#### Nature Notes

Nov 22nd. A mild day and a song thrush is singing.

Dec 2nd By this time last year the birds had already stripped the berries from our holly tree. This year has not been as cold and they are only just starting to take them.

Dec 6th Redwings, blackbirds and pigeons are now stripping the holly berries at a good rate.

Dec 12th There is hardly a berry left on the holly tree and it seems very calm after all the activity of the last 10 days.

Dec 26th Two people have told me that they have seen hedgehogs in the parish this autumn which is encouraging but I fear that it is only a matter of time before badgers find the last few.


Jan 1st. At 19.65 inches (499mm) rainfall in 2011 was well below average. The wettest months were December 2.91ins (74mm) and August 2.45ins (62mm) and the driest was April with 0.33ins (8mm). There was a 9 week period in March/April going in to early May when only two thirds of an inch (17mm) fell and farm and garden crops were suffering. From May through to harvest time there was just about enough to keep crops growing but not to get down deeper causing the springs to run low or in some cases dry up completely. Some of the shallower springs and drains are starting to flow now but it will take a bit longer to get down to the deeper ones.

Jan 7th We have seen up to eight hen pheasants at a time in our garden. There are also four cocks around including an old ring necked one that comes up on to the lawn at my call showing that it is the same one that has come for the last few winters. They seem to collect here more on windy days taking advantage of the protection given by the trees and bushes. Jan 17th With the cold weather fieldfares and redwings have joined the pheasants and blackbirds to feed on the fallen apples. I put out some of the ones that I stored for them today as they have almost finished the fallen ones. At least 4 ravens are still around and seem to be investigating all the bigger conifers in both villages hopefully with a view to nesting.

In some notes written by my grandfather he says that when he was a boy (the 1860's) the grass for hay was still cut by men with scythes and boys used to look for any birds nests that were exposed. The ones that they most commonly found were partridge, quail, lark and landrail or corncrake. It would be a job to find many of them today. I have been reading a diary written by my grandfather while staying at his sons farm a mile or more from Newbold-on-Stour which adjoined the old tramway. This was originally horse drawn where the horse pulled the trucks up the incline and then rode on a platform at the back of the train while it ran down the other side. Many of his walks began or finished along the tramway which had been out of use for some time. During his stay there he found 3 dead barn owls that had been shot and thrown into the bushes on the embankment. One evening he was up on the tramway at dusk and although he was at 73 very deaf he heard a nightingale singing in a bush just by him. It was almost shouting in his ear to make him hear. The entry for 24-3-1929 "I walked this morning to a small wood on the hill where I found large quantities of feathers of fieldfares, lapwing and partridges and also a dead sparrowhawk which had no doubt been shot and was the cause of the heaps of feathers belonging to birds it had previously killed." His son had some sheep grazing on the common which I think from the description of his walks that often crossed it was probably the area marked on the map as Crimscote Down. It was not all grazing land as he went several times to see the

#### Sibford WI Meeting - 10th January 2012



Members were welcomed and wished a Happy New Year by President Glennis Hardman. Names were taken of those wishing to attend future events

including the National AGM which will take place at The Royal Albert Hall on 30th May. Teresa Forrest, a member of Hook Norton WI, put on display an extensive selection of her exquisite embroidery and treated us to a fascinating afternoon as she talked us through each piece of work. By profession, Teresa was an architect and her accuracy and attention to fine detail are reflected in her needlecraft. She told us that her absorbing hobby started in a small way with a pink pig worked in wool on a small off cut of canvas for her god-daughter aged eight. She confessed that she was self-taught with guidance from a manual entitled 'Book of Stitch' sent to her by a friend. Using mainly tent stitch she produced a large cross-section of Stonedyke House, Sherborne in 1993. This she displayed on an attractive stand given to her by her late husband. Then followed a scene of Sherborne High Street and another cross-section of a rectory in Dorset and yet another of the embroidery shop where she purchased her materials. Her love of cross-sections resulted in a beautiful one of her present home in Hook Norton. We were shown samplers of many intricate stitches including tent, continental tent, satin and slit and French knot. Blackwork, using very fine black thread, was used to create a large picture of Sydney Harbour which must surely be Teresa's piece de resistance. She spent long holidays in Sydney and showed us a further interesting scene of a brickworks with very high chimneys. Using wool, she produced a lovely cushion of an Australian desert scene. Back in Oxfordshire, we admired a cushion stitched in all green of a crop circle at the Rollright Stones. Before settling in Hook Norton, Teresa ran a Sewing Guild for four years which was built up to around a thousand members. More recently, she won the Oxfordshire Federation Women's Institute Gold Award 'Let's Celebrate Embroidery Stitches' and, on another occasion, the Silver Salver (Previous Winners' Class) for 'A Book Cover'. Mary Hill gave Teresa a well deserved vote of thanks and then followed many questions with interest continuing over a delicious tea served by Norma Allen and Ann Benham. Teresa judged the competition for a Sampler or An Item of Embroidery. Kathleen Winter was awarded 1st with Rosemary Neal 2nd and Theresa Tovill 3rd. Report of Sibford Gower Parish Council Meeting - 17th January 2012 Chairman's Report:- Sibfords Community Plan: In the absence of Mrs Sue Mattinson, the Chairman read her report which sets out the current situation. Sibford Broadband Usergroup: Mr Paul Hobson and Mr Tony More, who were at the Meeting, have agreed to be involved with looking to find ways of improving Broadband speeds in the area. The Local Plan and The Neighbourhood Plan: These have the Chairman's attention and updates will be provided in due course. The Sibfords Community Plan will, in due course, require adoption by the Parish Council. Conservation Area: Dr Rose Todd (Conservation Officer, Cherwell District Council) and her team are working on a review of the Ferris, Gower and Burdrop conservation areas. Diamond Jubilee: The Chairman proposed, and it was agreed, that a grant of £500 be made in connection with the cost of celebratory events that may be organised. The Clerk was instructed to take matters forward with the Village Hall Committee. Clerk's Report:- Container sited on Conservation Land at Burdrop Hill: The Clerk is still awaiting information from the Enforcement Officer (Cherwell DC) regarding its removal. Speed signs where Burdrop Hill joins the road to Sibford Ferris: There is an extremely short distance between the two where the speed limit is derestricted. The question had been asked as to why. Some time ago, enquiries had been made in this regard and the answer given was that as two parishes are involved it was a technical requirement. The Clerk was instructed to enquire again. Financial:-Prior to the Meeting, the Parish Councillors had considered the Precept request for the next financial year and the sum of £6,250 was considered sufficient to cover all known commitments and give some reserve. Planning Matters:- Since the previous meeting two planning applications had been considered. Village Pond:- Cllr Roger Alder reported on progress made to date with regard to the Parish Council acquiring ownership. One matter that will help is to obtain statements from local residents as to their use and enjoyment of the pond going back some twenty years. An item seeking such information from interested residents will appear shortly in an issue of the Sibford Scene. These statements will be collated by Cllr Alder in his move towards Parish Council ownership. Allotments:- In the knowledge that Cherwell District Council will grant a lease of the land in Burdrop adjoining the Piggy Path for a peppercorn rent, it was decided to leave matters until the Sibfords Community Plan is in place and arrangements can be handled by an appropriate committee. Highway Matters:- The road between the Ferris and The Gate Hangs High will be closed for maintenance work from 30th January to 3rd February. Appropriate signs will be in place. Bonds End Lane is in a poor state and the Clerk was instructed to

However, the Chairman felt that the time had come to become actively involved and in this regard the Clerk was instructed to write to Cherwell District Council to arrange a joint meeting with the Head of Planning, the Enforcement Officer and a legal representative. One of the questions at that meeting will be a Parish Council's responsibility where planning rules are seen to be disregarded. Date of Next Meeting This will be on Wednesday, 21st March 2012 in the Staff Room of the Primary School starting at 8pm.

#### The Sibfords Conservation Area

The conservation team of Cherwell District Council, under Dr Rose Todd, conservation officer, are currently working on the review of the Sibford Ferris, Sibford Gower and Burdrop Conservation Areas. Sibford Ferris Conservation Area was first designated in November 1985 and covers the older part of the village. Sibford Gower and Burdrop were similarly designated in January 1988.

The team are undertaking public consultation with the draft Appraisal documents from 20th February to 12th March 2012. As part of the consultation they are holding an exhibition followed by a public meeting to discuss the document in:-

Sibford Village Hall on Tuesday, 21st February 2012 Exhibition: 3pm - 6.30pm Public Meeting 7pm - 8.30pm

This is a rare chance to influence Cherwell Planning Policy, and villagers from the two Sibfords and Burdrop are strongly encouraged by their Parish Councils to attend and offer their views.

Grit Bins in Sibford Gower & Burdrop


In previous years, the filling and refilling of grit bins rested with Oxfordshire County Council. However, starting this year, the initial filling will be carried out by the County Council but the responsibility for refilling has been laid on the shoulders of the Parish Council which has been supplied with grit for refilling the bins as and when required. When, and if, residents find that a particular bin requires topping up they are asked to phone the Parish Clerk (Peter Hardman – Tel: 780391) who will make the appropriate arrangements. In this regard, Sibford Gower Parish Council is very grateful to local resident Alan Berks for undertaking to accommodate the reserve grit and carry out the refilling as and when needed.

Please note that the grit is for highway use only and is not to be used for private properties. The Parish Council has been given to understand that legal action will be taken against anyone found so doing.

#### 1897 and 2012 - Similarities and Differences

Following the celebration of her Golden Jubilee in 1887, ten years later in 1897, Queen Victoria and her proud peoples commemorated her Diamond Jubilee with celebrations throughout this country and the British Empire. This special occasion was seen as a commercial opportunity - business and investment ventures were started with 'Jubilee' status. American people and their markets were targeted.

Britons celebrated with pride the progress, both social and industrial, that had been achieved during Queen Victoria's 60 year reign. A procession was planned from Buckingham Palace to St Paul's Cathedral, where a service of thanksgiving was conducted on the steps of St Paul's. The Queen, still wearing black morning clothes and a bonnet but was unable to climb the many steps so the ceremony was conducted outside to the joy of the thousands who were able to see it. Cheers rang out for the People's Queen from St Paul's to Trafalgar Square right down to the Thames Embankment. All was safely carried out despite the Pageant Master's and the Government's concerns about terrorist attacks!

In the Sibfords, the villagers celebrated with great joy as they have done on many Royal occasions through the years. Funds were raised by public subscription totalling £27.17.4d

In June 2002 Sibfords' villagers celebrated Queen Elizabeth II's Golden Jubilee with 4 days of events which included a Flower Festival in the Church, a Village Street Fayre with Fancy Dress and a Dog Show, a Royal Exhibition, a Supper and Concert in the Manor(Sibford Gower), an outdoor Interdenominational Service, a Village Picnic prior to the Village Sports and inter-village Rounders Match, Helicopter Rides, Open Village Gardens, a Piano Concert, a Torchlight Procession, Fireworks and Beacon Lighting, a Tea Dance, Songs of Praise, and a Bring and Share Supper with Dancing!

The National preparations are little altered from 1897 – there will be a grand procession from Buckingham Palace to St Paul's Cathedral, the Royal family will tour Great Britain and the Commonwealth, tourists will be encouraged, there will be a celebration of 1000 boats on the River Thames where the Queen will attend on the Royal Barge and there will be still be concerns about possible terrorist attacks.


