Nature Notes

March 25th A cat got up a tree by the Hook Norton road and was harassed by crows for 15 minutes or more. It was limited in what it could do to defend itself for fear of falling.

March 28th It is a relief to hear a few more mistle thrushes this year as I was afraid that their numbers were getting dangerously low. I think their nests suffer more than most from predation by crows, magpies and probably squirrels.

March 31st There was heavy snowfall in Scotland yesterday with a train stuck in drifts for some hours. It brings to mind 1952 when, also on March 30th, we had a heavy snowfall that had blown into drifts up to 6 feet deep by the next morning.

April 12th A blackcap has been singing in the garden today and a pair of very smart marsh tits come to the sunflower seed feeder.

April 13th A hen pheasant died when it flew, at some speed, into one of our windows. I still don't understand why birds do this. On this occasion there was no view through and the curtains were drawn.

April 17th It must be several decades since we had a day like this with clear skies not crossed with vapour trails and no sound of aero engines as volcanic dust from Iceland has made it unsafe to fly. When flying was stopped for a while in the U.S.A. at the time of the twin towers disaster it was estimated that, without flying, temperatures would be 2C higher than they are. Scientists may now have a chance to prove or disprove that estimate unless the ash cloud complicates the issue.

April 18th Three swallows were seen at Broomhill Farm today.

April 22nd It is now almost 3 weeks since we had any rain but we have had frequent night frosts. We have seen a good selection of butterflies including comma, red admiral, peacock, brimstone, tortoiseshell that have overwintered and orange tip and speckled wood that have hatched out this spring.

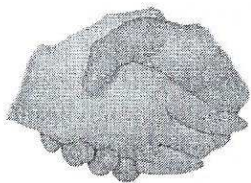

TEN YEARS ON

In June 2000, more than 130 people from the villages staged a pageant depicting the history of our community through 2000 years.

The project had taken more than five years in the planning with lots of fund raising events during the last years of the twentieth century to raise money for this major village event. Staged over three days in June 2000 in a natural amphitheatre on land behind Greenacres belonging to Mr and Mrs Hobson, the production involved horses, sheep, dogs and a wide cross section of villagers who had never acted before. The site is now marked by a tree and a plaque, set into a rock, engraved with the names of all who were involved. Ten years on we are planning to re-visit the Pageant with a celebration in the Village Hall on June 26 with an exhibition, a viewing of the video made at the time (matinee and evening performance) and at the evening performance a Bring and Share Supper. The Matinee will start at 2.15 pm allowing half an hour for visitors to see the famous Millennium Tapestries and other Pageant memorabilia which will be on display. The film will be shown at 2.45 pm with the interval at approximately 3.45 for half an hour when tea and biscuits and soft drinks for children will be provided. The film will end at approximately 5.00 pm. The evening occasion will start at 7.00 pm and the film will be shown at 7.30pm. An interval for a "Bring and Share" cold finger buffet at approximately 8.30pm with film recommencing at 9.15 pm. The performance is expected to finish at 10.00 pm. A small charge of £1.50 to cover the hire of the hall and other expenses will be made for the Matinee tickets and £2.50 for the evening performance with profits going to the Village Hall. For those coming to the Evening performance we ask them to bring enough cold finger buffets for your party together with your own wine. Tickets are available from Keith Hicks (01295 780259) or Norman Nash (01295 780980). We will have limited space at both performances so tickets will not be available on the door.

SIBFORD'S PAGEANT RE-VISITED COME AND ENJOY SIBFORD'S HISTORY

Society members were joined by some guests who had worked for the Aluminium works in Banbury, to hear from Richard Hartree – one of our members, about manufacturing and production at the Alcan factory during the 90 years from 1929 to 2009. The 40 acre site

DESIGNING PRODUCING & FITTING

was purchased in 1929 with support from Banbury Borough Council who were anxious to encourage a major production company to come to Banbury. Production started in 1931 and the company became the major employer in the town until it finally closed its production lines in 2009. Using aluminium imported from Canada, the metal and its alloys were rolled, pressed and

extruded to produce a wide variety of products. Manufacturing was at its height during the Second World War when production was increased five-fold to produce sheet aluminium for aircraft production. A dummy factory was built to shield the main factory, which was camouflaged, from enemy bombing. The 'dummy' received a direct hit and was rapidly repaired to continue its valuable role. During its lifetime the factory was extended and refurbished with modern machinery. New furnaces, lifting gear, rolling mills and presses reduced the need for high levels of manpower and rationalisation programmes were introduced in the 1980's and 1990's. The 'Ally' factory finally closed its gates in 2009 having provided employment and support for its workforce throughout its lifetime.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday 20 May when Martin Greenwood, a well-known local historian, will be returning to speak to us on 'The Roaring Twenties'. All are welcome at 8pm in the village hall.

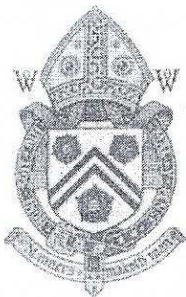

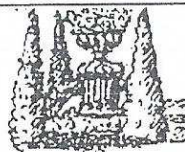

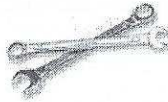

We are very grateful to both and are pleased to say the work has now been completed by Cherwell Windows, without having to cancel any of the bookings.

We have also been awarded a grant of £1,000 from the Doris Field Charitable Trust to help replace all the old crockery in the Hall with matching new crockery, which we are very grateful for. We then purchased 150 each of cups, saucers, tea and dinner plates, together with 54 small bowls and 90 half pint glasses at a cost of £1047.37 and everything has been washed and is in situ.

Not only is it wonderful that we are able to showcase the talents of our pupils alongside those of professional performers, but we also hope that it will provide some excellent entertainment for the community around us.

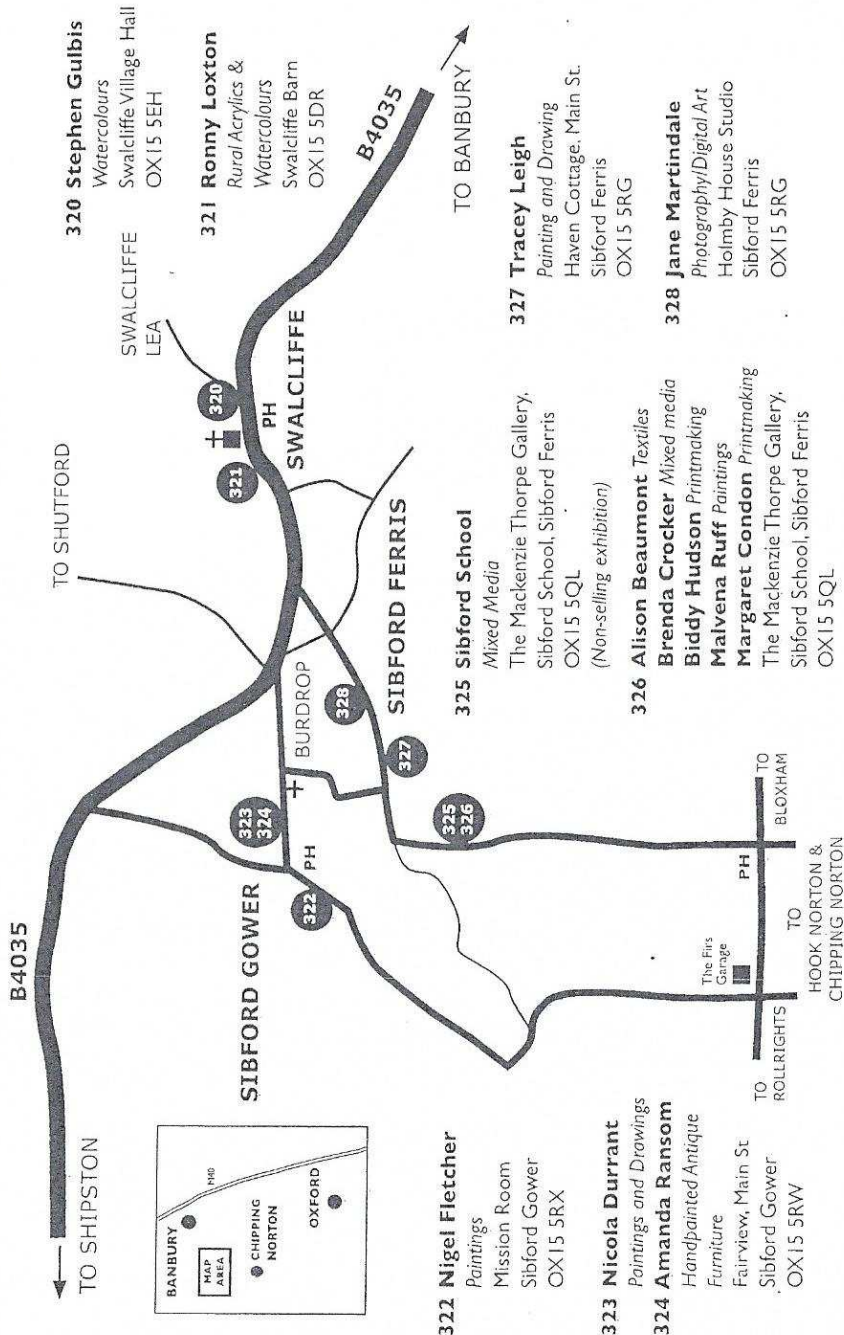

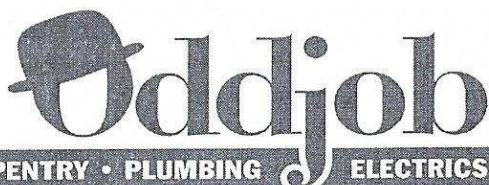

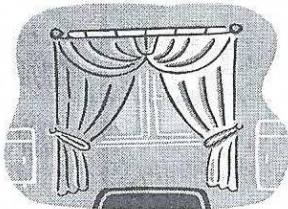
