#### Nature Notes


Oct 27th. People are telling me that springs are running very low, which is not surprising as the spring and early summer were very dry and although we have had useful rains to get the autumn crops growing, they have not amounted to enough to get the drains running, and with springs around here, it takes as much as six months after the first big rain before the flow increases.

Nov 3rd. A friend who has a lot of nest boxes of various types cleans the old nests out in the autumn. He found that only about half as many as last year had been used for nesting.

Nov 4th A heron settled on our lawn for a few minutes this morning. I suppose it must have been looking to see if there were any fish in the pond, but did not inspect it closely.

Nov 5th It was probably the same heron that settled briefly on the lawn this morning. This time only yards from the house.

Nov 6th. Some ravens have been around Sibford Ferris for several days. Today one of them flew quite low over the garden croaking as it went. Nov 7th. A heron came again but only just touched down and went away again. If it is the same bird it seems to be getting less confident.

Sibford WI Meeting – 8th November 2011
President Glennis Hardman welcomed twenty members.
Mary Hill deputised as secretary in the absence of Lynda Conway.

A glimpse of our speaker Nicolas Clark's curriculum vitae would reyeal he has worked in the wine trade, that he is an ex-army man and a retired school teacher. He is fluent in French and Spanish as well as two or three African languages including Swahili. It might also reveal that he enjoys food and wine, taking photographs of odd foreign road signs, supporting one or two overseas charities and travelling in foreign parts, a pastime shared with his wife with whom he recently celebrated his golden wedding. This love of travelling was probably why a few months ago they joined up with of some 30 other travellers in Chile to begin a 3,800 mile trip across the Andes. This would be undertaken travelling on national bus services with a guide, staying each night in whatever local B&B accommodation was available. They would make their own arrangements for all other meals. Their starting point was Santiago, capital of Chile, from where they travelled north along the coast and then east to cross one of the driest deserts in the world, the Atamaco. However, despite very little rainfall one of its outstanding features is large salt lakes which have been created by rising water through the desert surface. After crossing the Atamaco desert they spent the night in an isolated village which had a population of 2000, where, although there were no restaurants, they were able to eat well in one of the many houses opened by the locals to provide simple food to travellers. The following day they began their climb over the Andes: at 9000ft they felt breathless, at 10,000ft they were left gasping by the effort of joining the dancing at a local "fiesta" and at 12,000ft they were bitterly cold. The next morning they descended in to Argentina to stay for a couple of days on a 250,000 acre ranch, riding horses, celebrating his wife's birthday in fine Argentinean wine and visiting one or two sugar cane farms. Before moving on to the next destination, Paraguay, they fitted in a visit to a prehistoric village which included several examples of petroglyph. Once they

had made the border crossing from Argentina into Paraguay the difference between Argentinean wealth and Paraguay's poverty was clearly to be seen. The people and houses were obviously poor, the roads neglected in many areas, and taxis were simple horse-drawn



carts. But the people were happy, friendly, and hospitable. The ancient capital city, Ascucion, founded in 1537 is known in South America as the mother of cities. During their visit the group travelled to the UNESCO World Heritage site of Parana and also to the Iguaza Falls which have been voted to be one of the seven natural wonders of the world. By this time they were nearing the end of the trip and they crossed into Brazil to spend some time in Rio de Janeiro visiting its unusual and striking cathedral as well as the football stadium which can accommodate approximately 130,000 – although it has been known to hold over 150,000 official and unofficial fans! This interesting, amusing and knowledgeable talk by Nicolas Clark, enhanced by some excellent and often funny photographs, held the attention of us all and we definitely agreed that Joan Thomas's enthusiastic vote of thanks was well deserved.

The well supported competition was judged by Mr Clark and his first choice went to Joan Thomas, second Eleanor Joynes and third to Valerie Taylor. Then followed tea with delicious cheese scones and cakes prepared and served by Jan Warner and Kathleen Winter.







Firstly many thanks for all the calls and cards wishing us well on our move to France. It was very tough leaving the Sibfords, such a nice place and such nice people, but here we are in an ancient cottage (c1100) in the Limousin, a very rural part of France. If you feel the need to see where we are, draw a triangle between Poitiers, Limoges ans Angouleme, put a cross in the middle and you've got us. Nearest towns of note are Bellac and Confolens. The French think of this area as a backwater of France. The fact is, it's very old world French, very formal, lots of "Bonjour Madame et Monsieur" lots of handshakes. In fact you could meet the same person three times a day and shake hands every time as though you're a long lost friend! It's nice. The countryside is beautiful, a bit like English countryside must have looked like 200 years ago. Why move to France? Because we've been visiting our holiday home here for years off and on and we love it. The bread is fantastic, the butchers have real skill, the markets are great, the French are fastidious about food and we enjoy watching them prod, poke and demand information on everything from dried beans and vegetables through cheese to the best and worst cuts of beef and then to top it all the French Sunday lunch is a real family event and as such is unmissable. Allied to all that is a real sense of Toytown in the local, rural communes, each of which has a mayor, elected in the correct fashion, who rules his commune and relies on reams and reams of paperwork to justify his position and the importance of his commune compared to surrounding communes. It's a hoot. The hedgerows and roadside ditches get cut several times a year, roads get maintained and everything is kept up to snuff. The local village and centre of our commune, Bussiere-Boffy, is kept clean and tidy and they even employ someone to run the village shop and cafe to maintain a sense of village unity.

Our house is in a small hamlet. It's a two up two down hovel with an attached goat shed which we have converted into a wet room and a small utility area. Utility areas are "so very, very must have," as we learnt to our cost when trying to sell Stickleys! We also have a large barn for putting things in. We've an acre or so of land, lots of nice trees and a winding stream that runs the length of the property. For most of the year the stream is dry as a bone but come December, the rains come and it's a torrent, so it's worth keeping it clear otherwise we risk being flooded. We're surrounded by oak woodland and lakes, good for walks. Not so far away are Monts de Blond, a collection of steepish hills where wild boar hang out.

A retired farmer owns a plot at the bottom of the hamlet and there is a horse riding operation run by another local resident who also rents teepees and yurts in the summer. Townies come and live in the camps tp 'get back to nature' and 'relate, man'. In the surrounding woods there are hippies who are here most of the year, with lots of drumming at night, very Hiawatha. A couple of years ago we came across a sign in the woods that said "Wizard" but sadly he's been magiced off somewhere, probably back to his day job in Limoges! An English couiple live in the house opposite us and the other houses in the hamlet are owned by Dutch or Parieians who use them

Our aspect is very rural, but so much noise, what with autumnal leaves crashing to the ground and the constant birdsong. Someone should do something about it! In fact we can rely on the local chasse (hunters) to deal with the birdsong as they do their best at the weekends to kill everything that moves, which is not so cool, but, because the chasse sets out for each hunt with loads of booze, after a very short time nothing gets hit and everything returns to normal, although their guns continue to bang away 'til lunchtime. Its a 'man thing' apparently. We also have this remarkable event which happens every evening during the Autumn. Starlings have adopted a tree in the woods nearby as their roost, as a sort of gathering place before they go to wherever starlings go for the winter. So every evening they gather in huge numbers and do that starling thing, swooping hither and yon, always in formation, flights leaving and returning to the main flock. It's fantastic to see, and then, suddenly, that's it, they all dive into this single tree, have a bit of a chatter for a time: "All right?" "Yea, not bad, went to Bellac, it's market day, so I took the wife and kids" "Any good?" "fine, but it was raining so everything was a bit soggy but on the whole..." and then silence. And here is the amazing thing; normally, the starlings start swooping at around 18.00 but when the clocks went back at the end of October they started at 17.00 and none of them wear watches!

Looking forward, we are planning to move to a larger house in the south, more sun, shorter winters and less rain, but that's all in the not too distant future. In the meantime, should any Sibfordians be passing by on their way south and need a cup of tea or a bed for the night they are very welcome to drop by, though best to call first to make sure we have room. First come first served

As sad as it was to leave all our friends and neighbours and our much loved house, we're having a wonderful time, we've shaken up the status quo in our lives which was the plan, we have more plans for the future and everything if fine!

#### YOUNG PEOPLE TO HAVE THEIR SAY ON NEW VILLAGE FACILITY


Earlier this year Sibford Ferris Parish Council, in conjunction with Sibford School, opened a new multi-use games area.

Our Remembrance Day service took place on Sunday 13th November and a large number attended from the village with representatives of the uniformed organisations, the Scouts, Cubs and Beavers in uniform with their banners. It was a beautiful sunny November morning and the service started round the War Memorial in the Churchyard at 10.55 am. It was lead by Rev John Tattersall who had redesigned the service in conformity with up to date guidance from the Diocese. After prayers for the fallen the names of those from our own village were read out by name: From Burdrop, Sibford Ferris and Sibford Gower killed in the first World War 1914-1918: Harry Lines, David Wade, William Webb, Thomas Dyer, Horace Hawtin, Arthur Haynes, William Barton, George Bodfish, Thomas Borsberry and in the second World War 1939-1945 Archie Kaye, Hugh Oddie. Also those crewmen of the RAF Wellington bomber from Morton-in-Marsh killed when their aircraft crashed on Pitch Hill: Kenneth Watson, James Hubbard, Edwin Medder, Christopher Tierney. Before and after the two minutes silence, the Last Post and Reveille were sounded by trumpeter Tony Chittock and wreaths were laid by Max Berger on behalf of the uniformed organisations and Roger Alder for the Paris Councils of Gower and Ferris. At the service afterwards in church, the lessons were read by Bruce Petter (formerly Army) and Richard Thomas (formerly RAF). By the time this article is published we shall have held the Christmas Bazaar on Saturday 26th November the organisation of which Amelia Earle has very kindly taken over. This is usually a well supported occasion and is an important element of our annual income.

Brian and Eleanor Joynes will hold a Christmas Coffee Morning in aid of Church Funds on Saturday 10th December from 10.00 am to 12 noon at Silver Birches, Backside Lane, Sibford Gower.

Our Traditional Carol Service led by the Benefice choir, conductor Chris Alexander, is at Sibford on Friday 16th December at 7.00 pm. Followed by mulled wine and mince pies. The Christingle Service will be on Sunday 18th December at 4.30 pm. Other services as listed separately in this magazine.
