Nature Notes

Mar. 27th. A smart male siskin came to our nut feeder this morning. Mar. 28th. A male and female siskin feeding today and I have heard of some in Sibford Gower. I expect they will soon move on northwards.

Mar. 31st A wren is building a nest above our sitting room window. However it may not be used as the hen bird is fussy and only uses one of the several nests that the cock builds.

Apr. 6th Wood pigeons and blue tits are taking the flowers of our ornamental prunus and more seriously our plum blossom. I expect it must be the sweetness of the nectar that attracts them.

Apr. 12th After this mornings dawn chorus while the blackcap was making use of the quiet period for its solo performance some canada geese flew down the valley. Hearing them set my mind working on the changes in the natural sights and sounds around the parish since I was a boy. As well as the canada geese which came here after several large ponds were made in this area there is the collared dove that spread so rapidly across Europe in the 50s. The muntjac and the American mink have escaped from captivity. The polecat has spread east from the Welsh borders and buzzards have spread from West to East to become common here. Roe and fallow deer have increased considerably as have the badgers. On the downside the grey partridge has become scarce and their rasping call as they collected to roost on winter evenings is a sound that I have not heard for several years. The quail that we seldom saw but often heard in the summer is now a rare visitor as is the turtle dove. Hedgehogs have also become scarce. Apr. 13th A ten mile walk by some of the younger members of the family took them by Cottisford where they counted 83 dead frogs in the water but the fish seemed to be well. I know there are casualties at spawning time but this number must be excessive.

Apr. 15th Early in the month my son told me that he had a distant view of about 8 deer as they made their leisurely way toward Swalcliffe Common. I assumed that they were fallow as he said he only saw them at that distance because one of them was white. Tonight I met someone who had a better view of a group of roe deer containing a white one in the same area so we must keep our eyes open as I think a white roe is quite unusual.

HOLY TRINITY CHURCH NEWS

The programme of Lent Austerity lunches in the Benefice was its usual success for fellowship and finance. Most of the Parishes donated their contributions to the Katharine House Hospice and the Sibford collection from the lunch held at The Red House, Burdrop totaled £131.87 (including tax relief).
