Nature Notes

June 4th I was sorry to see that the bird that we heard hit the window was one of three young great spotted woodpeckers that have been around for the last few days. It hopped away behind some shrubs so hopefully it will recover.

June 5th A pair of wrens that have a nest over our front door have been working from dawn to dusk feeding their brood for some time now. They were still busy at nine o'clock this evening.

June 9th I found the body of a young great spotted woodpecker floating in our garden pond today. It may well be the one that hit the window a few days ago.

June 11th With so many young inexperienced birds around I suppose it is inevitable that there are more window casualties. My son in law tells me that a young nuthatch hit his window. He put it up on a branch away from the cats and it eventually recovered enough to fly away.

June 12th Fortunately the wrens chose lunchtime today to leave their nest which caused great excitement while my son and daughter in law were here. Most of them made their way along under the eaves of our bungalow in full view from the sitting room window, to the safety of the creeper.

June 17th While my daughter was looking round the sheep this afternoon she saw a badger searching among the grass for slugs, worms or whatever else it might find. She watched as it worked its way towards her coming within a few feet and still not seeing her. The direction of the breeze ensured that it would not smell her and I suspect she kept



Sibford Ferris Parish Council Meeting

Held in Sports Hall classroom, Sibford School on Tuesday, 8th June, 2010
MUGA

Chris Franklin advised that the MUGA project was £3,000 short in funding for "add ons" such as seating pods (total cost of 34k previously agreed). The meeting moved to start the project with agreed funding of 2/3rds Parish Council funding and 1/3rd Sibford School funding. Advertising and promotion should be undertaken to raise the extra monies as the project is underway.

Parish Notice board

The Clerk has expressed concerns that it does appear to be a "dumping ground" for all/any comms and business cards. The Clerk agreed to clean up the notice board and clearly map out areas for "Parish Council Notices" and "Public Notices", to ensure that areas for public use are clearly marked out.

Matters arising from the Annual Parish Meeting, 25th May, 2010:

Compostable caddy liners

Discussion at the meeting supported the Chairman speaking to Ramesh in the village shop to establish whether he would be amenable to selling the compostable caddy liners supplied through CDC

Rutland Broadband

Chris Franklin had been contacted by Rutland Telecom re enhanced broadband services on offer in rural locations. However, this would need a large "take up" by parishioners. The Chairman agreed to obtain more information from Rutland Telecom on Broadband, to present at the next PC meeting.

Parish Plan

The meeting discussed again, the requirement for the Parish to develop their own Parish Plan. The Chair explained that this was particularly in light of the Cherwell District Council "Draft Core Strategy for Housing" that had been reviewed earlier this year. All Parish Council members were asked to consider a person/name in the local community who could pick up the mantle of managing the production of a Parish Plan.

Village street lighting

Local parishioners had requested – via John Simms - that some village lighting should stay on at all times.

The light at the top of Shelter Lane and 2 lights within Cotswold Close are those affected.

Hello from Thailand - Diary of events

We have finished School on the 15th March for 9 weeks holiday as this is the hottest time of the year the temperature is around 40c+ every day.

March 6th Buddha day - with a parade around the village so we went along to see what happened. We were not allowed to stand on the side and got pulled into the parade and asked to help carry the banner which was a story about Buddha.

March 12th Another parade but this one is for the head Monk of the temple in the Jungle because he was honoured by the King, again dancing around the streets. Robin is very good at dancing with the Ladies of the Village.

March 23&24th We have been invited by the School to go to the sea side with them so we said we would love to go, please just remember that we are 5 hours away from Bangkok and the sea is a further 2 hours from there, so we left on Tuesday evening around 11.00pm to travel over night arriving there around 7.00am. We were then taken to the Marine University for breakfast and then to the sea for 9.00am, we were fed and watered the whole time we were there and we were bought a shirt each. We saw most of the journey home and we came up over a mountain and the views were fantastic. They call that part of Thailand their little Switzerland. We arrived home at 10.30pm.

April 1st We went down to Bangkok for Easter by coach which takes us 5 hours with only one stop.

April 3rd We went shopping at the Siam Paragon but not for long as the Red Shirts decided to hold a rally out side so it was closed and remained closed the whole time we were there. April 4th Easter Sunday we went to Christ Church for Easter service at 10.00am there was about 500 people.

April 13-15th Thai New Year or Song-Grahn (Water Festival). We had to get up at 5.30am to go and give food to the Monks, then during the morning if you were unlucky you got wet as people threw water at you. In the afternoon we had to go back to the pond for a blessing by the monks and wish all the older members of the village a happy Song -Grahn (you tipped a small amount of water into their hands). After that it was dancing around the streets and getting very wet but it was warm water as the Temperature was 40c+ so the water is always warm. They put wet powder on your face so you ended up with white faces ,we gave up at 6.00pm . The festival lasts for 3 days with more parades and dancing .

We have had some thunder storms and heavy rain and the rainy season should start in May so we are looking forward to this and the temperature cooling down..
