#### Nature Notes

Jul 18th Last night a badger dug out a bumble bees nest in our wild flower patch.

Jul 19th A bat that was found dead near the church porch has been identified by an expert as a young natterers bat. He tells me that having checked a good many churches with his bat detector that for some reason natterers bats seem to favour churches as their roosting place.

Jul 29th During this spell of hot weather the numbers of butterflies and bumble bees in the garden has increased greatly so perhaps I worry too much about their decline and a few good summers would solve the problem. With the buddleia and wild marjoram coming into bloom we may see even more shortly.

Jul 31st There was a very flat vole on our mown grass path this morning. I wondered whether it was a road kill that had been carried there by a crow or magpie. When I found it there were three wasps that seemed to be fighting for the only blood spot on a very dry carcase.

Aug 5th The number of bumble bees on our wild flower area is still rising on each sunny day. I also saw a small copper and a holly blue to add variety to its butterflies.

Aug 15th I see that a female common blue butterfly has settled down for

the night on our wild flowers.

Aug 28th Overnight a polecat became a road casualty on the Brook Hill. (the Sibford Ferris to Hook Norton road down to the Stour) The person who

threw it off the road said he was having a job to get rid of the smell from his hands. I am told that while a combine harvester was working, two hares came out of the crop but instead of running away they stayed around and eventually quite a young leveret came out only for a buzzard to come down and carry it away. I expect buzzards have learned to watch where combines are working for anything that comes out. Aug 29th At least three wasps nests, two in our garden and one just outside have been dug out by badgers this summer which must have greatly reduced our wasp numbers. Many years ago when Cotswold Close was an orchard my grandfather used to try and find and destroy all the wasps nests near the orchard so that the plum pickers didn't get stung so much. Sep 13th I saw a maggot fly (greenbottle) fly into a spiders web and while it was struggling to free itself a wasp came down and after a struggle, during which I presume it subdued it with a sting, the wasp carried it away.

Sep 14th Looking back over the summer I have seen good numbers of the more common butterflies. More than usual of peacock, tortoiseshell, small white and grey veined white. About the usual number of Large whites, ringlets, gatekeepers and meadow brown but less than usual of brimstone, speckled wood, skippers, small coppers, orange tips, comma, holly blue and common blue. Red admirals and painted ladies which are migrants have not come in any great numbers this year. I have only seen one humming-bird hawk moth and very few lady birds.

Sep 17th In past years I have pruned our weeping ash tree to stop it brushing the lawn but this year the muntjac have kept it trimmed for the

whole summer. It is a pity that it also ate most of the snake head fritillery buds before they bloomed.



Neuroscientist is guest speaker at school prize-giving Sibford School celebrated the success of its GCSE and A Level students with a special awards night held at the Mill Theatre in Banbury. Guest speaker was scientist, writer, broadcaster and member of the

House of Lords, Susan Greenfield.

Susan, who is Professor of Pharmacology at Oxford University, told students: "Each one of you is a unique and special person ... and that uniqueness is down to your brain. There never has been and never will be a brain the same as yours, so don't be frightened to be you."

Sibford enjoyed a 100% pass rate at GCSE with 87.9% of pupils gaining at least 5 A\*-C



grades. The school excelled in triple science with all pupils taking Biology, Chemistry and Physics gaining A\* - C grades. At A level there was wide ranging success with top grades being spread across 13 different subjects. Sibford head Michael Goodwin said: "To have A Level students achieving so highly in so many different areas really does demonstrate the strengths across our whole curriculum." Students have now gone on to their courses and destinations of choice including English Language and Literature at Kings College, London; Biochemistry at University College, London; and Mechanical Engineering at the University of Bristol.

### Closure of Holy Trinity Churchyard, Sibford Gower, Oxon

Notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Secretary of State for Justice, acting on an application by the incumbent and churchwardens, to apply to the Privy Council for an Order requiring the discontinuance of burials in the above churchyard.

Provision would be made for the following exceptions:-

- in any vault or walled grave in the churchyard, burial may be allowed but every coffin in such vault or grave must be separately enclosed by stonework or brick work properly cemented;
- b. in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and
- c. in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Any representations about the proposed closure should be sent to the Coroners and Burials Team, Ministry of Justice, 102 Petty France, London SW1H 9AJ (quoting reference OPR/075/241) within 21 days of this publication.
