Nature Notes

April 3rd. Muntjac are doing more damage to our garden this year by eating the heads off some flowers and grazing the leaves off others. The one that crossed our lawn at dusk last night could be the culprit but they seem to be increasing in numbers year by year. I see that our most used garden book gives a list of deer proof plants which may help us in the choice of new plants, and the deer will sort the ones we already have for palatability.

April 9th. I did not see the northern lights on the evening of April 6th but those from the village that did see them tell me that they made quite a show which, I have no doubt, would have been much better without the curse of light pollution. I count myself lucky to have lived through the war years when the blackout over Europe allowed us to see the night sky with a clarity that may not now be equalled anywhere in the inhabited world.

April 10th. A swallow was seen at Blenheim Farm today. I thought I saw one three days ago, perched on a telephone wire the other side of Banbury, but could not get a good look at it as I was driving.

April 11th. Two days ago one of the rooks that is nesting in our conker tree spent most of the day making a most unusual call. A neighbour thought that we had bought a peacock. I joked that it was only a rook with a sore throat but now that things are back to normal I am wondering whether that was the trouble.

April 13th. While I was helping with a bird count on Feb 27th we saw a great crested grebe on its nest at Compton Verney but thought that it was too early for it to be seriously sitting; however I have heard that there are now two chicks there.

April 17th. Although the blackcap has returned and is singing in our garden the fieldfares are only now collecting before moving north. More than 200 spent a noisy 10 minutes chattering away in the trees around us this morning.

April 18th. It seems that our lawn is on the territorial boundary for two pairs of song thrushes. One pair has started building high up in

our yew hedge which may help to keep it away from the cats but is right on a route regularly used by squirrels which may be just as bad.

April 19th. Our Editor heard the first cuckoo today at Swalcliffe Common.

April 20th. While I was in the garden a blackbird flew towards me and in doing a U-turn when it spotted me, dropped an eggshell that it was carrying. I thought that it was clearing the shells from its nest as the chicks hatched but when I looked at it I found that it was the shell of a thrushes egg with fresh yolk in it. Can it be that some blackbirds are nest robbers?

April 21st. I have measured 4.22 inches of rain so far this month which equals that for the whole of the first quarter of the year. My brother who lives at Sezincote near Bourton-on-the-Hill has had 5.40 inches.


Shenington Club visit us on June 7th to enjoy our gardens and we return to them on June 28th.

"God has lent us the earth for our life.

It is a great entail. It belongs as much to those who are to come after us as to us and we have no right, by anything we do or neglect, to involve them in any unnecessary penalties or deprive them of the benefit which was in our power to bequeath".

These sentiments sum up completely my appreciation of the 'Wheathills' benefactors and may also form the basis of the policy of the Council for the Protection of Rural England.

I commend these sentiments to your attention.


Friendship Club


