Nature Notes

Jan 23rd Another cock bullfinch died today when it crashed into a different window.

Feb 2nd Although two cock bullfinches died as window casualties in January there are still four cock birds amongst the ones coming to feed.

Feb 4th A male blackcap came to the bird table this morning.

Feb 16th A friend rang to say that he could see seven hares playing around in one field. He later rang again to say that as he watched the hares a black headed gull came and settled amongst them. A buzzard then came down and took the gull away after pecking its head off. I wondered whether the buzzard had been harassing the gull and it had settled amongst the hares to try and escape. I have heard that 2 butterflies have been seen out today.

Feb 17th Hopefully this winters second exceptionally wet spell of weather is now over. In the month from Oct 13 to Nov 12 I measured 7.56 inches (192mm) which equals more that 3 months average rainfall. In the second period from Dec 16 to Feb 15 I measured 13.72 inches (348mm) which is equal to half a years average fall. It is no wonder that the rivers are overflowing. The last comparable floods in 2007 were in the summer months

and followed a very dry spring. On that occasion May, June and July together produced 15.88 inches (403mm)

Feb 18 My granddaughter has seen red kites flying over the parish several times recently.

Sibford Village Hall Refurbishment

The Sibford Village Hall was built nearly 60 years ago. Since 1957 the management committee have spent time and effort maintaining the fabric of the building, updating the kitchen, building the small hall and generally ensuring that the building is fit for the various village organisation that use the two halls on a weekly or monthly basis.

With the accelerating cost of heating oil and electricity, the committee commissioned an Energy Audit last year which suggested three areas of improvement: Main Hall Lighting, Main Hall Insulation and Lobby and Main Lavatories. Initial research indicates that the cost of these improvements will be between £15,000 and £25,000 depending on the level of energy saving achieved. The plan is to greatly reduce the running costs of the hall which in turn will help keep the hiring cost to local organisations to a reasonable level. Currently village organisations enjoy a substantial discount on the actual hourly cost of running the hall; the shortfall being made up with income from village hall organised events (annual fayre, films nights etc.)

The committee will be looking for grant funding and donations to meet the bulk of the costs but in the current climate a substantial amount has to be raised as 'pump priming' to obtain any grants at all. To this end the committee plan to run a series of events where *ALL* the proceeds will go into a

Refurbishment Fund. The first two events are An Evening with Wine & Cheese and a Dog Walkers Breakfast (see details elsewhere in the Scene). Our village hall is a great asset and we look to the whole community to enthusiastically support our efforts in this major project. 



Sibford Rocks



The Meeting was well attended by local residents. The present liaison between the Parish Councils of Gower and Ferris was working well; it was agreed that the two Councils should organise a defibrillator to be sited at Sibford Village Hall for the benefit of residents of both Parishes. The Parish Council had failed in a second application to the District Council to have the Bishop Blaize registered as a Community Asset. Remedial work to secure dangerous tiles on Mawles Farm barn roof was in hand. Since the previous meeting, six planning applications had been considered and seven decisions received. The maintenance contract for the Churchyard & Parish Council Burial Ground had been awarded to Thomas Fox Landscaping. Cllr Susan Bannister said that organised walks by the Walking Group are going well and that she informs Oxford-shire County Council of any problems encountered. *Excess Speeding:* Residents in High Meadow and Colony Road had complained about vehicles exceeding the speed limit in Pound Lane; they will liaise with Thames Valley Police to carry out a speeding check with hand held equipment. *Bonds End*

Lane: It had been very difficult to arrange a public meeting with Oxfordshire County Council about the exit to Bonds End Lane. Finally at short notice the Clerk had met with the officer concerned, who confirmed that the question of double parking at the exit was not an OCC matter. OCC was unwilling to change the markings in the road junction because of the poor state of the surface; reinstatement was not in prospect for the foreseeable future. The chairman reported that the owners of the adjacent property have agreed to cease from double parking at the junction in an attempt to alleviate the problem. Subsequently the OCC officer confirmed that the licence to maintain the green area issued in 1994 was valid, and the OCC had no grounds for seeking to revoke it. It was therefore agreed to leave the matter for the present. Residents of Bonds End Lane were urged to prevent delivery and workmen's vans from parking in the area. Parking: A general discussion of parking problems in the village ensued. It was pointed out that the problem was common to every village in the area, and no solution had ever yet been found. The issue had first arisen around 1979, and was being exacerbated by the village development as a commuter village and the practice of owning two or more large cars. But in fact a survey showed that there was no daytime problem in parking around the pond. The problem existed only at night and at weekends, and was therefore caused by the residents themselves. It was pointed out that only 4 houses in the area had no parking space at all available. Various solutions were suggested. Further layby parking along Pound Lane might be considered at great expense. Neighbouring owners of suitable land could be approached to ask if they would sell or lease land for parking. The chairman stated that he was unwilling to summon the police to any particular area, because of the likely impact on other areas of the village; but other villagers could do so if they wished. For the present it was agreed to insist that the Police and the OCC Highway Officer attend the next annual parish meeting. Residents of Bonds End Lane were encouraged to continue their practice of helping each other out with parking space. Landlords with rented property were asked to insert a clause requiring tenants to park on their own land. Owners of those properties in Bonds End Lane that were undergoing building works were reminded of their duty to insist that their builders show proper respect for neighbours. Village Pond: The application to register the Village Pond as a Village Green was in the hands of the District Council's legal department. The Clerk will pursue Oxfordshire Highways about the blocked gullies in Acre Ditch.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO KEEP BEES?

A lot of people keep bees because they produce honey, one of the healthiest and most natural foods and one which has been valued by man since prehistory as a sweetener. Others keep bees because they are interested in the study of bees and of their habits; bees are fascinating creatures and there is always something new to learn about them. With no means of dealing with the varroa mite that is now present in all UK honey bee colonies, a feral honey bee nest is unlikely to remain viable for more than a couple of seasons. With the help of beekeepers it is only managed colonies that can survive to carry out the essential pollination our food crops. Beekeeping is an enjoyable open air hobby bringing you in contact with people from all walks of life. Bees can be kept by almost everyone except a very small minority who are allergic to bee stings. We can all, however, play our part in supporting the honeybee and other pollinating insects by planting bulbs, shrubs and trees in our gardens - especially varieties that flower early in the year.

Once again we have reached the time of year when we see the new lambs in the fields and the cattle get turned out onto the new spring grass. As ever this means that we have protective ewes looking after their lambs and skittish cattle in the fields that the local footpaths cross. It becomes very important that dogs are on leads and under close control to avoid disturbing the livestock more than you have to.

It would be lovely to have a year without any reports of problems with dogs in livestock. The Countryside Code tells us it's always good practice (and a legal requirement on 'Open Access' land) to keep your dog on a lead around farm animals and horses, for your own safety and for the welfare of the animals. However, if cattle or horses chase you and your dog, it is safer to let your dog off the lead - don't risk getting hurt trying to protect it. Your dog will be much safer if you let it run away from a farm animal in these circumstances and so will you.

Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections, so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly - 'bag it and bin it'. Make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people.
