#### Nature Notes

Sep 25th. While walking with relatives along the canal towpath near Claydon we came to an old crab apple tree which had a hornets nest in the trunk. I was surprised to see how much activity there was with sometimes as many as 8 or 10 coming or going at the same time. This does not seem to fit with the idea that there are usually about 50 hornets in a nest. Bee keepers are not pleased to see hornets on the increase as bees are on their menu. One of the ones that we saw was carrying quite a big insect that could have been a bee or large fly.


Sep 29th. A friend brought the beautiful caterpillar or the pale tussock moth, also known as the hop dog, for us to see. He found it crawling on the passenger seat after carrying rose clippings in the car.

Oct 1st. A raven was croaking as it cruised around over the Ferris today.

Oct 14th. I am told that there were 5 pairs of buzzards on one big cultivated field adjoining Hill Bottom. They behaved rather like seagulls moving across the field a bit when the tractor came towards them.

Oct 15th. Early this morning there was a flock of about 50 redwings looking for a place to settle in the Ferris.

Oct 17th. After the influx of painted lady butterflies in May I was half expecting big numbers of silver y and humming-bird hawk moths like we saw after the big migration of painted ladies in 1996 but they failed to come. I have only seen one or two silver ys and no humming-bird hawk moths this year.

Summer butterfly records from our new contributor.

May. Guernsey. Record numbers of painted lady butterflies. Common blue and wall also in good numbers.

May 30th. I find that painted lady migration has reached Oxfordshire. I observed them settled on roads in the evening sunshine.

June. Small tortoiseshell numbers have increased after a serious decline over a number of years. Red admiral and speckled wood are doing well but peacock not as prolific. It is an excellent year for meadow brown and gatekeeper plus large, small and green-veined whites.

Sept 16th. Garden record of small and large white, small tortoiseshell, red admiral, comma and speckled wood butterflies.

Oct 4th - 14th. Cotswold Way walk. Red admiral, comma, speckled wood, small and green-veined white, small tortoiseshell, small copper, painted lady, brimstone and peacock butterflies. Also late flowers including common rock rose, betony, harebell, nettle-leaved bellflower, yellow-wort, eyebright, common centaury and sheepsbit scabious. Ivy flowers and warm weather attracting red admirals and painted lady butterflies.

Oct 13th. A late brimstone butterfly in Cotswold Close.

#### Sibford WI. Meeting - 13th October 2009



Two guests were welcomed by President Glennis Hardman - Teresa Forrest (Pesident of Hook Norton WI.) and Daphne Lenton. Glennis Women's reported that a card of condolence had been sent to the family of Margaret Cox who died recently. Margaret was a much valued and long

serving member of Sibford WI. in the past. A congratulatory card was signed by everyone to be sent to Greta Baadsgaard on her 80th birthday. The OFWI coach outing to Bristol was most enjoyable with pleasant weather. The Group Outing to Frogmore House, Windsor was also very successful and another sunny day.

The subject of the speaker, Adrian Williams, was 'Statues and Monuments of London' and he began by telling us that, according to some reference books, London has more statues than any other city throughout the world. He explained that the difference between statues and monuments is that the latter commemorate or celebrate events whilst statues are usually concerned with individuals or animals. For example, the 203ft London Monument by Robert Hook (not Christopher Wren!) was designed to mark the rebirth of London after the Great Fire. Another example is the Cenotaph which commemorates the dead of two World Wars, its name being taken from the Greek words 'kenos taphos' for 'empty tomb'. Statues are often of 'the good and the great' but many more are of our heroes and heroines and it is customary for such statues to be erected only after the death of the subject. Recent additions during the last twenty years have included the Queen Mother, John Betjeman at St. Pancras, Charlie Chaplin and Sir Laurence Olivier. Throughout his talk of some forty minutes, Adrian held our attention by not only his extensive knowledge but also by the excellent photographs and slides from the very comprehensive collection he had built up over the years. Each one was an example of his skills in photography. Nevertheless, he brought his talk to an amusing conclusion by showing us some of his disasters. It was comforting to know that it is not only the amateurs who fall foul of background intrusions such as skyscrapers or merrymakers, lush overgrowing foliage and distorted perspectives. He was thanked by Valerie Taylor for this fascinating insight into London's memorials and invited to judge the day's competition for the best Memento of London. He chose Rosalind Pearlman's entry first, Valerie Taylor's second and Rosemary Neal's third. Mary Hills and Jane Pace served tea with delightful cakes.

On Tuesday, 10<sup>h</sup> November Deborah Paige will be coming to show us how to make attractive decorations for the Christmas season. The competition is for a handmade Christmas card. Visitors most welcome.

Domesday 2010!

Since William the Conqueror's commissioners carried out his great census recording life in England in 1086, life in the English villages has continued to evolve and change until today we find ourselves fortunate enough

to be living in the Sibfords in the 21st century.

However, unless we take time to record what happens in our daily lives future generations will have no reference to life in our current time — what is happening today is tomorrow's history. The Sibfords' Society Archive contains some accounts, written by previous Sibfordians in the late 1800's and during the 1900's which provide us with an invaluable insight into everyday life and work in our village. Members of the Sibfords' Society would like to invite you all to help us make a record of life in a rural village in North Oxfordshire in 2010.

We would like to involve everyone in our community – adults, parents, grandparents, children and all the organisations and groups who meet or worship in the Sibfords to let us know what they do and how they do it. The local economy was largely agriculturally based until the end of the Second World War. The changes just in the last 100 years have been enormous – then the carrier's cart was the only means of getting to Banbury

We plan to collect information anonymously although we would like to record the names of people who currently and publicly serve our community in any way. A simple form delivered to each household and organisation should give us a vast amount of data. On one dedicated and specific day we will also ask everyone to record how they spent their day. This, together with a photographic record of events and occasions during 2010 should give us a fantastic record of life in the Sibfords in 2010. But we can only do it with your help.

We were treated to a fascinating insight into the life of a Town Crier when Graham Sutherland spoke to us at our October meeting. He began as Town Beadle for Warwick; officiating on various Civic occasions. Since becoming a Town Crier he has taken part in competitions, ale drinking ceremonies and travelled the world. Our next meeting will be on 19th November, 8.00 pm in the Village Hall, when Alan Winterburn will talk about "Curiosities in the Cotswolds"
