Nature Notes

Feb 26th A ring necked cock pheasant comes to crow on our lawn most mornings.

Feb 27th My granddaughter who is in North Wales tells me that the puddles now have lots of frog spawn in them. I am reminded that frogs are supposed to come back to spawn in the pond where they were born so perhaps the frogs there are mostly born in puddles.

Feb 28th It has been a very wet start to 2014 with 12.1 inches (307mm) of rain in the first two months. Over the three winter months (Dec, Jan, Feb) I have measured 16.01 inches (407mm) making it the wettest and mildest winter I can remember.

Mar 3rd A female blackcap was feeding on food put out on top of a wheely bin and despite threats from bullfinches and a chaffinch, went on until it had had enough. Later, when it went to the bird table a robin attacked it pulling out a beakful of feathers.

Mar 4th I thought I heard a short burst of song from a blackcap this morning which is much earlier than they usually sing. Several times over the last few days a goldcrest has come to feed on the window ledge.

Mar 7th The goldcrest now comes to the window ledge several times a day. It likes the crumbs of a bun that my wife makes for the birds. A blackcap has sung several times to-

day. On this sunny afternoon I have seen brimstone butterflies and a bumble bee.

Mar 12th Long tailed tits were collecting nesting material in the next door garden but I don't know where they are building.

Mar 13th The rooks are really busy nest building. They are breaking twigs off the trees near the rookery and often carry them on a circuit round the trees to gain enough height to drop onto the nest from above. Sadly after all their effort they drop many of them before getting them in place hence the carpet of twigs on the footpath. A larch twig that was dropped near our door was 4 feet long with 8 cones on it. The rook that dropped it had already flown some way with it and was probably exhausted.

Mar 19th The blackcap seems to have stopped singing and has probably moved on. The ones that winter here are thought to return north to nest and presumably sing, while more come from the south to nest here. It will be interesting to see whether the female that feeds here every day waits here for a mate to come or whether she also goes. My daughter saw a red kite fly over her and not very high up.

Mar 20th My grand daughter rang to say that she is worried that a chaffinch that keeps attacking it's own reflection in one of her windows will give itself a headache!


