Nature Notes

June. 5th About a fortnight ago a panel fence which was carrying several years growth of ivy was blown over. To repair it I had first to cut back the long growth of ivy which was still quite heavy with berries. Although I had searched the ivy for birds nests before cutting it off a few days later a wren flew out from the remaining tangle of stems and I found that there was a nest which they had not deserted in spite of the upheaval and they are now feeding young ones.

June. 10th This morning a male great spotted woodpecker was encouraging a young one to come to the bird table for some peanuts. It flew around close to but would not settle and in the end he took a nut and fed it to the youngster on a nearby dead branch.

June. 11th Got up to find a great spotted woodpecker, a young one with a red cap, dead on the path by our back door presumably having flown into the glass of our porch. It was cold and stiff so must have died at dawn or soon after. When I went to dispose of it after breakfast it had gone probably making a meal for a cat. A little later my wife alerted me to the body of a great crested newt which was lying on our drive. The tail had been chewed off or perhaps run over by a car. Its size was quite impressive when compared to a smooth newt that my grand daughter caught. It must have weighed 4 times as much. It may have just left our garden pond for although I have never seen one my grandchildren have told me that they have seen big ones in there. Because I thought that they were becoming scarce I rang an expert on newts who told me that they are now quite common. He said that a tiny pond near them that was known to contain some was to be buried under a new road so they got the contractor to dig a new pond and when he and his wife moved them to their new home they found that there were about 300 of them.

June. 12th We have seen a small grass snake in our garden pond on several occasions recently but there are still plenty of tadpoles so hopefully it is not eating too many of them.

June. 14th Jackdaws must be doing well. While cycling this evening we were hearing their calls of "Jack" for much of the way. Here a flock of about 50 collects noisily over the Ferris each evening and seem to finally settle in the beeches over Holly House Drive along with some rooks. The rabbit population has also reached a very high level but may have peaked as we also saw a few with myxomatosis this evening.

June. 18th On this lovely morning it was nice to hear bullfinches, nuthatches and a blackcap back in the garden after a few weeks absence. There was an escaped ferret on the roadside at Whichford when we were cycling this evening. We also saw a badger cross the road on a well used track.

June. 20th A young great spotted woodpecker came to the nut feeder today so there are still some around.

According to the Domesday Book, there was a house on the site in Saxon times and was followed by a Norman dwelling, the cellars of which still remain in perfect order. A Tudor house was burnt down at the end of the Civil War and the land confiscated from the owner, John Cartwright but given back later by Charles the Second. As the Earl of Northampton had burnt down the house, he was ordered to recompense John Cartwright with £10,000 to rebuild the house!

The Cartwright family owned the house from 1615 until the tragic deaths in a car accident of the then owner and his son in 1954. The Country Houses Association now owns the property, which is occupied by active retired people in 30 different apartments and their income now helps to keep the house in good repair.

Free Refrigerator Disposal

A free collection service is now being offered by the Council to all households in the district to dispose of old fridges and freezers. The move follows the introduction of Government regulations stipulating that before fridges can be disposed of they must be stripped of all the insulating foam they contain. There are currently no facilities in the United Kingdom to enable this to be done and refrigerators will have to be stored until plants are built.

Oxfordshire County Council will set up a number of storage areas for old fridges. Cherwell residents are still able to deliver them for disposal to the Ardley and Alkerton landfill sites. The Council has introduced the free collection service to prevent fly-tipping of fridges. Residents with fridges or freezers for collection can call (01295) 221910 to make arrangements. All fridges must be empty and clean as it is anticipated they will be stored for several months.

OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Free Dog Registration Scheme

Designed to encourage responsible dog ownership, the Council operates a free Dog Registration Scheme to improve the speed of returning lost or stray dog to its rightful owner. The scheme requires dog owners to complete a form giving contact details to be entered on a database and allocated a unique registration number. A tag with this number and the Council's phone number is then sent. If the dog is then found and the Dog Warden informed, the owner can easily be located and reunited with the missing pet. The service is free the first three times the dog is returned.

Between April 2001 and February 15 2002, 170 dogs were found straying in the Cherwell District. None of them had an identity tag giving an address or telephone number to contact the owners, saving the dog unnecessary stress. Those owners are then liable for a fine and kennelling fees.

Of the dogs found to be stray 90 were reunited with owners, 77 were re-homed and three put down for health reasons.

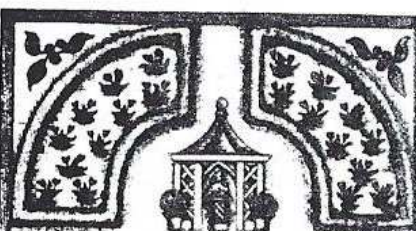

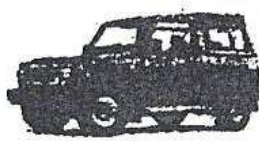

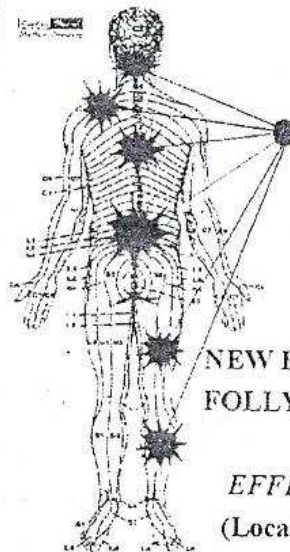
