

## Sibford Ferris and Sibford Gower and Burdrop Conservation Areas review.

Sibford Ferris Conservation Area was first designated in November 1985 and covers the older part of the village. The conservation area is now being reviewed and an appraisal document is being produced on the back of this work. Sibford Gower and Burdrop were similarly designated in January 2008; the conservation area is also in the process of being reviewed.

The character and appearance of the villages is created by the collective presence of everyday buildings from a mixture of periods. The buildings of Sibford Ferris, Sibford Gower and Burdrop are not only a social record but contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

Designation aims to preserve and enhance the best of the past while allowing sympathetic, high-standard development in the future.
