Nature Notes

Jan 23rd. I crumbled a home made bird bun on to the bird table and was surprised to see a nuthatch come several times to take pieces away in preference to the nuts or sunflower seed.

Jan 31st. The gritting lorry put an extra heavy salting on the Sibford roads this evening which will no doubt help traffic movement if we get the snow that is forecast but I wonder what the effect on the streams will be if we get a prolonged period of snow. We have never had a really long snowy winter since we started using salt on the roads.

Feb 6th. It is not easy to get an accurate measurement of rainfall when it falls as snow. This morning the gauge was hidden under a mound of snow. I sometimes resort to measuring the depth of new snow and estimate it on the basis of 10 of snow to 1 of rain. Even with this heavy snow cover the badgers still bulldoze it away so they can dig the lawn up for worms etc. on most nights. The lawn is going to look pretty rough when the snow has melted. The squirrels also are still chasing along the snow covered branches at their usual mad speed.

Feb 9th. I don't know what the song thrush had to sing about this morning with snow over all and more forecast but he cheered me up. Feb 10th On this cold but sunny afternoon a blackbird felt perky enough to practice a few notes which is unusual in February. Feb 12th. At 21F (-6C) this is a very cold day even for the winter and being very still it is probably a good deal colder in the valleys. This morning two mistle thrushes have joined the blackbirds and fieldfares to feed on the apples that we put out for them.

Feb 17th Milder now but it will take a few days to clear the snow completely. At it's deepest there was nearly a foot of lying snow but never enough wind for much drifting.

In March 2004, Sibford Village Pond was full to overflowing with mating frogs. However, since then the numbers have declined dramatically each year and in 2007 only eight pairs were spotted and in 2008 only two pairs were seen. On talking with people in this corner of Sibford Gower, I learned that the Primary School pond and private garden ponds had followed

the same pattern. However, in other villages, such as Epwell, ponds

had been visited by the usual number of frogs. This is a curious situation, indeed, and the question is will there be any frogs around our pond this March? Motorists and pedestrians, please watch out and avoid running over or stepping on any that may appear.


Take a moment to think: "Have I left plenty of room for a large vehicle to get through?"


You may say to yourself you will "only be a minute" but you

In April we are organizing an Easter Egg Hunt on Good Friday. More details in the next Sibford Scene.


