Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held in Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School on Tuesday, 17th November 2009

Present

Parish Cllrs Peter Abbott, Muriel Chandler, Martin Layer, Oswyn Murray and Robin Spicer (Chairman), County and District Councillor George Reynolds, five Local Electors and the Clerk.

Minutes

It was proposed by Cllr Martin Layer and seconded by Cllr Muriel Chandler that the Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 16th September 2009 be approved as a correct record. The Minutes were then signed by the Chairman.

Matters Arising

Tree removed from Conservation Area

In 19th September 2009, the Clerk called at The Red House, Burdrop and spoke with the owners, Mr & Mrs Priestman, regarding the reporting of a tree removed from their land which is a conservation area. They told him that the tree had blown down in a high wind and the stump sawn in the interest of 'neatness'. They said that they were well aware that this is a conservation area and should the removal of a tree be considered in the future, planning permission would be required.

Mobile Home in car parking area of the Bishop Blaize

Cherwell District Council advised that planning permission is not required because the mobile home houses the owners who are carrying out repairs to the property.

Allotments

Because it had been impossible to find suitable land for allotment use, apart from one space available at the Friends Meeting House, local residents who had expressed interest will be advised accordingly. The Parish Council was advised by the District Council which owns the land adjoining the 'Piggy' path and which the Parish Council had in mind is not now appropriate for allotments (albeit it sustained allotments some years ago). Also, an invitation published in an issue of the Sibford Scene for possible available land brought forward no response.

Forthcoming resignation of Cllr Robin Spicer from his position as Chairman and Parish Councillor

With the departure to Thailand in early December, Cllr Spicer tended his resignation as Chairman. The offer of Vice Chairman Martin Layer to fill the position was unanimously accepted as was the appointment of Cllr Peter Abbott as ice Chairman. The Council's position will be reviewed in May 2010 at the time of the next Parish Council elections.

Robin Spicer has been a Parish Councillor since 26th September 1986 (Chairman since 17th May 1996) and his presence at Meetings and involvement in the community will be greatly missed.

Clerk's Report

The Clerk referred to his attendance, with Cllrs Spicer and Abbott, at the Parish Liaison Meeting held in Bodicote House on 11th November. Minutes of the meeting, when received, will be passed to the members of the Parish Council.

The Council had received information and posters (subsequently displayed) concerning fly tipping. Included were forms to report to the District Council any fly tipping incidents. These are available should they be required,

Also received prior to the Meeting was a letter from the District Council regarding 'Operation of the Ethical Framework – Customer Survey'. This was completed at the Meeting

Financial Matters

Proposed by Cllr Spicer and seconded by Cllr Layer, it was resolved that the following payment be made:-

Cheque No. 98 dated 17th November 2009 in respect of payment of £1029.61 to P B Hardman being the Clerk's salary (six months in arrears) £900.00 and £129.61 reimbursement of the cost of stamps, stationery etc.

Retrospective sanction was given to the payment by cheque No.93 dated 12th June 2009 for £180.00 in favour of Julie Goodlake being the cost of maintaining the Miriam Tebbs' land.

Proposed by Cllr Abbott and seconded by Cllr Murray it was resolved that the following payments be made:-Donations of £100 to the Sibford Scene

Donation of £100 to Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School.

Grant of £300 to Sibford Village Hall (because of her Village Hall connection, Cllr Muriel Chandler took no part so far as the resolution related to this particular item)

Review of the Asset Register, Risks and Councillors' Interests

A review of the Asset Register took place and no changes had occurred since the previous review. With regard to Declaration of Interests, Cllr Chandler declared her interest in the Village Hall in view of her position as Member of the Village Hall Committee. Cllr Murray declared his interest in the Town Estate Charity in view of his position as a Trustee. It was confirmed that there had been no change in the risk situation.

Planning Matters

Cllr Murray expressed his reservations regarding the way in which planning applications are handled. He felt that in addition to Councillors individually examining the plans and expressing a view, discussion and possibly site visits in appropriate cases should take place. This system will now be put in place.

Cllr Layer had prepared a very comprehensive 'Guidance to Parish Councillors when considering Planning Applications' and copies were handed to the other Councillors.

Highway Matters

The attention of the Parish Council had been drawn to the adverse impact of parked cars (usually those of visitors to the urgery) on the grass verge opposite the Doctors' Surgery. In addition to this, the wall of the adjacent property is starting to be affected. Previously, damage to the road nearby had been caused by heavy vehicles and remedial work is promised by Oxfordshire Highways. In view of this latest situation, the Clerk had a site meeting on 5th November with an Oxfordshire Highways Inspector who recommended that two protective posts be installed at a cost to the Parish Council.

At this Council Meeting, this solution was challenged in that the corrective work (and the cost thereof) should be the duty totally of Oxfordshire Highways as the road and the verge are its responsibilities and, indeed, would be any damage to the adjacent wall. The Clerk was instructed to take the matter forward with Oxfordshire Highways.

Footpath Matters

The Clerk advised the Meeting that, as requested by the Parish Council, the kerbs in High Meadow had been dropped at two points to allow wheelchair access.

Regarding the wall at part of the footpath between Backside Lane and Main Street where some stones are dislodged, a site visit was made by the Rights of Way Officer (OCC) who considered that the matter was not serious but that the owners of the property involved should be aware of their responsibility. The Clerk had advised them of this.

At a previous Parish Council Meeting, local residents Lesley and Andrew Bishop had offered to walk the Parish footpaths and highlight any problems. At tonight's Meeting they were present having previously handed to the Clerk a very detailed list and photographs of where remedial work is needed. The Councillors expressed their thanks and gratitude for the time and effort involved and the Clerk was instructed to enter into dialogue with the Rights of Way Officer (OCC).

Burial Ground

The Council is of the opinion that the way forward is to divide the area into two parts albeit without a separating fence. One part (for current burial use) is to be the subject of close mowing to present a well maintained appearance and the other half (reserved for future use) is to be mown at appropriate intervals sufficient to keep it looking orderly. The Council was not attracted to suggestions made elsewhere that the reserve part might be allowed to run wild (for various good reasons) or to be put to allotment use. The view of the Council will be conveyed by the Clerk to Sibford Ferris Parish Council.

Churchyard

Sibford Ferris Parish Council has confirmed that it will maintain that part of the Churchyard for which it has accepted esponsibility on a purely voluntary basis. At present, there is no thought of paying someone for work to be carried out. Sibford Gower Parish Council will continue to meet the cost of maintaining that part for which it is responsible.

Public Participation

County and District Cllr George Reynolds spoke briefly of the Cherwell Rural Area Integration Transport and Land Use Study stage two report. In January, the Core Strategy will be looked at by the District Council and information will be passed down to Parish Councils.

Mr Tony Haynes referred to the grass verge at the Surgery end of the Jitty Path which does not get mowed and this is probably because of the wooden protective posts. The Clerk was instructed to speak with Oxfordshire Highways.

Any other Matters

No other matters were raised.

Date of Next Meeting

The next Meeting of the Parish Council will be on 21st January 2010 starting at 8pm in the usual venue – The Staff Room of Sibford Gower Endowed School.

There being no further business to discuss, the Chairman thanked all present for attending and closed the Meeting at 10pm.
