Nature Notes

Sep 28th A chiffchaff came to the bird table this morning. The tits did not welcome it but it was very persistent and kept coming back. I could not see what it was eating but I would guess that it was broken bits of sunflower hearts dropped by the bullfinches. Most birds grab a sunflower heart and carry it away to eat but bullfinches usually take one from the feeder and chew it up dropping bits of it on to the table below where they are soon taken by other birds. There are very few birds that will not eat sunflower hearts.

Sep 29th A song thrush hit the window very hard as it was getting dark last night. It was dazed enough to let me pick it up from the lawn and put it on the window ledge away from passing cats. It had gone this morning so hopefully was only stunned and will recover.

Oct 15th There are heavy crops of nuts, acorns and most hedgerow fruit this year. Recently we have seen up to ten pigeons at a time on our lawn picking up the nuts that are dropping from the overhanging beech tree. I remember years ago when dressing pigeons for eating we would sometimes find their crops filled to bursting with beech nuts. I always wondered how they managed to digest them when they are encased in

such a sharp three cornered shell that used to dig under our fingernails when we were opening them to eat. The pigeons gizzard must be a powerful grinding machine. The acorns on

The Sibfords Society's guest speaker on 17th October was Helen Phillips, an expert in textile and woollen crafts, who combined her specialist knowledge of textile weaving with a second area of expertise - her knowledge of the border province of Kashmir, at the

northern- most tip of India. This was underlined by her dictum that she went there to "help people who cannot help themselves", particularly in marketing their superb products in the UK. More important than the trading aspects of her work, however, were her obvious admiration of and closeness to the various families amongst whom she lived and worked.

Far from providing a dry account of the geography and economy, she concentrated on her personal experiences with the various tribes of the area and especially their skills and superb abilities in producing woollen and silk articles of the highest quality.

She began with her search for the real Pashmina, which originated as an item of clothing worn by important men, such as diplomats, to show their seniority. It reached the West via France, in the 18th Century, where no

less a dignitary than Josephine, of Napoleon Bonaparte fame, possessed more than 400 prized Pashmina shawls.

A shawl takes ten days of painstaking stitching from a single artist, who often likes to know who the lucky purchaser of his creativity is.

Helen also referred to the tensions in the area, where the states of India, China, Pakistan and Russia all have a geopolitical interest, not to mention the ever present Mujahedeen.

The 'slum 'project of Chonderge, was an attempt to provide help to an impoverished village in Kashmir by finding a market for small bags, socks and gloves, using the unique abilities of the area to produce woollen goods. The sight of sheep shearing by the Botya tribe on the Tibet border completed the talk. The high quality rustic blankets which were woven close to the source of the Ganges had attracted Helen to the area.

Finally a beautiful selection of Pashminas and other Kashmiri goods was shown and available for purchase, from which 10% of the sales will be sent to the various Himalayan projects which Helen had described. The evening was completed with an authentic Kashmiri meal of dahl, samosas and rice brought by Helen, whose compassion and understanding of people in a remote corner provided us with a memorable and enjoyable evening.

Our next meeting will be held at 8 p.m. on 21st November, when the film '24 Square Miles' will be screened, together with other DVDs of local interest. Doors open 7.30 p.m.

Crash of Wellington Bomber

On Sunday December 7th 1941 at 18.30 hrs, during a freak snowstorm, two RAF officers, pilot officer WTG Gabriel and pilot officer JA Bright of RAF Edgehill (Shennington Aerodrome) were walking on the main Banbury - Shipston road near Pitch Hill. They saw an aircraft fly over them, heading in a southerly direction, at very low altitude, only ten or twelve feet above the ground, with its landing lights on. After passing over these two officers, the aircraft hit the top of a telegraph pole situated at the top of Pitch Hill. It then gained a little height before the starboard wing dropped, the plane spun in and crashed in a field about 500 yards away, owned by Mr James Scruby of Sibford Ferris. This field lies approximately half way between Sibford Elm and Burdrop. On impact, the aircraft burst into flames and broke in half, facing in a north easterly direction, the rear half at right angles to the front. PO Gabriel and PO Bright ran to the scene of the crash and saw a crew member trying to move in the front half of the fuselage, near the wireless operators position. As they drew nearer the starboard petrol tanks exploded, setting the surrounding grass on fire.

After several unsuccessful attempts, P.O.s Gabriel and Bright managed to drag the badly injured and burning crew member clear of the fuselage, just as the port petrol tanks blew up, spraying the whole area with burning fuel.

The two RAF officers were then joined by the local police constable, PC Leslie Simons of Sibford police house. Together they extinguished the burning clothing on the airman and carried him to awaiting men who put him upon a hurdle and carried him to Dr Taylors house in Burdrop. Whilst this was taking place, the ammunition, oxygen bottles etc. were exploding with the intense heat, the plane and surrounding



area blazing fiercely, the sky was lit up and the glow could be seen for many miles around.

At about this time, another crew member was found wandering in the field, concussed and in a state of shock, not knowing what had happened. He too was taken to Dr. Taylor.

As the telephone lines had been broken by the crashing aircraft, a passing motorist was asked to go to Banbury for the ambulance and to inform the police station of the incident. At 19.40 hrs Hook Norton fire brigade arrived and eventually extinguished the burning aircraft.

Later in the evening PC Simons, assisted by three other police officers and the medical officer from RAF Edgehill, flying officer Barr, recovered four bodies from the wreckage, badly burned and un recognisable. They were taken to Mr James Screwby's barn at Sibford Ferris, awaiting the visit of the Coroner, Mr Fortescue, the following afternoon. An RAF guard from Edgehill arrived at the scene at 20.45hrs and remained on duty throughout the night.

On Monday December 8th 1941 official enquires revealed that the crashed aircraft was a Vickers Wellington B1 twin engined bomber, No Z1089, a month old, only flown for 75 hours and carrying a crew of six. The aircraft and crew were all attached to 21 O.T.U. RAF Moreton-in-Marsh and had taken off at 18.00 hrs on December 7th on a cross country operational training flight. It entered low cloud and owing to the very bad weather conditions at the time iced up, went out of control and crashed. The crew mymbers who died in the crash were:

P.O. Kenneth Wilfred Watson Aged 28 Pilot, Sgt. James Hubbard aged 20 Pilot, Sgt. Edwin F T Medder aged 26 W/OP Air Gunner, Sgt. Christopher G Tierney aged 21 W/OP Air Gunner. The injured crew members were Sgt. John Martin aged 23 Air Observer and Sgt. Robert J Newton aged 23 Rear Gunner.

It was noted at the time that the actions of P.O.Gabriel, P.O.Bright and P.C. Leslie Simons were instumental in saving the life of Sgt. John Martin in the face of extreme difficulty and danger caused by the exploding aircraft.

The dead crew members were remembered at our remembrance day service this year and each year since.

At the Meeting held in the Staff Room of Sibford Gower Primary School the following received attention. Matters Arising: 1) Complaints Procedures are to be reviewed by the chairman with the District Council. 2) Liaison with the Ferris Parish Council with regard to joint meetings, when appropriate, will continue. 3) The potential danger with regard to falling tiles from Mawles Farm barn roof is still to be resolved. Chairman's Report: 1) He attended the Local Government Boundary Commission meeting involving the review of electoral wards. The outcome of a Central Government Review is awaited. 2) The result of a second application to the District Council to have the Bishop Blaize registered as a Community Asset is awaited. 3) A meeting of interested residents to discuss the parking and access problems at the junction of Bonds End Lane and Main Street is to be arranged with Oxfordshire County Council and the Police. Churchyard. Following the official closure of the Churchyard in the not too distant future, the maintenance of it will fall upon the Parish Council unless it decides to pass the responsibility to the District Council. Five contractors have been asked to submit quotations for the work involved and when received the Parish Council will make a decision as to the way forward. Village Pond: The application to the Land Registry to have title to the Pond granted to the Parish Council is nearing completion. A comprehensive document with written and photographic evidence demonstrating that the Pond has been very well used by residents over many years will be submitted with the application. The Chairman expressed thanks and appreciation to those involved especially to Glennis Hardman for her research into the history of the pond together with photographic evidence much of it gained from the archives of the Sibford Society and some from local residents.

The date of the next Meeting is Monday, 27th January 2014 in the Staff Room of Sibford Gower Primary School starting at 8pm.

At the recent Neighbourhood Watch Conference members of the Police who spoke emphasised how valuable information from the general public and especially Neighbourhood Watch is in helping police work. If you see anything suspicious phone the police with as much information as you can.

Trading Standards who work closely with the Police told us that doorstep crime in Cherwell is high, 58% of people targeted are aged 81-90years, 59% are female and the average age is 80years. Please be very careful don't become a victim. Always check businesses/individuals independently who you wish to contact for work, do not rely on Yellow Pages or BT Directories, unknown sign written vans with logos and registration numbers. Ask for three estimates. Please keep an eye on elderly and vulnerable neighbours. Fraudsters are very clever finding different ways to target and convince victims they are genuine. Telephone, internet, post and cold calling are used. Never give personal or bank details to any unexpected callers, always check their identity independently. Be aware a Bank representative will never attend your home, the Police or a Bank representative will never collect your bank card or ask for your PIN number.
