Nature Notes

May 23rd. A badger has dug out yet another bumble bees' nest from our wildflower plot. It is the third one that they have destroyed this summer.

May 26th. The first hornet I have seen this year was buzzing round the greenhouse this morning. They are really quite beautiful and noisy creatures.

May 27th. Some of our family have been on holiday in Suffolk where they saw 63 different sorts of birds including a great crested grebe that was swimming in the sea. They also heard nightingales and nightjars. I expect the high bird count comes from being near so many different habitats like reedbeds, patches of moorland where they saw dartford warblers, fresh water reserves and of course the sea.

June 1st. I am pleased to hear that a flycatcher has been seen in Sibford Ferris. I was wondering whether any were going to come this year. June 6th. We came across a cluster of well grown caterpillars of the peacock butterfly on some nettles near Woodway Road. I have plenty of nettles in the garden but I have never seen any caterpillars on them so I have cut some of them down in the hope that the young re-growth will attract the later butterflies.

June 13th. The flycatcher is still being seen in the same area so it is likely to be nesting nearby.

Jun 16th. We have not seen many young birds around but I have picked up several dead ones some of them very young. However we now have a family of great tits and some young robins coming to the bird table.

The President, Glennis Hardman, then introduced Renata Calverley who had come to talk about her memories as a small child during the German occupation of Poland. Perhaps some of us who had been around during those war years wondered if we really wanted to rekindle our own memories. However, with her quiet, humorous, vividly descriptive style Renata was soon holding the attention of everyone. What is more, she told her story without anger, blame, bitterness or recrimination. Born in 1937, Renata lived in a southern Polish town with her Jewish parents and grandmother whilst several aunts, uncles and cousins lived around and about. Her father was a doctor, her mother a teacher and during the day she was cared for by her much loved grandmother and her Roman Catholic nanny. However, this secure and happy life was ended by the German invasion. Her father left to join the Polish Free Forces there were orders for the extermination of all Jews below the age of 16 and over 60 - one of her uncles and two of her male cousins were executed - her family had been evicted from their home, their possessions confiscated. Renata was "rejected" by the German soldiers during one of the purges- it is thought this was because with her blonde hair and very fair skin she did not look like a Jew. Her mother and grandmother were ordered to work in factories; one working during the night the other during the day so that Renata could be cared for and hidden at all times. Within the next months first her grandmother and then her mother were taken away and Renata was alone in the flat without food and warmth. Fortunately her Nanny heard what had happened and two days later came for her, smuggling her out under her skirts to safety! The next years were spent hiding and being moved from one safe place to another. She spent unhappy times in a Roman Catholic orphanage where she lived on a diet of porridge-like gruel, coffee made with acorns. She narrowly escaped being sent for adoption by a German family as part of Hitler's plan to breed a superior Aryan race (this time her blonde appearance was almost her downfall). At the end of the war with the exception of one aunt all her family had perished. And then - a letter

was received from her father who was based at a hospital in Scotland and seeking news of his family! Eventually she was reunited with him in England where she grew up, attended University, has been happily married for 50-odd years, has two daughters, one of whom is a Church of England vicar! She is also very proud of



her British passport. The remarkable story of a remarkable woman.

Dear residents of Sibford Ferris, Sibford Gower and Burdrop

I am a 12 year old pupil in Year 7 at Sibford School (and the granddaughter of village residents Mary and Bryan Mills). I would like to raise money to purchase a life saving defibrillator, which would be kept at the school and can be used throughout the community and the Sibford villages and, being passionate about swimming, I would also like to raise money to install starting blocks in the school swimming pool.

I am going to raise money by swimming the equivalent of the English Channel in the pool. This is 22 miles (or 35.2km) and is 1408 lengths. I would do it in 4 sessions - 352 lengths each time.

The defibrillator is a life saving machine that is important to have in our community, as Sibford is several miles from the nearest hospital. It is considered that the sports hall/swimming pool at the school would be the best place to keep the defibrillator, as this is where some of the most strenuous activity happens.

The starting blocks and defibrillator cost around £5000 added together so I'd be very grateful if the community could consider sponsoring me to "Swim the Channel". Cheques (payable to Sibford School Foundation) can be sent to Ali Bromhall, Community Development Officer at Sibford School indicating that the money is for the channel swim.

My first session is taking place at Sibford School pool on Open Day. A further three sessions will then take place during the following three weeks. I would love it if Sibford and Burdrop residents were able to support me.

Sibford Ferris and Gower's new waste and recycling collection day will be a Wednesday from the week commencing 1st August.

Following a review of household waste and recycling collection rounds, Cherwell District Council has made changes to collection day's. Around 40% of the district will have a new collection day for their refuse, recycling, food and garden waste. By making the collection rounds more efficient, the Council will save at least £10,000 on fuel per year and significantly lower its carbon footprint.

Cherwell aims to make these necessary changes as customer friendly as possible. Cherwell will be sending residents a letter and putting stickers on household bins to remind them of the day change.

The Meeting was the Annual Parish Council Meeting. The Members were pleased that Cllr Oswyn Murray and Cllr Peter Abbott agreed to continue in their roles as Chairman and Vice Chairman. Sibford Gower Village Pond: Matters are progressing with regard to the Parish Council's intention to establish ownership in the light of the fact that searches had revealed that there is no registered owner. Holy Trinity Churchyard: A meeting is to be arranged between representatives of both the Ferris and the Gower Parish Councils and the Parochial Church Council to come to a mutually agreed arrangement regarding future maintenance. Land adjoining the 'Piggy Path' that connects Acre Ditch and Burdrop Hill: The intention is to approach Cherwell District Council to ascertain whether it may be prepared to 'gift' the land, which it owns, to the Parish Council which can then find a usage for it. Conservation Area: Contact is to be made with Cherwell District Council in an attempt to establish the current timetable for the review of the Conservation Area of Sibford Gower and Burdrop. Speeding: Concern was expressed at the previous Parish Council Meeting about the speed of cars along Pound Lane and through Burdrop. Thames Valley Police has suggested that a volunteer group be set up (with prior police training) to record, with equipment provided, the actual speeds observed. The matter has been referred to the appropriate Group set up within the Sibfords Community Plan. Sibfords Community Plan: Mrs Sue Mattinson presented an update. Residents are kept well advised of progress by the news letters which are regularly delivered to each household. The Chairman thanked Mrs Mattinson for her report and for all that she does in connection with the Sibfords Community Plan. Financial: The Council approved the Receipts and Payments Account for the financial year ended 31st March 2011 and thanks were expressed to Mr David Soden for carrying out the duties of

Independent Examiner. The Council also approved the Annual Return to the External Auditors and here again gratitude was extended to Mr David Soden for his role of Internal Auditor. Planning Matters: Since the previous Meeting, the Council had considered and approved four planning applications and eight planning decisions had been received from Cherwell District Council. Footpath Matters: The Clerk reported that a collapsed stone wall along the path from Main Street to Backside Lane, Sibford Gower had been repaired. Public Participation: A resident in attendance at the Meeting enquired as to whether, once the Village Pond is registered in name of the Parish Council, the Council's permission would be needed for anything that may be carried out in connection with the pond. The Chairman confirmed that this would be the case. There being no further business to discuss, the Chairman closed the Meeting at 9.26pm after thanking all present for attending.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be on Wednesday, 21st September 2011 starting at 8pm in the same venue – the Staff Room of Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School.

Field headlands, Subsidies and Dog Walkers

Many fields in the parishes have six metre wide grass margins around the crops which are subsidised by tax payers under the Environmental Stewardship Schemes. The purpose of these headlands is to provide wild life habitats between the cultivated areas, particularly as a refuge for insects and ground dwelling birds such as partridge. Unfortunately the value of these areas is totally lost as soon as they become routes for dog walks. A dog snuffling along the base of a hedge will disturb every sort of wild life from the beetles and mice up to the birds above. The result is that what is being paid for as an environmental benefit is undoubtedly a lot worse for wildlife than it was before the headland was established, at least then the hedge base was undisturbed.

I would encourage all dog walkers to follow the public rights of way and stop taking the approach that wherever there is a grass margin there is a dog walk, then we may start to see a few partridges in the area again.


