Nature Notes

May 22nd. A young grass snake crossed our very dewy fawn early this morning. It was lying in the sun when I first saw it and I thought it might be dead but after a while it went on and was quite ok. The sunshine brought out the first holly blue butterfly that I have seen this year.

June 2nd. I have now seen several holly blues and a few orange tips but very few other butterflies. This wet weather is not encouraging them to show themselves.

June 5th. A young great spotted woodpecker was sitting on the platform above our bird table while the male brought it peanuts from the feeder below.

June 8th. The tits all seem to be hungry. At one time this morning there were great, coal and blue tits as well as the young great spotted woodpecker and his dad, blackbird and dunnock, which would be a crowd for a winters day, let alone midsummer.

June 9th. A female great spotted woodpecker was carrying nuts to a young one in a tree nearby, so it looks as though there may only be one or two young ones in the family.

June 10th. A young great spotted woodpecker has already learned to feed itself from the nut tube and is now coming on its own.



The date of our September meeting has been changed from 20th to 27th in order to avoid clashing with the inauguration service for our new vicar which is scheduled for 20th Sept.



Report of Sibford Gower Annual Parish Meeting held in the Hall of Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School on 25th May 2012

The Meeting was attended by the five Parish Councillors, County & District Cllr George Reynolds, twenty local residents, PCSO Angela Alford and PC Duncan Vale of Thames Valley Police and the Clerk, PCSO Alford and PC Vale answered points raised concerning on-road parking and PCSO Alford said that she is always available to deal with any problems that may arise in this regard. She asked that consideration is given to leave passing space for buses and emergency vehicles. With regard to Highway Matters, it was with regret that no one was available from Oxfordshire Highways. A main concern expressed was that of the very poor condition of some road surfaces with potholes creating potential hazards. In this regard, Hawkes Lane and the road to the Surgery are particularly bad and an email received from a local resident living in that area strongly stressed the point. The Chairman (Dr Oswyn Murray) said that the Parish Council is well aware of the financial constraints under which Oxfordshire Highways operates but close contact is in place to try to resolve pressing matters. In his Report the Chairman spoke of the newly defined Conservation Area, the new rules for non-publicity of planning applications, the Village Pond and the move by the Parish Council to seek ownership, allotments, housing needs survey and affordable housing, priority snow clearance routes, response to Cherwell Strategy Plans, Churchyard and burial matters, Broadband, Bishop's End (formerly Bishop Blaize). the Parish Precept and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. With regard to The Bishop Blaize Appeal Hearing which is to take place in Bodicote House, proba-

bly on 14th & 15th August, there is considerable local interest and many residents have expressed a desire to attend. The Town Estate Charity has kindly offered to provide transport. The Clerk in his report gave details of the Parish Council's current financial position. The accounts for the year ended 31st March 2012 had been submitted to the External Auditor and thanks were extended to Mr David Soden for carrying out the role of Internal Examiner. The Report by The Town Estate Charity was presented by Mrs Jean White and she was thanked by the Chairman for the information

provided. The Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator, Mrs Mollie Mulley gave her Report and she asked that residents take advantage of the 'Have Your Say' meetings when the police visit the village from time to time. The Chairman thanked her for the Report. The Sibford Village Hall Report was delivered by Muriel Chandler (Village Hall Committee Secretary). This included information about groups which use the Hall, fund raising activities and plans in place regarding the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. She concluded by saying that the Village Hall Committee appreciates the help and interest of the Gower and the Ferris Parish Councils. The eleven members of the Committee are all volunteers, some for many years, and work tirelessly so that people can enjoy using the venue. The Chairman expressed his thanks for the Report. Because of prior commitments, neither Mrs Sue Mattinson nor Mr Richard Hartree was available to present The Sibford's Community Plan Report but it was made available in printed form. It is anticipated that The Community Plan will be published in July/August 2012. The Chairman expressed appreciation of the high Village responses to the Questionnaire and to both Sue and Richard

for the work they had willingly undertaken. In the 'Any Other Business' part of the Meeting Mr Fred Inns raised the matter of road markings where Bonds End Lane joins Main Street, Sibford Gower. In times gone, by the right of way was marked as the turning from Main Street into Bonds End Lane indicating that those approaching from the Village Pond area should give way at the junction with Bonds End Lane. This would appear to be a sensible and safe arrangement and the Clerk was instructed to approach Oxfordshire Highways. The Chairman announced the almost imminent departure from the village of Cllr Roger Alder when he moves to a new home. He will be very much missed

by the Parish Council, the Parochial Church Council and all who know him.

There being no further business to discuss, the Chairman thanked all present for attending and declared the Meeting closed at 9.03pm.




AUTHORS VISIT SIBFORD SCHOOL



Diamond Jubilee Reflections

If you spent the 4-day Diamond Jubilee holiday in the UK it was difficult not to be touched by the outpouring of public support for our Queen Elizabeth II as she celebrated the 60 years of her reign. To complement the National celebrations, in line with historical tradition, the Sibfords organised a programme of local events to celebrate Her Majesty's most remarkable dedication and service to the nation throughout the past 60 years.

The Sibfords Jubilee Celebrations provided events in the villages on each day. On Saturday 2nd June the Village Fayre and Dog Show transformed the Village Hall and its grounds into a colourful cornucopia of stalls, games and sideshows. Despite the chilly weather villagers and families had a great time enjoying the many different Jubilee themed attractions. Children could enjoy free rides on the Cup and Saucer roundabout and the Bouncy Castle and Candy Floss were also free during the afternoon. The Karate demonstration by members of the village club was excellent and the Dog Show provided entertainment during the afternoon. Delicious teas, a bar-b-cue and licensed bar catered for everyone and ensured a relaxed afternoon for everyone. The Egg Throwing Contest was keenly contested and many sticky hands were licked by grateful dogs before the winning pair was rewarded with their prize.

Stalls were packed up, straw bales collected, gazebos dismantled and tables packed away – all by 7pm for the start of the Disco and Talent Show in the Village Hall. This was well supported and our young people presented a great range of talent and skills providing brilliant entertainment. Families and adults danced the night away bringing the first day of celebration to a close.

A Service of Thanksgiving was held on Sunday morning in Holy Trinity Church. This Benefice Eucharist jointly celebrated the life of service and dedication of our Queen and the 172nd birthday of the Church in Sibford.

Various gardens in the Gower and Ferris were open during the afternoon. The weather was cold and rain only managed to hold off for part of the afternoon but those who braved the elements were treated to a peep behind gates and hedges to enjoy some garden jewels. A hot cup of tea and homemade cakes were most welcome although we did have to be indoors and the wood-burning stove had been lit! We were, however, not as wet as those on top of the final boat of the Queen's River Pageant who sang their hearts out while being drenched to the skin!

enthusiasm into all the races and some of their parents were also persuaded to take part. Families stayed on for a picnic tea and some continued to play a game of inter-village rounders until late into the evening. With the extra Bank Holiday granted for Tuesday 5th June, The Sibfords' Society organised a 'Walk Around the Village' Quiz. 


