## Nature Notes

March 3rd We are having quite a cold spell of weather but nowhere near as cold as it is in northern Scotland where snow is lying. Last night the temperature at Altnaharra fell to -21°C (-6°F) which, as far as I know, is lower than anything ever recorded here.

March 12th The mistle thrush with the unusual song is still around but while he was singing his tyew-tyew-tyew song in the distance today another one with a normal song was singing close by. I recorded the unusual song and played it over the phone to an expert and found that he had never heard one like it either. It is said that birds that vary their song from what is normal for the species have less chance of attracting a mate, which I suppose helps to keep the song pure, so I think that this one with what is largely a new song has no chance. It will be interesting to see whether the musically correct thrush takes over its territory.

March 13th It is only a few days since the ice melted on our garden pond but already there is a lot of frogs spawn to be seen and a great rippling of the pond as frogs heads disappear whenever I go near.

March 17th A small flock of fieldfares flew over this morning which reminded me that I have seen very few of them this winter and hardly any redwings. There seem to be fewer coming here with each winter that passes. Whether climatic change is making it possible for them to winter in Scandinavia or whether their numbers are actually dropping I don't know.

March 19th It is sad that the nuthatches that have been coming to our bird table for the last few years have not put in an appearance at all this winter. We had a winter without any a few years ago so we live in the hope that we shall see some again next year.

The Annual General Meeting of the Society took place on the 22 March, with a short business session reviewing the past year and electing the Committee. We have had a busy year, as we mounted the exhibition in the Manor, of memorabilia of past pageants

and eight Society Meetings. Our project for the coming year is to compile an Oral History of the village and we hope to record on tape, for future generations, the memories of people born in the village.

Arnold Lamb brought along the map marking the whereabouts of the trades carried on in the village around 1865, showing that the Sibfords were self-sufficient for their basic needs. A quarter of the houses in the Sibfords carried on some sort of trade, which was very necessary, as the trip into Banbury on the carrier's cart took three hours each way, along the Shipston to Banbury turnpike road.

Arnold also played a tape his grandfather made with Leslie Bailey for the BBC Scrapbook, remembering life in the second half of the 1800's, mentioning that when the reaping machines came in, corncrake and quail disappeared from the fields. The first modern form of transport, a motorbike, came into the village in 1900. Our thanks

to Arnold for a fascinating evening, which highlighted the amazing changes that have taken place over the last 150 years.

We have a full programme for the coming year, with interesting speakers, so do come along and join us on the third Thursdays in the month at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall.

The next meeting is on Thursday, 19 April at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall, when Christine Bloxham will speak on the Traditions and Legends of Wychwood Forest. Those of you who heard her speak on Christmas customs will know you are in for a lively and informative talk.
