## Nature Notes

Oct 27th This morning there was great activity around our yew tree where blackbirds have been quietly feeding on the berries for a week or two. I found that the excitement was caused by a flock of redwings that were gatecrashing the party.

Oct 29th Unusually, a kestrel was hovering over the wildflower area in our garden this morning so I expect there are some voles there. One year the voles nibbled off most of this area and when I came to clear it in the winter it was more a case of raking up than cutting off.

Nov 1st I am told that swallows were seen regularly in Burdrop until Oct 28th. I suppose it was a late hatch that was trying to build up its strength before starting the long journey to Africa.

Nov 10th Pigeons have already started taking the berries from our holly tree. As there are not many on it this year they will soon be gone.

Nov 20th I heard an encouraging report from Denmark about the ash tree disease saying that 5% of trees show some resistance to the disease which gives me hope that a fully resistant strain might be found to re-plant with. I think this is an appropriate time for DEFRA to ban the import of any of our native trees and grow them in this country from native seed.

Nov 21st Looking round the garden it is a job to see much for the birds to feed on this winter. There are still a

few cotoneaster berries and some hips but the pyracantha and holly berries are nearly all gone, as are the haws. If the ground freezes hard the fieldfares and redwings will no doubt move further south. A few usually stay around the garden feeding with the blackbirds on apples that I put out, but this year I have no apples. I hear that an unusual number of blackbirds that were trying to come here from the continent perished in the sea, some when they were nearly here. I suppose they collapsed from exhaustion and drowned. I have heard that quite a lot of waxwings have successfully made the journey from the far north east of Europe and are spreading inland so we need to keep a lookout for these beautiful birds. I have never seen one but I was told by someone who had seen 27 of them feeding on cotoneaster berries in Scotland that they seem to be quite tame when feeding. Some were seen at Hook Norton a few years ago.

Having had more than one and a half inches (38mm) of rain since yesterday morning Traitors Ford was, this afternoon, as full as I have ever seen it. With the arches not able to take it all there was a fast flowing stream to the north of the bridge and a small one round the south side and it was almost up to 3 feet on the depth gauge.

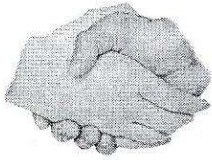

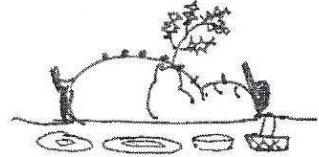


## Friendship Club

### Sibford WI Meeting – Tuesday, 13th November 2012

In her opening remarks President Glennis Hardman welcomed members and guest, Mary West. Apologies were received from Carol Evans-Gill, Ann Benham, Valerie Currie and Secretary Lynda Conway. The record of the October Meeting, read by Mary Hill deputising for Lynda, was agreed and signed. Val Powell's oriental style flower arrangement for the President's table was much admired. Glennis reported on two very enjoyable events. – the Shutford Group Meeting and the Adam Henson Celebrity Evening at Oxford Town Hall. To conclude the first part of this meeting Jane Pace gave a brief but very effective talk outlining an ongoing serious threat to the future of Denman College in which she urged all members to make known their concerns about and disagreement with proposed changes.

Glennis then introduced this month's speaker, Sylvie Nickels, who was to talk about SERVAS, an organisation which makes possible "holidays in homes whilst the occupants are still in residence" i.e. staying with a family for short periods of time whilst travelling overseas. This worldwide voluntary organisation began at the end of the Second World War as a means of getting to know and understand the views, beliefs, hopes and way of life etc. of "ordinary" citizens of other nations. Members exist in almost every country from Algeria to Zimbabwe - in Europe Germany has 1326, France 1365, Italy 1931, Denmark 264, UK 524. SERVAS branches are also in Mexico, America, Australia, India etc. Vetting is a condition of membership and detailed information of participating members such as language spoken, interests etc is required for inclusion in the SERVAS directory. For example, as well as being an author, Sylvie's interests are bird-watching, trees, walking, flowers and fauna, whilst her husband is a mountaineer and walker. Sylvie went on to describe one of the trips she had taken with her husband

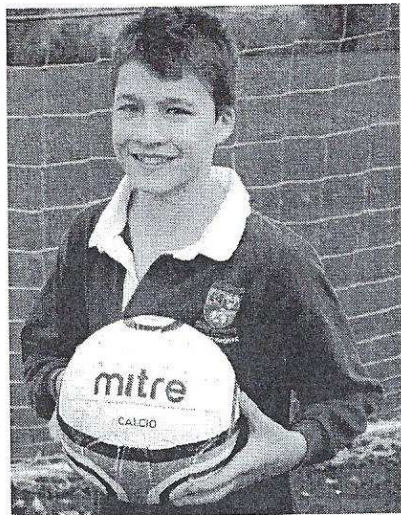

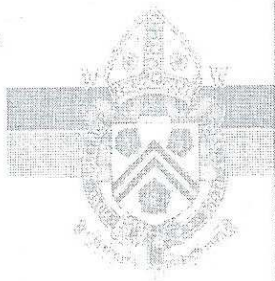

### The visit of the Dalai Lama's Representative to Sibford.

A huge thank you to all of you who came to listen to Mr Thubten Samdup on October 25<sup>th</sup>. He was touched by the great interest in the Tibetan situation shown here in this small part of Oxfordshire.

The grave situation in Tibet was depicted in the film 'Undercover in Tibet', featuring a courageous young Tibetan, Tash Despa, who in 2008, ventured into Tibet, the homeland whence he had escaped ten years previously, to secretly interview Tibetans living in Tibet, at great risk to them and to himself. It was clear to what brutality and hardship these people were being subjected on a daily basis. There followed another DVD, graphically showing the self-immolations, the grief-stricken Dalai Lama, and in contrast the smiling British politicians greeting their Chinese guests.

Mr Samdup's message to the deeply moved audience was that it was not enough to sympathise with the Tibetans – we have to do something to bring about a change, to end the deadlock and the breakdown of negotiations with the Chinese authorities. The more people who take the step of seeking out their MP and impressing on him or her how vital it is to keep the Tibetan topic alive in Parliament, the greater the chance is of persuading the Prime Minister to be more proactive in speaking out for Tibet.

There followed a Q and A session in which members of the audience showed concern for the future, when the Dalai Lama, whom Mr Samdup described as "a wonderful, wonderful man" is no longer with us, a man who has spent his life tirelessly promoting the Tibetan cause, who is the antithesis of a remote Buddhist monk, always seen as accessible and jolly and charismatic, but who, as we saw, cannot bear to see the suffering of his people.

Thank you for your contributions to the Tibetan Society. On the evening we raised with entrance tickets, the raffle, donations and the purchase of Tibetan Merchandise, £296.

Many thanks, too to everyone who helped with the event, and especially to Keith Hicks for his invaluable work in showing the films.

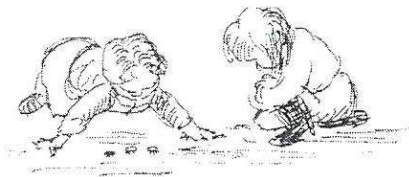

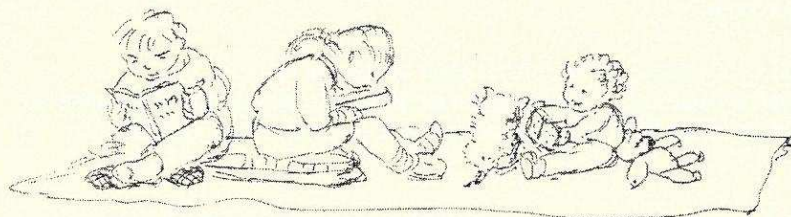
