Oct 28th. My daughter and her husband went out last night to investigate the source of an angry grunting noise wondering whether it could come from a wild boar! When they were getting towards the far side of the field they could see several pairs of eyes in the light of their not very powerful torch. They went close enough to see that the sound was made by a rutting stag guarding his harem.

Nov. 7th. I get frequent reports of buzzards being seen over the village, in one case five were seen at one time but today I was in the right place at the right time to see one for myself. It was being mobbed by 2 crows. Nov. 16th. A hen pheasant walked across our lawn this morning. We used to see them more often than we do now; indeed they nested in the garden once or twice. Not that we want too many of them as I can remember the trouble that my brother had with released pheasants, when we chased them up one side of his raspberries they just ran round the end and down the next row, and what with pecking his young plants and dust bathing in his seedbeds he might as well have had a flock of hens loose in his garden.

Nov. 17th. Last winter we regularly heard a tawny owl with a hoarse voice which I thought could have been a young one as there sounded to be two others with it. We are now hearing a very hoarse one again and still cannot decide whether it is a young one yet to find its full voice or the same one with a permanent croak.

Nov. 20th. On November 7th I saw my first 4 fieldfares of the winter flying southwest and on the 11th another 25 going in the same direction but have not seen any since.

LETTER FROM CAPE TOWN

This is the first letter of several I hope to write from sunny South Africa as a Sibfordian in exile. Steve and I are here for approximately two years while a new factory is being built and developed in Cape Town by Steve's Company. Steve is heading up this manufacturing plant which is making ceramic substrates for catalytic converters. Now that might mean something to some of you but I'm not (and can't) get more technical than that. Suffice it to say that the Government and the Western Cape in particular are delighted to have foreign investment and job creation, so badly needed in the new South Africa.

I hope to give you a flavour of what it's like to live here, some of the changes that have taken place, a few nature notes, and perhaps a bit of what we have been doing with ourselves. This, I hope, will appeal to those who know us and those who don't. For those of you who have been to the fairest Cape I hope it will bring back happy memories and for the e of you who haven't been, maybe I can tempt you to visit this beautiful part of the world.

We arrived in September, at the end of Winter, just going into Spring so the weather has been mixed. Sometimes we have had misty starts to the day, sometimes a bit of rain but the sun is never far away. Temperatures have varied during the day from about 17 degrees to the high 20s. However, as the weeks go on the weather gets more settled and last week we had our first day with the temperature over 30 degrees; a day when we were glad to have a swimming pool in the garden! The flowers are wonderful at this time of year with roses, lillies, agapanthus, strelitsia, to name but a few, in full bloom. The jacaranda trees have now started to blossom too. These have wonderful intense purple blossom made more vivid by the fact that the blossom appears before the leaves. The native bushveld here is fynbos (fine bush) which is ablaze with colour at the moment. The proteas are particularly striking and come in many different colours and varieties.

We are living in a place called Somerset West which is actually about 45 km from Cape Town, the other side of False Bay. We are surrounded by beautiful mountains, the Helderberg on one side and the Hottentots-Holland on the other. We can just see the sea from our

house so the beach is not far away. We are also on the famous wine route with Stellenbosch just up the road. Our nearest vineyard is called Vergelegen which produces a very nice red!

We have been rather busy since we arrived as you can imagine with a hundred and one things to do including finding a house and moving in. I'm pleased to report that on the whole things have gone smoothly and we're beginning to settle into our new way of life. We are very lucky to have some very good friends from our days in Johannesburg staying close by who have been great at introducing us to people and pointing us in the right direction. Life has certainly been busy since we got here with one lot of overseas visitors come and gone and the next lot arriving soon.

I think I might have room for one last bit of information in this letter. For anyone who would like to see whales at close hand, this is the place to come. The Southern Right whale comes close into shore to breed between July and November every year. It really is the most incredible sight to see these huge creatures in family groups basking on the surface, blowing big water spouts and then sounding, showing the classic tail fluke. We spent a wonderful afternoon watching them at a place called Hermanus which is becoming quite famous for whale watching, although you can see them all around False Bay.

I think that's enough for this letter. I hope it has been of interest to you so it just remains for Steve and I to wish everyone in Sibford a happy Christmas and New Year. We will be thinking of you while we sit on the beach enjoying the sunshine!



Christmas Puzzle Page


The Sibford Scene has a number of small prizes for the two puzzles. The Pantomime Puzzle is for children while the Village Names puzzle is open to all ages.






