

Nature Notes

Jul 19th There are two spikes of the parasitic knapweed broomrape growing in our wildflower area. One of them is 22 inches tall Jul 20th The sun is shining from a cloudless sky, buddleia coming out, knapweed etc in full bloom on our wildflower area, but there are very few bumble bees and hardly any butterflies on them.

Jul 24th Oilseed rape crops seem to have set full pods of seed even though there were hardly any bees on the flowers because of the terrible weather through the flowering period.

Aug 1st I last saw the few swifts we still have in Sibford Ferris on July 24th so they must have left soon after that which is a remarkably early exit. They would normally be here until late August or early September. I am wondering whether they left because they failed to find enough flies to rear a brood and decided to work their way back to Africa. What a wasted journey for them.

Aug 13th A friend tells me that he has twice seen a hedgehog over the last few days which is great news. He thinks it is 48 years since he last saw one.

Aug 18th It makes me sad to look at our group of buddleias where we used to see so many butterflies and see so few. Hopefully we will got a late hatch of tortoiseshell and peacocks but as I have not seen any of

their caterpillars on the stinging nettles this year that may not happen. On this hot evening we had our west window open and the curtain drawn back to let in the breeze from 6.30 to 10 o'clock with the light on in the room and no moths came in. Had we done that forty years ago the room would have been full of them so it seems that moths are as few as butterflies.

Aug 30th A raven came into a beech tree in our garden and repeated its metallic "tonk tonk" call a few times and then some variations on it before making a few proper raven croaks as it flew away. I first heard on making this call at Folly last year.

Sep 8th A flock of at least 100 swallows were seen today at a farm where they don't nest, so they are probably collecting together before setting off for Africa.

Sep 15th A few migrant silver Y moths have appeared over the last few days. They are a daytime flying moth that flutters round the flowers. If it stops fluttering it shows a white marking roughly like a Y on its wing. Some years quite a lot seem to come over from the continent. Sep 18th An abnormal number of dead bats have been found recently and I wonder whether they could be starving due to lack of moths. Sep 20th I think the number of butterflies in our garden is less than a quarter of what it was 15 years ago. We still get nearly as many different sorts of butterfly but so very few of each. I have no idea why numbers are falling so fast but I suppose as long as there are a few of each there is still the potential for a recovery. The decline in bumble bee numbers is not quite as great and I think is mainly due to the nests being found and dug out by the huge number of badgers in this area. One farmer estimated that about 50 nests are dug out each year on his farm.


The Screening of 'Undercover in Tibet'


