## DID YOU KNOW?

### Leslie Baily - Sibford School Scholar, Broadcaster, Historian and Villager



Born in St Albans, Hertfordshire in 1906 Leslie Baily started his long association with Sibford when, in 1918, he arrived as a pupil at Sibford School travelling from his home on the Isle of Man where he lived with his family. His father was working for Quaker Friends at the internment camp on the Island and the journey to Sibford School took him two full days. Whilst at Sibford School he was a contemporary of Godfrey Basely who created the long running radio series, *The Archers*.

Leaving Sibford in 1921 Leslie Baily completed his senior education at Cheltenham Grammar School. He started work in Bristol Docks in the wholesale market where, after selling bananas at too low a price, he was sacked by an irate merchant and decided that he was not cut out for a career in commerce. He earned the rest of his living by his pen.

He started his journalistic career joining the Yorkshire Evening News as a Junior Reporter where he became motoring correspondent, special correspondent (which took him all over the North of England) and wireless correspondent. During this time, he married his wife, Margaret Jasper and then promptly resigned his job to become freelance. He successfully extended his writing and joined the BBC in 1924 and was responsible for a succession of features, plays, adaptations and revues, first in the Leeds and Manchester studios of the BBC, and then in London.

He went on to produce a series of Scrapbooks which began as a BBC North Regional broadcast which was first broadcast in 1932. He later described it as "merely a selection of rather unusual items of music, drama and curious information, presented in a rapid panorama. There was no theme or period." After the fourth Scrapbook, in March 1933, the programme was given wider coverage and broadcast on the national network of the BBC.

From 1936, Leslie Baily and his co-producer Charles Brewer, broadcast *Star-Gazing*, which alternated with the *Scrapbooks*; in each of these programmes, a popular stage or screen star reminisced about his or her career.

### TORCHLIGHT PROCESSION

#### Simple Torch Design

Follow these simple instructions to make a torch for the Torch Light Procession.

#### Materials

A piece of wood (broom handle or 25mm sq) about 900mm long.

A empty tin can (400g size)

A small piece of towelling or other absorbent material

#### Construction

Screw the tin can through the bottom onto the end of the piece of wood. Push the towelling or other material into the tin can (not too tightly) until it is about half full. Soak the material lightly in paraffin (**NOT PETROL**), just sufficient to dampen the towelling so that none runs out of the screw hole down the wood. Wait until the start of the procession before lighting.





## In Your Garden - May

I am writing this in the middle of April, but today I had a lovely tingle of excitement, when I noticed little yellow buds about to open on an early rose Canary Bird. Reassurance that Spring is here! But the frosts may not be over yet, so:-

1. Be wary of planting out your dahlias too soon but do them towards the middle of May. Then you can remove the insulation from wrapped up pots, and pull down the bubblewrap in the greenhouse.
2. Climbers are shooting up, so spend a morning with scissors and string, and tie up all the new shoots on roses and clematis.
3. Now is an excellent time to take cuttings. Try penstemons, salvias, pelargoniums, anemones and fuschias, to increase your stock, or give away to friends, or to Sue Bannister to sell for the Horti Society.
4. If you need some colour in a sunny spot later in the year, planting Nerines will give you a thrill. The pink ones, Nerine Bowdenii is the most robust, and although it looks very exotic it will survive the winter cold settled in against a south wall. Lasts well in a vase too.
5. We need to get everything staked and supported now, before it flops all over the place, particularly tall delphiniums, and anything with large flowerheads, as they can get blown about in the wind, and snap off.
6. When you see it is time for Chelsea Flower Show, you know it is time for the Chelsea Chop. Late bloomers, i.e. Asters, can be cut back by almost half to prolong the flowering period.
7. Time to pot up the summer pots, tubs and hanging baskets. Use any good compost you have, or some multi-purpose compost with a little slow release fertiliser added. I recommend a trip to Phillip at Quarry Nurseries to buy his reliably good plants. He opens again on Sunday 29th April.
8. Wait until the end of May to plant Peas and beans, but you could ask Him to put up the bean poles, and supports for the peas.

9. Aubretia is looking lovely now, gracefully decorating garden walls. It prefers to grow out of little crevices in a warm wall. When it is over, cut it back fairly hard to stop it getting bare and leggy. An old gardener told me that the best way to plant it was to mix some seed in a handful of muck, and chuck it against the wall as hard as you can. It will stick, and I hope it will thrive. (Better check your neighbour isn't on the other side of the wall first.)

10. And don't forget the lawns; time to lower the blades, and cut it shorter and regularly, and please do the edges. And watch out for red lily beetles and pests on the gooseberry and redcurrants. Enough! Most important is to enjoy the warmth, sit and relax, and look at that glorious garden you are so busy making.

## HORTI SOCIETY

Our April speaker was Dr Richard Turner whose passion for propagation was evident. A self-taught enthusiast with a penchant for the garden design layout described in the 1970's Reader's Digest Gardening Year, his preference for exotic plants has led to his Oxford garden being rammed with such delights as *Beschorneria yuccoides* which he rates far above the rapier-sharp leaved yucca, numerous different varieties of fig, (although his most prolifically fruiting is still the Brown Turkey), and *Brugmansia*, which he advised to dig up in autumn and put in a bag, dry, and store for the winter and replant in spring. Dear gardening friends a note of caution. Oxford is a few degrees warmer than The Sibfords, we know all about frost pockets up here, so best to take cuttings of *Brugmansia* and dig up gingers, rather than leave them in the ground and cover them with leaves as he suggested.

# SIBFORD HISTORICAL SOCIETY

On Thursday, May 19<sup>th</sup> Margaret Leyland, whose ancestor Oliver Hooper was Headmaster of the Sibford Gower Endowed School from 1912 to 1932, will be coming to give us a talk on how she came to inherit log books, exercise books, legal documents, diaries and photographs from this time, and how she came to the decision to donate them to us, "to return them to where they belong". Margaret's talk will be followed by transcriptions from the log books and Oliver's son's notebooks, read by some of the committee members. There are many familiar names in these readings. There will be a display of photos and various other items.

This meeting has been a long time in the planning, as our first encounter with Margaret was then interrupted by the pandemic, and we are very happy that it is finally taking place. We hope that everyone who is interested in the village, in the school, and in family histories, will be joining us.

The talk, 'Memories of Sibford Primary School from 100 years ago' will begin at 7.30.pm Doors open 7.15 pm. Cost for visitors: £3, including refreshments.

## NATURE NOTES

The sunny spell in late March brought out a lot of butterflies. The ones I saw were the species that had overwintered as adults including Brimstone, Red Admiral, Comma, Peacock and Small Tortoiseshell. At the time of writing this I have not yet seen either Orange-tips or Holly Blues both of which should be emerging soon.

Early one morning, just as it was getting light, a Heron was seen flying low over the village. It was probably looking for a garden pond with frogs or goldfish for its breakfast.

A pair of Buzzards seem to have taken up residence in the corner of the Sibford school playing fields near the solar panels and may well be nesting there judging by their behaviour.

Megan Gilkes told me of a Rook's nest that had blown down in the lane by the village shop. We were both surprised that the nest which looks so messy when viewed from below was in fact so well constructed and lined with small birch twigs along with an inner layer of moss and horse hair.

For anyone interested in moths there is now an excellent website available that covers Oxfordshire, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire.
