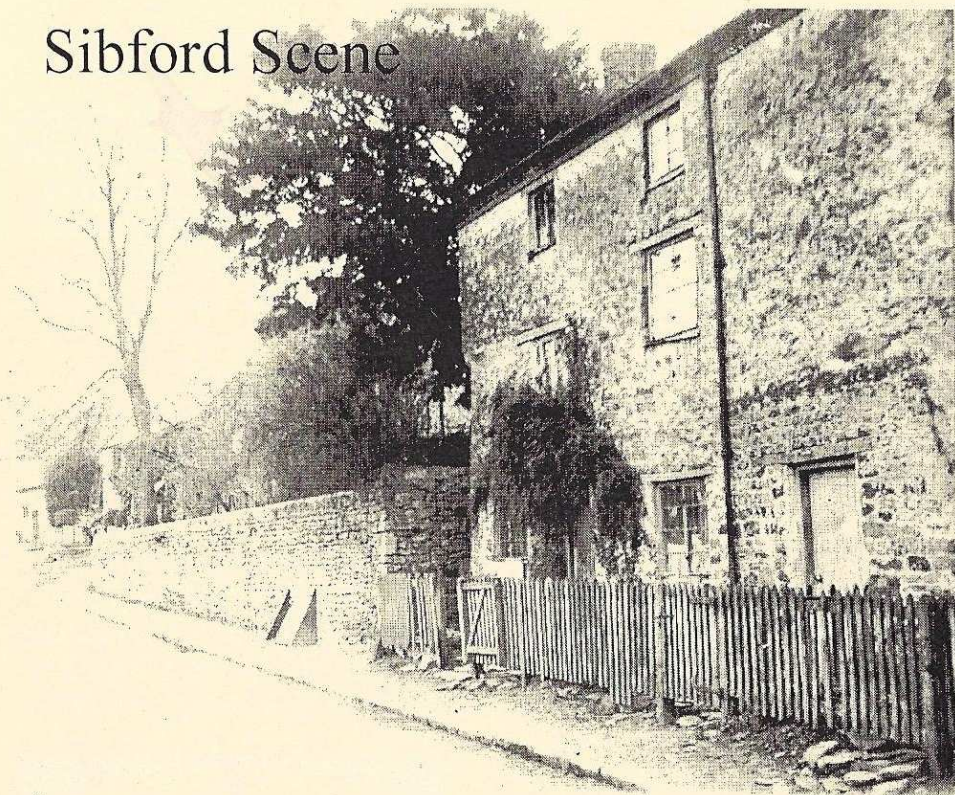

Nature Notes

Mar 25th A female blackcap was coming to feed every day but we have not seen it for the last three days, so I expect it has moved north and that we now have to wait for our breeding birds to come in from the south.

Mar 26th My granddaughter told me yesterday that fieldfares were collecting in the trees near Swalcliffe Common, as I have seen them do in past years. This afternoon I saw a flock of 200 or more gaining height as they flew north over Grange Lane so I expect they were the same ones setting off on the journey to their Scandinavian nesting sites.

Mar 29th There was a dispute between ravens and rooks in our cedar tree this morning, as there was in the spring of last year. The ravens may fancy nesting there but the rooks are not going to tolerate them nesting that close to the rookery.

Mar 30th Having been without blackcaps feeding or singing for about ten days one has started singing today. I am told that a chiffchaff has been singing for a while in the valley between the villages. It's notes are now out of my hearing range and I wonder whether the same applies to the willow warblers, which I also used to hear in the valley, or whether they are not coming any more.

Apr 1st A mistle thrush has been singing its loud but rather monotonous song almost continuously over the last few days.

Apr 10th The tiny goldcrest, which is the smallest british bird, still comes to feed on our window ledge.

Apr 16th The last three sunny days have probably brought most of the butterflies out of hibernation. I have seen quite a lot of tortoiseshells, peacocks, brimstones and one comma and today I have seen several orange-tips which are the first to hatch in the spring.

Apr 17th We have more tadpoles in our garden pond than we have had for the last few years. I have not yet seen any newts in the pond this year so that may help as I think they usually take a few of them. In past years I have seen blackbirds in the shallow water and wondered whether they were looking for tadpoles rather than a bath.

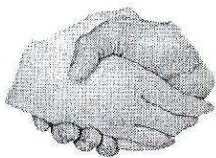

On Thursday, 17th April, Christine Gadsby, who has been a Blenheim Palace guide for many years, came to speak to us about 'The Ladies of Blenheim'. Christine first came to the Cotswolds from Vienna in 1974. In 2004 she accompanied the Duke of Marlborough, who

is now 88, on a memorable trip to Blenheim for the tercentenary of the Battle of Blenheim, when John, the first Duke, successfully defeated the French.

Christine's talk, illustrated with lovely portraits of the various Dukes and their families, included a character study of Sarah, the first Duchess, and her turbulent relationship with Queen Anne, an analysis of the Churchill connection to the family, the contribution the fourth Duke made to the enhancement of the Palace, and the unhappy marriage of Consuelo, daughter of the Vanderbilts to Charles, 'Sonny', the ninth Duke. She was followed by Gladys, who had an extraordinary life and spent her final years in the palace with 30 Blenheim spaniels for company, before the Duke could persuade them all to leave. We also learned about the first Lady Diana Spencer, who was divorced from her first husband, outlived her second and became a fine artist.

Christine managed to combine historical facts with her personal knowledge of the palace and her take on the goings-on there, which made her talk very special indeed.


Sibford Gower & Burdrop Annual Spring Clean

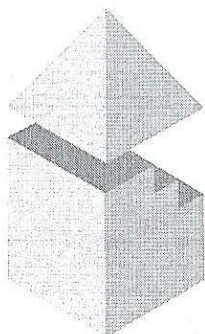

Holocaust survivor Zigi Shipper visits Sibford

Pupils at Sibford School received a lesson in tolerance and understanding when they were visited by Holocaust survivor, Zigi Shipper.

The 84-year-old told students from Years 6 through to 13: "We want young people to know what happened because of racism, prejudice and, of course, hatred. People say to me 'how do I remember?' But the question should be, 'how can I forget?' I can't forget when most members of my family and some many millions of other people were slaughtered, all for no reason at all."

Zigi, who was incarcerated in a number of camps including Auschwitz-Birkenau, described how starvation totally de-humanised the inhabitants. "Pain goes away," he said. "But hunger never does. If you're starving you do things you cannot imagine. I was getting up in the morning and stepping over dead bodies and it didn't mean a thing. I was completely de-humanised."

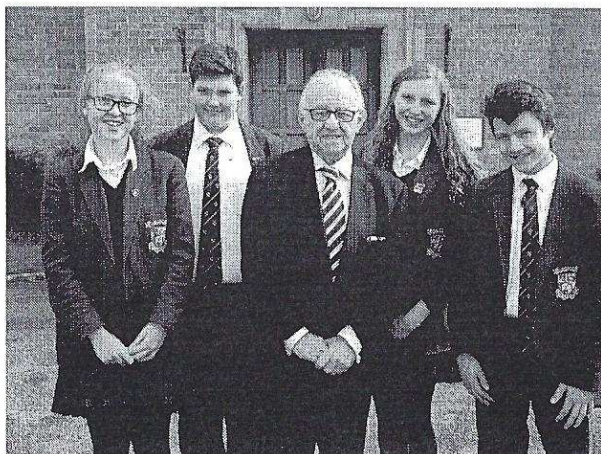
And he told students that the number of deaths was far more than many imagine. "I'm always asked about those who were gassed," he said. "But many more people were dying every day, so many people, killed by rifles and shooting and of course starvation and disease."

"Even after the war ended, people were dying. The British Army brought in tins of meat, tins of fruit, bars of chocolate and biscuits but it was the worst thing they could do. We had been starving for months. People were dying from overeating."

Asked why he didn't feel 'incredibly angry' about what he had experienced he said: "I love life. I was lucky. Sure I have regrets, I regret that I wasn't able to hug my grandmother before she died. But why hate? If you hate you have no life."

"Why do we hate, just because someone looks different? We're all the same. We are all human beings. Things still happen today that shouldn't happen. It's why 99% of the talks I do are to young people ... because you can make a difference."

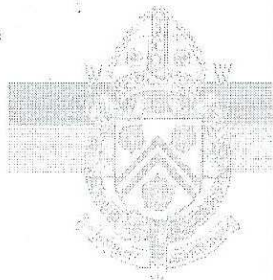
Rain or Shine Theatre Company return to Sibford

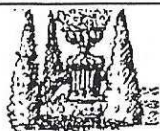
The project was to build a children's day nursery which doubles up as an education centre for women to learn small animal husbandry and vegetable growing. At present the women have to earn money by working at the local stone quarry breaking stones seven days a week for which they earn just £1.00 per day.

There was a presentation from the founder of the charity, Emerging Leaders in the village hall on March 5th, where many people kindly donated their services and products for a lively auction. Others brought dresses for the frock exchange, and many simply came and gave generously.

The village school in particular decided to become involved with the nursery project and generously supported this project as the charity for this year's Art Exhibition, and very recently there was a kind donation raised at the Austerity Lunch in the village.

All this has resulted in almost reaching our target, we raised £2,966. I am delighted to tell everyone who contributed that the nursery has been built within one month, and was opened on April 11th by the charity leaders Trevor and Jane. 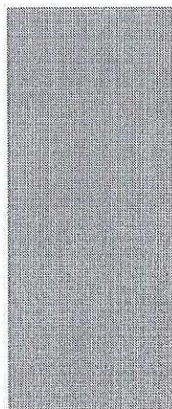
