Re: Surgery Lane, Burdrop – Carriageway Resurfacing

I am writing to inform you that Oxfordshire County Council will be undertaking carriageway maintenance and resurfacing works along Surgery Lane in Burdrop between the junction with Hawks Lane North and Hawks Lane West.

The works are programmed to start on **Monday 19th August 2024** and are expected to last for a single overnight shift, subject to any bad weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances arising during construction.

Works will include vegetation works, ironwork adjustments and the resurfacing of the existing carriageway, following which all existing and legal road markings and lines will be reinstated.

Traffic Management

In order to keep disruption to traffic and the doctors surgery to a minimum, the works will be carried out under as single overnight full road closure from 2000-0600hrs. Surgery Lane will be fully reopened outside of these hours and a fully signed local diversion route will be put in place for the scheme duration.

Access for residents of Burdrop will only be possible from either Sibford Gower via Acre Ditch or from Sibford Ferris via the southern end of Hawks Lane.

A No Waiting enforcement comes into operation whilst works are undertaken along Surgery Lane. It would be appreciated if all vehicles could avoid parking on the carriageway for the duration of the works, as this will impede plant movements and could delay the works.

Gatemen / Traffic Marshals will be positioned at either end of the closure as well as being stationed near the Birch Hill cul-de-sac. They will direct traffic and pedestrians to ensure the safety of the public and workforce during working hours. We ask that you give them your full support and heed their advice whether you are a pedestrian, cyclist, or motorist.

We will endeavour to maintain vehicular access to those properties affected by the works. However, there may be occasions when this is not possible once the new surfacing is laid, as it takes time to cool down and cure, and we apologise for any inconvenience this may cause. Surfacing operations are moving operations so the highest levels of noise will only be experienced by individual frontages for short periods. The nosiest operation, the planing will be completed by 2300hrs, although some construction noise will still be evident during the latter stages of the resurfacing operations.

Keeping You Informed

Several methods of communication are being used to keep you informed of these works:

- Signs are being placed on site to forewarn road users in advance of the works.
