Nature Notes

Sept. 25th. There were two humming-bird hawk-moths on our salvia today so it is not always the same one that I see.

Sept. 26th. The flowers on our shrub salvia are carried on the ends of slender shoots and in today's stiff breeze were waving about quite vigorously. Bees steal most of their nectar by puncturing the side of the flower which enables them to reach it. The humming-bird hawk-moths have feeding tubes that can easily reach it and today one put on an unbelievable flying display when, having found a flower that had not had its nectar plundered, hovered in front of it moving exactly to match the erratic movements of the flower and not even bending the connected feeding tube. Fancy being born with such a skill.

Sept. 27th Two very smart grey wagtails spent a while by our garden pond where they were still finding a few insects.

Sept. 30th. I have often seen rooks or crows mobbing birds of prey but not viciously as was witnessed by my neighbours recently when a kestrel was attacked and killed.

Oct.1st. A crow has been pecking our blenheim apples and today I saw one eating the ones on the lovely old tree on the bank behind the Bishop Blaize. It might well be the same bird and it only likes blenheims!

Oct.12th. A song thrush was stunned when it hit our window but eventually recovered and flew away.

Oct.13th. After hearing nuthatches around for some time they are now coming to our bird table. Today one attacked a blue tit and they dropped together into the nettles below. The tit flew away immediately and the nuthatch a minute or two later so it may have come off worst and hopefully learned a lesson.

It was a nice surprise to see shots of Hook Norton and Traitors Ford in "A year at Kew" on TV tonight. They finished up at Whichford Pottery where Jim Keeling was putting the finishing touches to a big pot to hold a special plant for the entrance of the temperate house at Kew.

Oct. 17th. Another, or the same, song thrush flew into one of our windows and this time it died. As there are so few song thrushes around it is strange that they, more than any other species, come to grief in this way which must be a major cause of their declining numbers.


Sibford Ferris Parish Council Meeting 28 September 2005


With one apology for absence from the Vice Chairman, Barbara Crabtree, all other Councillors, and also the District Councillor, George Reynolds, attended the meeting.

Amongst the matters arising were several highways issues which had been put to the County Council Engineer, Steve Bowden, and the following responses were reported. Concerning the junction re-alignment at Lanes End, which is to be undertaken at the same time as the completion of the Manor development roadways and footpaths, it has now been agreed that OCC will provide a raised area at the "bus stop" on the eastern side of the junction. Mr Bowden advised that this will not be designed as a crossing point for pedestrians due to the poor visibility towards Burdrop. On the subject of speed monitoring within the village, it was reported that OCC would be obtaining new equipment that will enable them to carry out another survey. On the matter of the gap in the wall on New Road, Mr Bowden has promised action on installing suspended rails as a safety measure. He advised that funds for drain repairs in Main Street have been allocated for the next financial year. Mr Bowden was also asked when the southern verge between Lanes End and Malvern House -would be cleared, and the weed growth removed from the northern verge, and he has confirmed that the work should be carried out in November.

The appeal in the last Sibford Scene for volunteers to carry out a lorry count produced one response up to the date of the meeting (several more have now been received - thank you to those respondents).

The Clerk was asked to enquire about the position with the promised police speed check, and also to chase up Speedwatch again on the provision of speed reduction signs and equipment.

DAVID RANDALL TREE WORK 01608 738109 / 07831 571176 A meeting with members of Sibford Gower Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council was arranged for 3 October to discuss the extension of the burial ground and the administration of the new area.

Following a reminder from Cherwell District Council that registers of interests need to be up to date, the Clerk confirmed that the register for Sibford Ferris Parish Council had been updated during the year. The Chairman reminded Councillors to declare any interests in the course of the meeting.

Since the last meeting four planning applications have been received and considered, including the Parish Council's own application for a freestanding noticeboard on the footpath outside Bank Cottage. Notification was received that Ferris Hill Farm has been given planning permission to carry out a recycling operation and construct a new building in which to house it. The routing agreement that prohibits vehicles operating to or from the site from coming through the village, (excluding those requiring access), will apply to the recycling operation.

The Annual Return to 31 March 2005 has been audited. Two issues arising were noted, one of which had been addressed in the previous financial year and was included in the audit as a formality only. The second concerned the recommendation that the Responsible Financial Officer should not also be a Councillor. The meeting therefore agreed to transfer the office of RFO from the Chairman to the Clerk, with immediate effect.







Our speaker for October was a military historian, who has researched the little known auxiliary group of men and women who were formed to be a resistance force should Germany actually land in Britain in the Second World War. The people chosen were occupied in ordinary jobs in country villages and towns and were will-

ing to 'disappear' if we were invaded, and were told that their life expectancy, once that had happened, would be about two weeks.

The men were trained at Coleshill House which was a large country house situated in large grounds near Uffington. There they met the other members of their cell, about 10-12 men and were trained to use weapons, carry out sabotage and use any terrorist method possible to cause maximum disruption. Canadian Army Engineers built deep underground hides for each cell, which were positioned in woods or scrub, with an entrance and escape tunnel and were equipped with bunks, cooking and lavatory facilities.

Training for the women was carried out at a nearby country house and their job was to carry messages, listen and report any useful information, often working in bars or on buses.

Everyone had to sign the Official Secrets Act and even their families were not to be told what they were doing and they had to make up stories of where they were each weekend whilst they were training and living in their hideouts. Some wives thought husbands were having affairs in the next village with these unexplained absences! Even at the end of the war, their story was not told and all they received from the Government was a letter of thanks. A really fascinating story and one which will be told on TV in the New Year.

Mr. Sutherland will talk on a local family, the Lucy's of Charlcote and their Grand Tours of Europe, in the Village Hall on Thursday, 17 November at 8.00pm. Non-members of the Society are very welcome to join the members for an interesting evening.


