Nature Notes

Sept 27th. In the last 11 exceptionally wet days I have measured 3.59 inches of rain. In the same period my brother measured 5.50 inches at Sezincote near Moreton in Marsh.

Sept 29th. About a fortnight ago a pair of grey wagtails spent some time around our garden pond. This morning a female grey wagtail appeared on the lawn and at the same time a cat made a dash up a nearby path and although I could not find any feathers I still wonder whether it got the male as greys normally travel around in pairs.

Oct 6th. A friend tells me that when he took a dog for a long walk it found six separate foxes and a crow with a damaged wing which it chased and when the dog got close the crow turned and threatened it with wings spread causing the dog to back off.

Oct 7th. On several mornings recently I have thought that redwings must have arrived because the blackbirds, mistle thrushes and song thrushes all been chasing around noisily protecting the yew berries but I have not managed to spot one here. This morning however I saw a flock of about 50 flying over Banbury.

Oct 9th. When visiting the Horton Hospital this evening I saw some pied wagtails fly down from the roof into a quadrangle to settle in some shrubs. They must have been the last of many because the shrubs, which were not more than 5 feet tall, were trembling as they all settled down for the night. In this enclosed quadrangle they are sheltered from the wind and safe from most predators.

Oct 10th. This morning the second thrush in a fortnight died when it flew into our window. It is said that they only do this when they can see a way through, as with windows on the opposite sides of a room, but this one hit the window before 7 am. when the light was on in the room and another one recently hit a bedroom window with no view through. Prior to these deaths we had a spell that led me to think that those that were going to kill themselves in this way had already done so and a strain of less reckless thrushes was evolving but it may just be that the younger generation is more accident prone.

Oct 15th. I hear that birds in Cotswold Close are suffering from the attention of a sparrowhawk particularly while they are using a bird-

bath when their wet feathers would make them easy prey.

Oct 17th. Went with my sister-in-law in search of a wild service tree which is marked on a plan we were shown, as growing to the north of Lower Tadmarton and although we failed to find one in the area we were searching, we did find a mature tree of about 30 feet nearer Shutford. I must have passed this tree many times without recognising it but probably never when it was displaying its full autumn glory.

Housing Needs Survey

Cherwell District Council is about to start a comprehensive study of housing need within the District which will involve a postal survey of approx. 5,500 households and a further 500 personal interviews. The aim of the survey is to identify the extent, geographical distribution and types of housing need within the District.

The information obtained from the survey will help the Council develop an effective housing strategy to be incorporated into the Local Plan and which will form the basis of Housing Investment Programme submissions to the Department of the Environment, Transport and the Regions.

Households to be included in the survey will be randomly selected and it is likely that some parishioners will either receive a postal questionnaire to complete and return or will be contacted by an interviewer calling at their home, all of whom will carry identification and a letter of authority from the Council.

It is very important that as many people as possible complete and return their questionnaire forms. The level of response can affect the accuracy of the survey and to avoid the possibility of bias it is Just as important that people living in satisfactory housing return their form as people living in unsuitable accommodation.

All information provided will he treated in the strictest confidence and as soon as the data has been collected all the forms will be destroyed. The information will only be used for planning purposes and no individual names or addresses will be published.

The latest definitive maps of footpaths and bridleways of Sibford Gower is available for inspection. They are copyright material and cannot be photocopied for display in the Council's noticeboard but may be seen by arrangement with the Parish Clerk.







Bishop Blaize Car/Cycle Treasure Hunt


Despite the cold and rain, another enjoyable afternoon. We would like to thank all the entrants who took part in the treasure hunt especially the brave cyclists.

Sibford Village Hall - Proposed Extension

The Village Hall Committee held an open meeting on 29th September in the Hall to enable villagers to look at the draft plans and give their views.

Following this meeting and further consultations with groups who use the Hall, the general consensus was in favour of the proposal to extend the Village Hall.

It is envisaged that the Hall be extended to the side away from the road, to have a room with facilities primarily for children to use. The kitchen would be doubled in size and have access from a lobby running from the side of the Hall alongside the extension, to provide shelter for prams etc. A small meeting room with storage will replace the existing kitchen. A room for the Village Archives would be provided. Improved storage for tables underneath the stage is being considered. Hard standing near the garages (which will be re-sited) will facilitate access for those groups who store equipment there.

Funding for the proposed scheme would be applied for to the lottery and various charities. Further information will be provided in regular updates in the Sibford Scene.
