### Nature Notes

Feb. 25th The rookery in Sibford Ferris is now a hive of activity particularly in the mornings when the rooks are all busily snapping twigs for building or refurbishing their nests from several different kinds of tree. They always seem to go for live twigs rather than doing it the easy way by using rotten ones. One has extended the rookery by building a nest in a silver birch which is unusual and looks precarious but has not blown down yet.

Mar. 2nd I have seen my first queen bumblebee of the year. It is a bit later

Mar. 12th Both male and female blackcaps have made occasional visits to our bird table over the last few weeks. They each came at different times to-day.

Mar. 13th We have been keeping an eye on several ponds for any sign of frogs or newts but have not yet seen any. One of the rooks in the Ferris rookery has a high pitched squeaky voice which can be a bit trying when it goes on for a long time. Last year I thought it must be the cry of a young bird, but if it was, it has not grown out of it. While the branches were being cut off a rotten willow tree near us a queen hornet was disturbed and was crawling on a piece of bark. We put it among the stack of rotten logs where we thought it would have the best chance of surviving until summer comes.

Mar. 14th Today I was told by friends from Epwell that during the cold snowy weather a buzzard came down into their garden a took a dove, presumably a collared dove. They said that being so close to the house it looked huge. I always think of buzzards feeding on carrion and young rabbits when they have young of their own to feed, but they obviously take live birds when pressed. A cock pheasant seems to spend its time visiting all the houses round here that put out birdfood. It normally walks all the way probably because so much food is making it a bit heavy for flying, although it took off well enough when a cat that had been feigning disinterest suddenly rushed at him.

Mar. 15th It was warm enough today to bring a few brimstone butterflies out of hibernation.

Mar. 16th We now have a few frogs and a bit of spawn in our garden pond. I hope the frogspawn fares better than last year when it hatched but the tadpoles soon disappeared. I have also seen two newts which is two more than we saw last year.

Mar. 20th We are now seeing a few bats with this run of fine evenings.


mean that work on cataloguing the precious Village Archive can continue.

After the official business of the evening was completed, Keith Hicks presented a video he had made with Graham Piercey of the conservation work Graham had carried out at Little London in Sibford Ferris. Graham bought the cottage realising that a great deal needed to be done and over the years carried out most of the work on his own. Among all the careful attention to detail, he sourced elm to replace timbers and doors, preparing the wood without modern tools. He opened up huge fireplaces and repaired unsound walls, finding an Elizabethan coin, dated 1572 under a stone, which dates the oldest part of the cottage to around that time. Little London now has a new owner, who came to tell us how much she cares for this ancient build-

ing and showed photos of the kitchen she has created in the former garage and the beautiful productive garden she is making.

Our next meeting will be on 16 April in the Village Hall at 8.00pm, when Frank Johnson will talk about the Arts and Crafts work carried out in Chipping Campden in the early 1900's and the legacy it has left in the area today.

### Life Drawing Classes

Following the success of recent taster classes, Sibford School is to run an eight-week life drawing course.

Led by Beccy Roberts, the course will cover all aspects including: basic drawing skills; simple anatomy; form and structure of the human body; perspective drawing; tonal drawing; light and shade; simple colour theory; colour mixing and blending; picture composition and appreciation; and experimentation with different media.

Cost for those enrolling on the whole course is £52 for adults and £35 for students (14 years and over) and includes basic materials, live models and refreshments. For those unable to attend the full course, the cost will be £7.50/£5 per session.

Classes will run from 6.30pm – 8.30pm in the Nicholas Cann Studio commencing Monday 20th April. Subsequent sessions will take place on Monday 27th April, Monday 11th May, Monday 18th May, Monday 1st June, Monday 8th June, Monday 15th June, Monday 22nd June.

### Something NEW in Sibford Stores


Many of you have commented on the "cardboard box" which has appeared just behind the door in the shop but after Monday 23rd March all will be revealed.....literally.

Twenty members attended. President Glennis Hardman gave special welcomes to Caroline Jennings (rejoined as a member after repatriation from Hong Kong and having flown into the UK only hours earlier!), Eleanor Joynes (a new member) and Sue Court (guest). Glennis introduced Alisaru Lack who was contracted and the court of the court has a transfer to tall us about his 'Travels with making a welcome return visit to tell us about his 'Travels with

Auntie'. Happily, he was not proposing to talk about some footloose, wandering favourite member of the family; instead he was going to share with us his memories and experiences of his long career as a presenter, producer and director in the BBC. This began in 1971 when he joined the BBC World Service which had been created in the early 1930s as a link between English speaking countries and at that time was called the Empire Service. However, in the late 1930s the British Government was worried by the inaccurate and potentially dangerous radio broadcasts from Abyssinia made at the behest of the Italian dictator, Mussolini, portraying the British as warmongers. As a result of discussions with the Government, the BBC replaced the Empire Service with an Arab Service and successfully counteracted the propaganda by broadcasting factual and accurate information. When war was declared in 1939, the World Service continued to keep peoples throughout the world informed by its factual reporting, including our early defeats and, later on, our victories. Many leaders of occupied countries who had escaped to London, such as the King of Norway, made their way to the BBC World Service on the day that peace was declared to make their first broadcasts to their countries since 1939. After the second World War came the Cold War

during which time the resources of the World Service were concentrated on keeping the East Europeans informed of what was happening on both sides of the Iron Curtain. The high regard throughout the world for the professionalism, integrity and accuracy of BBC World Service is well known and Khofi Anan once said 'the World Service was the BBC's gift to the world'. As a result of his own travels, Alistair Lack was able to give many examples of this. He had reported on the liberation of Berlin. In interviews with Falkland Islanders just after the war they told him how important the World Service had been to them, even though they listened at their peril, He reported from South Africa at the time of the Referendum. When Mrs Ghandi was assassinated in 1984, the British Hindi Service was the first to report it. Terry Waite once said to him that the World Service may not only have saved the lives of hostages but almost as important their sanity. Nelson Mandela, during an interview soon after his release from Robin Island, said that he had kept himself informed of world events by listening to the World Service broadcasts on a tiny transistor. Alistair has covered many of the U.S. Presidential elections and travelled across the U.S. with the candidates. He has also interviewed and accompanied British Prime Ministers from Jim Callaghan to John Major. This talk was full of amusing anecdotes and 'behind the scenes' stories and was much enjoyed by all. Mr Lack was warmly thanked by Greta Baadsgaard.





# A Grand Day Out

A few suggestions for family days out of a historic nature. STEAM Museum - The museum of the Great Western Railway at Swindon. Wiltshire County Council have done a great job of re-fitting one of the GWR engineering buildings with videos of the works, hands on exhibits and games, real steam engines to go on, signals to work etc. Caution it is next to a huge shopping area!

Coventry Transport museum. This one is free and looks at the manufacturing of transport from bicycles through cars, busses, lorries and fire engines to tractors in and around Coventry. Being in the city centre only 5 minutes walk from the Cathedral makes it a good part of a day out.

The Black Country Living Museum. Further to travel but a great experience for the kids (and the tickets are valid for 12 months). Go down the coal mine and see how it was dug, use the trams and trolley buses which run round the site, have a go on the Victorian fun-fair, buy cakes, fish and chips and a drink in the re-constructed shops and pub. See the black and white silent movies in the Limelight Cinema and watch Black Country craftsmen demonstrating their trades.

For a very different experience take a canal boat trip into the limestone caverns (extra charge but accessible from the museum) and see this flooded underground mine.

Kenilworth Castle is a magnificent Elizabethan ruined castle with the newly restored garden re-laid to its design layout from Queen Elizabeth I's visit. Managed by English Heritage it is free to members and all children are allowed in free.

Report of Sibford Ferris Parish Council Meeting

There was one apology from J Simms and one member of the public attended the meeting. Play Areas Cotswold Close John and Lynne Woodvine were thanked for kindly agreeing to take on the weekly inspections of the equipment at the Cotswold Close Play Area. Thanks also to Bernie Jones for her help in carrying out the inspections previously - much appreciated. A Lamb was thanked for replacing two broken fence posts. There were other minor points which would be addressed by the playground installer when he came back to install additional timbers to one of the walkways. School MUGA Project Due to the complications caused by one body owning equipment and the other insuring it, it had been agreed that the School would apply direct for a Playbuilder Grant towards equipment for half of the MUGA area, which would be designed to encourage free play. The other half would be allocated to a new ball court for which funding would have to be found from other sources. Burial Ground Extension There was no objection to the proposal from Sibford Gower Parish Council that the temporary fence run straight across the new ground from north to south. In response to a suggestion to plant a tree on the new ground, it was generally agreed that space should not be given up for this purpose. Street Lighting The County Council had written to officially propose reducing the number of hours the lights were on and had asked for a reaction to this

Swapshop As there had been no response at all to the appeal for volunteers to run a swapshop, it was decided not to go ahead with this event. Village Website Pages It was reported that a new Cherwell District Council information terminal would be installed in Sibford Stores in the next few days from which residents could access Council services. It would also be possible to put village information on the District Council website if someone could be found to take on the job of data inputting. Signposts It was agreed to ask the County Council to replace the broken wooden signpost by Home Farm. New signpost Enquiries had been made about a new triangle warning sign on the Shutford Road for horseriders, which had been put up by the County Council at the request of a resident. Its effectiveness would be monitored by the County Council. Spring Clean The spring clean took place on 7th March and the good work of all those who took part was much appreciated, with thanks also to Martin Thomas for doing the organising. Water on Hook Norton Road Contact had been made with the Highways following dangerous conditions during the cold weather when the water froze alongside the verge. Clearance work alongside the ditch and digging out the ditch itself has now been completed. The Clerk was also asked to follow up enquiries into the new spring flowing along Main Street.
