Aug. 8th. It was nice to see families of yellow wagtails and corn bunting flitting about on the corn on the way to Wiggington Heath today. A big area of arable like that certainly provides the habitat for a different selection of birds to that we gat near the villages.

Aug. 11th. I hear that a cormorant visited a local pond a few weeks ago and more recently 48 canada geese. This is the sort of flock we could well do without.

**Aug 16th.** Some young house martins whose nest had fallen were rescued by a caring lady who cut the crown out of a straw hat and fixed it under the eaves, putting the young ones into it. The parents are not only feeding the youngsters but have put some mud over the hat to make it look right.

Aug. 17th. I read that the population of mallard has fallen by 40% over the last 10 years. This is probably due to mink who are adept at raiding their nests, which in this country are usually in pollarded willows. It is hard to think of any imported wild creatures that have been of benefit to us. When watching the gardening programme on T.V. it makes me shudder to see Pippa Greenwood releasing foreign mites into her greenhouse to see if they can control whitefly. There is no knowing what beneficial insects they may prefer to the whitefly.

Aug. 18th. At the end of a July when less than a quarter of an inch of rain had fallen and with the winter barley already in the barn things looked set for an easy harvest but with the change in the month came a change in the weather and with  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches, including the inch that fell in half an hour today, so far this month, it has now become a bit of a struggle.


The September meeting (21st) is now cancelled due to its clash with the re-dedication of the Sibford Church. This will enable some of our members to celebrate this important event.

## Carers Emergency Scheme



#### HOLY TRINITY CHURCH NEWS

We watch, rather breathlessly, as the roof itself moves on apace and as the painters start their work inside. We are a little behind on schedule, but assuming that the painters continue as they have started, we should be ready for the special service on September 21st to commemorate 30 years since our Rector's ordination.

We have had some rather heavier than expected unforeseen work to consider; the walls beneath the coping stones are in a bad way and the stones will have to be lifted and replaced, a big and expensive job; the soakaways need rebuilding and both crosses and some coping stones have deteriorated badly and need replacing; the organ bellows have had to be re-leathered. All this and other smaller items add up to over £10,000 and we will have to draw heavily on our loans to fund this, if it all proves inescapable, and pay out of future surpluses.

We would like to express our great appreciation of The Historic Churches Preservation Trust (HCPT) and their sister organisation, The Oxford Historic Churches Fund. The former have given us a grant of £5,000 and are considering an interest free loan of £6,000; the latter a grant of £5,000. HCPT has, in recent years, been making awards of about £1m to approximately 300 churches each year but is itself dependent on donations for much of its funds. It seems a bad time to ask for funds for them when so many from the villages have been so generous to us. It is hoped though that the generosity of both of these organisations will, when we have all drawn breath, receive acknowledgement in the form of financial support so that other churches can continue to receive the help that has been so generously given to us.
