

## NATURE NOTES

Both Colin Lamb and Sue Etherington-Smith have commented that the Bee Orchid has reappeared in the same place as last year. Hopefully it might spread. A Common Spotted Orchid has also been seen in the same area.

Our small garden pond has had several species of Dragonfly and Damselfly breeding in it. It is also home to Smooth Newts which are breeding successfully and is occasionally visited by a Grass Snake. Many of the garden birds use it for both drinking and bathing.

Red Kites are becoming an increasingly common site in the skies above Sibford. It is amazing that a bird that was nearly extinct is doing so well.

Having been trapping and recording moths in the garden since 2015 it is becoming quite unusual to add new species to the garden list. However, I recently caught a Light Brocade for the first time followed by 7 more. I understand they are having an exceptionally good year. (The Charge of the Light Brocade!??)

# DID YOU KNOW?

The July photograph in the Village Calendar was taken by Petra Berry and features the attractive wild flowers at the field margin adjacent to the stone wall that separates the lower garden of the first house in Walford Road and the Sib Valley. The homes in Walford Road were part of the extensive development when Sibford School sold the whole Sibford Manor Site to Swan Hill Development company in 2001. Extensive piling work was undertaken to stabilise the site and the Manor was converted into apartments and new houses were



built providing a total of 22 new homes. The steeply sloping land below the new houses has been divided into paddocks which have to remain uncultivated to retain the conserved Sib Valley but the wild flowers provide a welcome and natural rural aspect.

Leslie Baily wrote about the history of the Sibford Ferris Manor:-

'The Knights Templars acquired the whole of the Ferris manorial estate in the 12<sup>th</sup> century. They farmed it for 200 years, their first manor house was probably of part-timber construction, and the chances are that before the Norman invasion there was a Saxon moot hall on or about this site. Once established on the most satisfactory site, the largest and most important house in the village – the manor house where the agricultural community was administered and where the manorial court was held – was likely to stay more or less on the same site, pulled down and rebuilt in stone during successive centuries. The building was well sited for springs, its surrounding reddish-brown soil was highly productive, and the house lies just below the adjoining hilltops, giving shelter in wintertime. There is evidence of a fish-pond a hundred yards away, along the side of the stream in the valley immediately below the Manor house.'

Squire Thomas Walford purchased the Manor in 1657. The house remained in the Walford family until 1800. During the 18<sup>th</sup> century they had become wealthy farmers and landowners and had the building restyled in the Queen Ann fashion, which was very much in vogue with the aristocracy. The front and sides were clad in local cut stone much as we see it today. Ownership then passed through several hands until Thomas Harris sold it in 1842 to the Society of Friends for 'the purposes of having a school'. It had barns and a farmyard to the rear of the house. The buildings were altered and extended to accommodate school life until the building of a new school on the Hill Site afforded additional facilities in the 1930's. The redundant Manor site was sold for development in 2001.

# In Your Garden - July

1. The most important things to do are dead heading, weeding and watering, along with enjoying delicious meals in the shade, and being able to pick some of your own delicious fruit and veg. By the way, did you know that Shakespeare called cooking apples "costards", and cooking pears "wardens". ?

2. Check climbing roses and clematis. They are scrambling maddly up the walls this summer – much better than last year, and need the new growth tying in sideways, not straight up. Wisteria is waving out long tendrils. Off with them too.

3. Heavy rainstorms can batter tall plants down. Try and make sure your delphiniums, phlox, etc are well staked before this happens.

4. Pick your courgettes whilst they are still small and young. When they start to grow like adolescent marrows they become squashy and tasteless – remind me of those awful school dinners.

5. Any new shrubs or trees you have planted this spring will need regular and generous watering.

6. Ponds probably need attention. Scoop out the algae and blanket weed, and any leaves that have blown into them. My pond has become very low with lack of rain, but the water lilies still look lovely.

7. Did you rewild your lawn this year? If you have a dried up lawn that has been mown you can give it a summer feeding, but only if the rain comes pouring down and the grass is green again. Keep trimming the edges.

8. Your phildelphus will have finished flowering now, so it must be trimmed back, moderately hard. Cut off the flowering branches – now – not later, or you will not have so many flowers next year.

9. .Bugs! Greenfly, whitefly, lily beetles, slugs under the hostas – under the flowerpots, eating the dahlias – keep spraying and fighting them all. 10. I keep a little old radio in my greenhouse, and I swear that the plants enjoy music as much as I do. King Charles 3rd said that his plants enjoy music too, and so apparently do cows! Funny old world, isn,t it. Enjoy your garden.
