Nature Notes

Sept. 21st. While on a visit to see our granddaughter we went for a walk along the tops each side of Cheddar Gorge. Early in the walk we saw roe deer and after making our way down to cross the road just above the rocky part of the gorge, we had a steep climb to the top again where we came on the herd of goats that graze the gorge sides. Most of them seemed reasonably tame although two billies were fighting with noisy crashes of their huge horns a little way from the main herd. In spite of grazing by the goats there was still quite a selection of wild flowers to be seen including vervain, wild basil, wood sage, burnet saxifrage, harebell, salad burnet and a lot of devilsbit scabious which I have always associated with damper places. By the mix of plants I would think the soil is very variable.

Sept. 23rd. Today's Daily Telegraph tells of the amazing migration flight of a bar tailed godwit which was fitted with a satellite tracking device. After feeding so well that she doubled her body weight she set off from mudflats on the Kuskokwim River in Alaska to fly south and flapping her wings all the way flew for eight days and nights at heights of up to 6,500 feet finally touching down at the mouth of the Piako River 40 miles south of Aukland, New Zealand, which was a non-stop journey of 7,270 miles without food. New Zealanders had been following her progress and the bells of Christchurch Cathedral were rung when her arrival had been confirmed. I expect bar tailed godwits have always made such flights but it takes a flight recorder to prove it.

Oct. 4th. A beautiful sunny day so we got our bicycles out and while pushing up Mill Hill saw a dog rose with red hips but also one branch with 11 roses in full bloom. There were also knapweed and field scabious apparently enjoying the sunshine.

Sibford Ferris Parish Council is delighted to announce the completion of the newly refurbished play area which was formally opened last Friday. The new equipment is being well used already and we hope that more children will discover it and enjoy it in the coming months.

There are many people to thank for their assistance in bringing this project about. It would not have been possible without the commuted sum set aside for play facilities as part of the planning permission to convert the Sibford School Manor site into homes. We are also grateful to SITA Trust UK Ltd for their generous grant of £5575 which paid for the playhouse, junior and cradle swings, two springies, three seats and the litter bin. SITA Trust provides funding through the Landfill Communities Fund. Funding is available for community and environmental groups to carry out a range of improvement projects.

Sibford W.I. Meeting - Tuesday,9th October 2007



The President welcomed one guest, Virginia, from Santa Barbara USA, who is currently staying at Hook Norton. She was also delighted to announce that Valerie and Carol, who have been past guests, have now decided to become members. On 25th September, four members went to

the Celebrity Evening in Oxford to hear a talk by Ben Fogle. Seen in many different roles on TV, he has travelled extensively and taken part in some strenuous sporting activities. On this occasion, he concentrated on his epic Atlantic rowing race covering 2,930 miles which he shared with James Cracknell and which they won in January 2006.

Sibford W.I. will host the Group Meeting on 25th October and detailed arrangements were discussed. Christine Harper will entertain the meeting with her live owls.

Our speaker this month was Alistair Lack who came to tell us about the History of Oxford and its University. There is evidence of Stone Age and Iron Age people in Oxford attracted to the site by its position between three rivers – the Thames, the Isis and the Cherwell and long before the Romans, some five hundred years before the establishment of the University, Oxford was a thriving place. After the Romans we have the Saxons who built the town on a Grid System and, amazingly, only two new roads have been added in the last two thousand years. The town was surrounded by a wall to keep out the Danes and there were four gates. Christianity arrived at about the same time and Oxford's St Fridewides established a Priory in the year 700. King Alfred had a Manor House in the town and many important meetings were held in Oxford long before London became a venue and even

before 1066 St Michaels, Northgate was attracting scholars from all over Europe. With the coming of the Normans, Oxford altered greatly, many important people moved in and many religious organisations thrived. In 1221, the Pope said "yes" to a University at Oxford and by 1222 Oxford was the third most important city after London and York. The University has always been made up of

many Colleges and today there are thirty nine of them. Sadly though, as the University grew so the city declined and became a dormitory for the students. Up until 1820, the University controlled all prices in the City and-acted as the Court. The City was a retreat for Charles 1 in the Civil War and became a garrison for three years, which is why so many battles were fought in the area. Oxford was not bombarded as many Parliamentarians had been to its University and didn't want the beautiful buildings destroyed - so Oxford was spared. It was spared again in the Second World War as Hitler planned to make it his ceremonial centre with London as his administrative centre. After the Civil War many beautiful buildings were erected and in Victorian times educational brilliance was established. Dons were allowed to marry and no longer needed to be clergymen and the first women's -Colleges were established. Oxford now has one hundred and thirty thousand inhabitants, Oxford and Brookes Universities provide thirty five thousand jobs and there are eighteen thousand -students and twelve thousand undergraduates. Students come from one hundred and forty three countries and the greatest change in recent times is that two out of three graduates come from abroad. Money is a big influence and science is now becoming more important than humanities - though this debate still goes on. Alistair was warmly thanked by Kathleen Winter.
