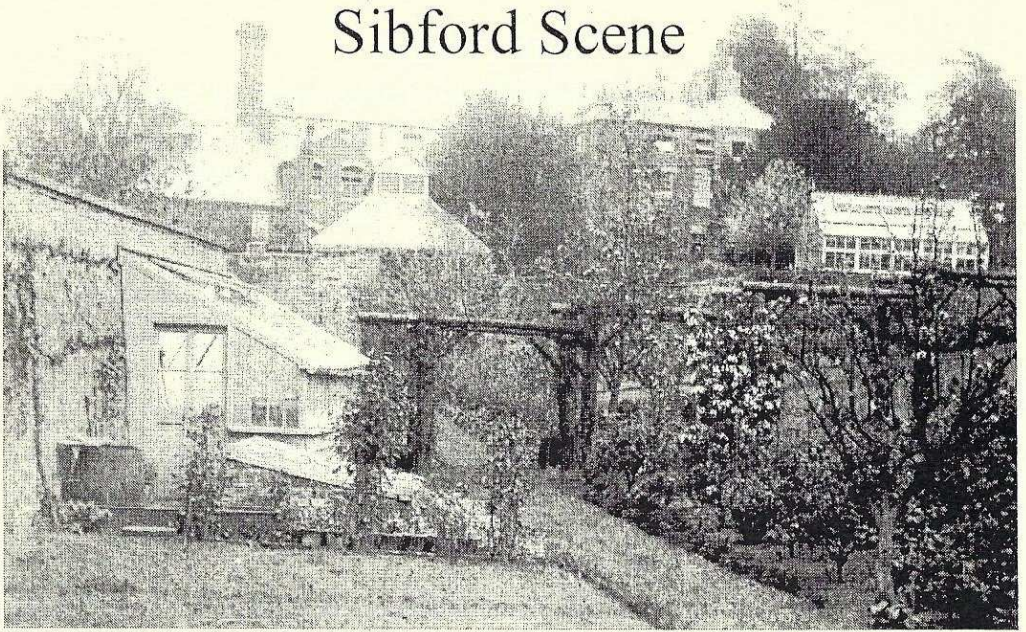

July 27th A young great spotted woodpecker crashed into our window. It looked as if it might be dead but when I picked it up it gripped my fingers with its sharp claws. As it was gasping with its beak open I gave it some water on a teaspoon which it took readily and soon recovered and flew away.

July 28th This morning thunderstorms in eastern England caused local flooding where big hailstones blocked the storm drains. TV pictures showed areas of ice floating on the flood water.

July 29th We are now getting quite a lot of honey bees on our wild flower area. We had been seeing a few bumblebees and hover flies but hardly any honey bees. A bee keeper said that they had been flying to some field of borage at Swalcliffe so I expect that must be over now.

Aug 20th Although nuthatches are still making some cheerful sounds this is the month when song birds give their vocal chords a well earned rest and the calls of the wood pigeon, collared dove and stock dove are more noticeable. The wren and the robin will not rest for long but I always think that the robins autumn song has a tinge of sadness about it.

REPORT ON SIBFORD FERRIS ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD 9 JULY

The meeting was attended by the full parish council and clerk, Cllr George Reynolds, Michael Goodwin (Head, Sibford School), Muriel Chandler (Sibford Village Hall), Richard Hartree (Community Plan) and seven members of the public.

The Chair welcomed all present and gave her report for 2013/14 covering topics including the further development of the MUGA site in collaboration with Sibford School; progress on issues raised in the Community Plan; highways; litter clearing and recycling provision; the play area at Cotswold Close; the agreement with Sibford Gower on maintenance of the graveyard at the Holy Trinity Church; the proposed affordable housing site on the Hook Norton Road; the parish council election in May. The Chair then thanked all those involved in providing their services to the parish council and to the community.

The Responsible Financial Officer gave the Financial Report to 31 March and stated that payments in the year were lower than budget due to anticipated costs not occurring within the period, a reduction in insurance costs and a lower wage bill as the RFO role was undertaken by a councillor rather than the clerk.

A short report on Wheathills provided by the Clerk of the Town Estates Charity was read out by the Chair, advising that broken down vehicles had been removed from the field and that it was hoped to have the roadside hedge laid in the traditional manner.

Muriel Chandler then read out the Annual Report for Sibford Village Hall giving a resumé of activities and events over the year and the committee's plans for the future, particularly with regard to energy saving and improvements to the car park and toilets. The funds for these projects would be raised through grants, donations and fund-raising events. A donation box had been created and would be available at events.

The Head of Sibford School, Michael Goodwin, then gave a detailed report on the contribution the School makes to various aspects of village life as well as to the wider community. These included the swimming pool, sports facilities, the MUGA joint projects, Fielding Day Centre lunches, the annual Festival of Theatre, physics workshops, author visits, school theatre productions, the holiday play scheme, community classes, mini-buses available to local uniformed organisations, employment, and support of Sibford stores and post office. Mr Goodwin told the meeting that the School was very happy to participate in the community in all these ways; however, there had been some disappointing incidents that had detracted from this, which had been: damage to playing fields from vehicles; complaints of bad language and littering by young people using the football pitches without permission; a number of thefts. Mr Goodwin advised that young adults (16 or over) were not permitted to be present on school grounds without a visitor's badge or use school facilities without booking, including during school holidays.

Richard Hartree gave a brief summary of the Review of the Community Plan he and Sue Mattinson had carried out during the year. Most of the parish council's actions had been

Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust Ride and Stride.

It was good to see 2 groups of cyclists and one of walkers setting off from our Church and Meeting House to support this event. It was a lovely day and enjoyed by all. The 5 scouts who took part managed to visit 22 churches cycling about 30 miles - which is probably further than any of them had cycled in a day before - raising a very welcome sum for the cause. The parents who supported the effort by cycling with us all rose to the challenge and we will be all out again next year.

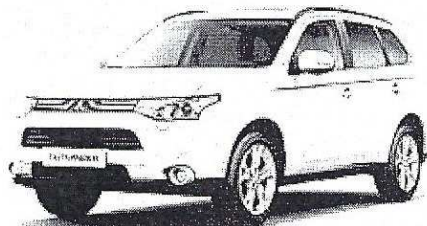

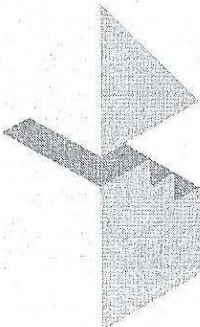

Two days in Sibford.

Sibford Village Hall was transformed into a centre for the celebration of Tibetan culture on Sunday 14th and Monday 15th September. Eight monks from the Tashi Lhunpo Monastery, together with Jane Rasch, the tireless organiser of their tours in the UK and further afield, provided to a packed hall a spectacular performance of their sacred chants and dances, preceded by a workshop during which participants learned some of the dance steps and hand gestures, and were invited to blow the long horns, which make a deafening trumpeting sound.

There were workshops, too, for the children from Sibford's two schools, where they learned a few words of the Tibetan language, and how to print prayer flags and make mandalas and special 'necklaces' which were blessed. The children were completely engrossed by it all.

The monks also, astoundingly, managed to create in less than a full day, a beautiful sand mandala, which was broken up during the 'destruction ceremony', and the central grains, representing the deities, were taken to the River Sib and disposed of in the water, so that their blessings could be spread as widely as possible. I would like to thank not only the monks and Jane for coming to our village, but also all the people who helped to make the event possible, by accommodating the monks in their homes and working so hard during the two days.

Generous funds were raised for the Tashi Lhunpo Monastery and the Tibet Society.

The Sibfords Society

On Thursday, 18th September, Mark Davies gave a talk on 'Artists in Wonderland' ; Oxford, Alice and the Pre-Raphaelites.

He described what were in essence chance meetings between the young artists and Thomas and Martha Combe , the couple who nurtured the Pre-Raphaelite movement in Oxford. Tho-

mas Combe, superintendent of the Oxford University Press , together with his wife , gave the artists support and encouragement and even accommodated them in their house near Port Meadow. William Holman Hunt spent the most time with the Combes, and later Martha was able to donate many of his paintings, together with some of the works of the others, John Millais, Dante Gabriel Rossetti, William Morris and Edward Burn Jones , to the Ashmolean Museum.

Mark's talk was very informative and interspersed with unusual anecdotes, for example, Millais, for his painting of 'The Woodman's Daughter,' requested that her parents send a pair of her boots so that he could reproduce them to perfection. He paid for new boots for the little girl, Esther.

There was also the story of the disastrously bad mural Rossetti and Morris painted for the Oxford Union. It was supposed to depict Tristram and Isolde; unfortunately Rossetti's Isolde was extremely ugly. The painting has not survived; probably a good thing.

Another little girl who featured strongly in the talk was Alice Liddell, who persuaded Charles Dodgson, Lewis Carroll, on the afternoon of 4th July 1862 to write Alice's Adventures Underground. Again a chance meeting changed the course of

history: Charles Dodgson was preaching his first sermon at the Church of St Paul in Jericho when he met Combe, who was the churchwarden. Combe influenced Carroll to seek another illustrator for his book and the famous illustrations of Sir John Tenniel were the result.

The talk, which was illustrated with maps of Oxford at that time, paintings by the young artists and photos of them taken by Lewis Carroll, was stimulating and most original.

The next meeting of the Sibfords Society will be on 16th October. Emily Medcraft will be coming to talk to us about Compton Verney. Doors open at 7.45 p.m. and the talk begins at 8.00p.m.

Exam Success

August saw celebrations at Sibford School when exam results were published. Head Michael Goodwin said he was delighted with the A Level results ... despite the fact that, in line with national trend, statistics showed a decline in the % of entries A* to A.

"Anyone who knows anything about Sibford School will be well aware that we believe that the statistics tell very little about the true picture," said Michael. "Behind the figures lie tales of fabulous achievement and I think our students should be very proud of their results".

"Of the 23 students sitting their exams more than half were, or had been, on a support programme and of those, eight have gained at least one B grade or above and two have gained an A or A*. This is the true achievement and shows the real value of the support they have been given."

At GCSE nearly a third of pupils got a raft of results that included at least five grades at A* or A, and 33% of pupils achieved at least one A*.

Science subjects once again scored highly with 100% of students taking Chemistry and Physics achieving A* - C grades. Similar results were also achieved in Art, Drama, History and RE while all candidates taking French GCSE obtained an A* or an A. Overall 82.5% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at A* - C.
