Nature Notes

Jan 26th This afternoon I saw a red kite flying over Folly.

Jan 28th A mistle thrush sang in short bursts from several different trees near us. It was the first one I have heard this year but hopefully not the last, but they are getting very scarce in this area.

Feb 3rd It must be my lucky day as on the area where I feed apples to

Feb 3rd It must be my lucky day as on the area where I feed apples to the birds I found that they had exposed the glasses that I lost when a branch flicked them off while I was picking apples last year. I also saw a red kite and higher up a buzzard flying over Pitch Hill. Feb 6th A fieldfare died when it flew into my brothers window this morning.

Feb 8th I put out a 3 gallon bucketful of apples this morning as it was still freezing hard but a flock of about 40 fieldfares came down to join the blackbirds and redwings and the apples were all gone in about 2 hours. As people used to eat fieldfares and the one that hit the window was quite plump we thought we would try the breast. We found it very good with a slightly milder flavour than wood pigeon but it would take the breasts of several fieldfares to make a good

meal. The naturalist Gilbert White wrote that when the ground was frozen and fieldfares had to rely on hedge fruit they would get thinner until they were not worth the shot. Feb 10th We don't often see pewits these days but two people from opposite ends of the parish have seen some recently.

Feb 11th A male blackcap came to the bird table today. The female that has been coming regularly during this cold spell now comes on to the window ledge when the bird table is empty of food or too crowded. Feb 16th I have not heard a mistle thrush since the one on Jan 28th but live in hope.



Reading more from my grandfathers diary for 1929 I find that it was an unusual year for weather. On June 25th he writes "There was 8 degrees of frost (-4C) at Farnborough last night and 4 (-2C) degrees of frost at Ross-on-Wye." When he got home having spent 2 weeks in Ireland he writes "There has only been .04 inches (1 mm) of rain while I was away making less than 7 inches for the first half of the year and many towns and villages are falling short of water." That is an inch less than we had in the first half of 2011 and Sibford in 1929 relied totally on springs, wells and rainwater.



TINA FRITH: 1933 - 2012

Tina Frith, who lived for nearly 30 years in Burdrop with her husband Colin, died suddenly but peacefully in her home in Somerset on Saturday 7th January 2012. Her funeral took place on Friday 20th January in a packed church of Thorne St Margaret in Somerset and a stone's throw from Colin & Tina's house. In his address, Tina's son-in-law George Middleton described her early life as the daughter of an acclaimed artist, Patrick Phillips who was away serving in the army for most of her later childhood. A beautiful and talented girl, she herself was also an accomplished artist and later a needle worker, and had a passion for horses. She encountered serious illness in her early teens and equally serious accidents in the hunting field. She was unhappy at school leaving at 16 and she met and married at 18 Colin, who was serving in the Somerset Light Infantry, a regiment in which his family had a distinguished record.

For the next 21 years Tina devoted herself to supporting Colin and suffered the lot of an Army wife, moving house every 9 months - to Malaya, to Gibraltar to Northern Ireland and to many other billets. During all this period Tina was a wise, competent and respected regimental wife, devoting her time and sympathetic, attentive ear to young officer, soldier and army family alike and remained unswervingly loyal to the regimental family throughout her life.

Colin retired from the Army in 1972 becoming Bursar of Magdalen College School for 14 years, having moved to Sibford Gower and Tina instantly threw herself behind Colin in supporting church and village. She was a founding member of the Fielding Day Centre, ran Fetes and Bazaars and took the lead herself in organising Poppy Day. Wherever Colin went she could be found in close and energetic support with friendliness and great good cheer. When in 2000 they moved to Somerset to live in converted stables on the farm of their eldest daughter and family it was a very great loss to Sibford.

As wife, mother, and carer, Tina remained intensely loyal to her husband and children. At the outset, a young mother in a strange country, with her husband fighting in the jungle, she faced the loss of her first child, Michael while pregnant with her second. Picking herself up, she went on to produce Sue, Annie and Mark and then with tolerance and humour to enjoy their children and grandchildren. She was never happier than with her family and with horses or small children, preferably all three together.

Tina's greatest act of devotion was the unquestioning care and support - both physically and emotionally demanding – given to Colin during his failing years until his

Swacliffe Exchange User Group Launch Newsletter Would your household benefit from Superfast Broadband?


If you live in Tadmarton, Swalcliffe, Shutford, Epwell or The Sibfords your


telephone exchange is Swalcliffe.

The Swalcliffe Exchange User Group, supported by Sibford Gower and Sibford Ferris PCs, is gathering information to put together a bid for funds to have our exchange area upgraded to Superfast Broadband. Our current service to many households is probably satisfactory by today's standards but, as the services available on the internet get ever more varied and sophisticated, the bandwidth (broadband speed) required to access those services will increase beyond that available from our exchange. As an example, to stream HDTV (watch high definition TV on the internet) requires a bandwidth of approximately 3.5Mbps. Already the majority of our community cannot access this service because of the limitations of our exchange, many cannot even access SDTV (standard definition TV) as the bandwidth available to their household is less than 1.5Mbps. (See broadband map at thesibfords.org.uk/bbsurvey. Please contribute to the survey by clicking on "Contact Paul" and leaving me a message).

If we do not win funding for the exchange to be upgraded to Superfast broadband we will not be upgraded in any way for the foreseeable future. This means that our access to broadband services will diminish as more users try to access more services from our already out of date and overloaded exchange. Our bid may be made either through a scheme run by Oxon CC, or the Rural Community Broadband Fund (RCBF). In either case we need to begin by establishing the demand in three user categories: homes, businesses and public organisations. Your contribution is essential if we are to win the funding we need. Sibford WI Meeting – 14th February 2012

Seventeen members were welcomed by President Glennis Hardman with a special mention for the return of Miriam Henbrey

following her hip replacement operation and Greta Baadsgaard after her move to Chipping Norton. A colourful postcard sent by Jan Warner on holiday in Australia and New Zealand was enjoyed. A card of congratulations was signed by all for Jan and her husband Clive's forthcoming Golden Wedding.

I have only one positive comment to make about gloomy, cold, miserable February – at least it doesn't last as long as every other month. However the Sibford WI members were more than cheered up by our excellent speaker Malcolm Nelson. His subject was "Forty Years Catching Smugglers" and his humour and professional delivery quickly captured the attention of all. Malcolm spent 40 years of his life as a Customs Officer working both at home and abroad in such places as Port of London, Dover, Gatwick and Heathrow as well as training would-be customs officers in Russia, Malta and throughout countries in the EU. During the course of his talk he gave us facts such as in one year heroin and cocaine to the value of £4.5billion was siezed at Heathrow, that it is thought only 20% of drug smugglers are detected, that purchase of £1 worth of drugs will be funded by £5 worth of criminal damage such as burglary, theft, fraud etc. It was fascinating to hear there is generally a specific reason why a customs officer happens to be standing at the green channel awaiting the next flight arrival. Does he make a random decision to call a traveller to one side and search his baggage? Or is he responding to the information which has been gathered from the studies of the passenger list by the Detection Investigating Teams, or the observation of passen-

gers' activities in the luggage reclaims area or the fact that a passenger has paid for his (or her) very expensive ticket by cash? THIRD TIME LUCKY


It was third time lucky for pupils at Sibford School when they finally managed to beat the elements and plant a new hedgerow on the edge of the school's conservation area.

Their earlier efforts had been thwarted ... firstly by frost, which made the ground too hard, and then by heavy rain, which made the ground too muddy. However the sun shone on the third attempt and, in near perfect conditions, Year 13 Countryside Management students were able to supervise as Year 7 pupils set about bedding in 150 plants. When mature, the 34-metre hedge will act as a buffer zone between the school and a neighbouring farm, helping to prevent the spread of agro chemicals into the conservation area and so encourage biodiversity. Sometimes I sits and thinks and sometimes I just sits.

We have been thinking back to our childhoods in the 1930's and doing a rough count of the village of Sibford Ferris from Little London to Margret Fell House, to the bend in Woodway Road and to the top of Mannings Hill. We reckon there were 48 dwellings with 58 children, 9 dogs, 8 cars and 1 riding horse. Since then there have been 89 more dwellings, plus the development at the Manor and the School houses, Penn, Lister, Margret Fell, Feilding and the junior school.

A village water supply and electricity both came to the village in the 1930's but the sewage scheme was later. We had a good local bus service and a carrier (lorry).

It seems that the children have been replaced with dogs, horses and cars, reflecting the fact that house prices here are mostly beyond the pocket of those with younger families.

Now we'll just sit for a bit.






Sibford Ferris Annual Litterblitz
